





The Most Sacred Heart of Jesus Friday, June 28, 2019

Whether statues or stained glass, the image of the Sacred Heart of Jesus can be found in churches all over the world. Jesus looks down, one hand extended out and another pointing to a heart wreathed in thorns and glowing with light. In the Sacred Heart, we see both the sorrow and the joy of the life of Christ, who became one of

us out of love. "Jesus knew and loved us each and all during his life, his agony, and his Passion and gave himself up for each one of us. He has loved us all with a human heart" (CCC 478). In the Incarnation, God becomes man. Jesus experienced the fullness of humanity, including its sufferings. June 28th is the Feast of the Sacred Heart. We remember all that Jesus endured for us. We also remember why he endured it -- out of love.

JUNE 23, 2019 **CORPUS CHRISTI**

"... He said the blessing over them, broke them, and gave them to the disciples to give to the crowd." Luke 9:11b - 17

"I received from the Lord what I handed on to you." These words of St. Paul remind us that we do not grow up in a vacuum. We reflect the example of those we love and respect. We cannot begin to understand who we are as Catholic Christians unless we understand and identify with our story. For the apostles the story of our Christian faith focused on the last several days of Jesus' life. His Passion, Death and Resurrection left such a profound impact on their lives that it formed the basis of our Christian story. Later they would celebrate this story in a ritualized form that became our present day Mass.

Paul in writing to the Corinthians criticizes their CELEBRATION of their sacred STORY. The Corinthians would gather for the Eucharist and the wealthy people would bring their own food and wine and get drunk and boisterous while neglecting the poor. Paul reminds them by in effect saying, Remember your story, and so make sense of your rituals. Your celebration of this story will lead you further into the Christians experience.

"I received from the Lord what I handed on to you." St. Paul instructs the Corinthian community of who and what they are as a people of faith. As we gather today we reflect 2000 vears of Sacred Tradition handed down to us. As we gather to celebrate at this Mass we reflect the work of the Holy Spirit in keeping alive who and what we are about as a people of faith.


When we gather together as a family of faith the Mass helps shape us as Catholics by teaching us about our faith and preparing us to go into the world to proclaim the Good News of Jesus Christ.

The Liturgy of the Word gives us the story of who we are and where we have come from as a People of God. Scripture gives us our history, our values, and norms. In the Liturgy of the Eucharist, we experience in a meal-like setting the core of our faith. We receive from the One Bread and One Cup the One Body and Blood of Christ.

Today only about 50% of adult Catholics, especially younger Catholics, do not view the Eucharist as the Body and Blood of Jesus. They see the Eucharist as a symbol. Today we gather for this celebration cognizant of the fact that what unites us as a family of faith is our belief that Jesus comes to us in the Eucharist. We hear the story of our history in the words of Scripture. We eat together from the one Bread and One Cup. As we go from here we recognize our mission to proclaim Christ presence in our lives.

All of us baptized into the faith must witness that faith by the example of our lives. In the same way those who have accepted the responsibility of parenthood must pass on their faith to their children by the example of their lives.

When I was a child, I can remember stopping by my parish or another local Catholic church to just spend some time in prayer before the Holy Eucharist. We didn't have exposition and adoration much in those days, but we were keenly aware of the presence of Jesus in the tabernacle. I would sometimes stare at the lighted candle near it and know that Jesus was alive.

I had never heard someone speak about a stewardship way of life back then. If I am honest, the primary message I heard in those days was along the lines of "We need to be as good as we are able." Sacrifice was only at Lent, disciples were people in the Bible, and generosity mostly had to do with the collection basket and the poor box at the church entrance. I even went to Catholic schools!

Maybe the message of stewardship was there somewhere packaged differently, and I just missed it. It wasn't until I was an adult, and after acquiring two theology degrees, that I understood both with my head and my heart what a stewardship way of life really meant. But I look back at those days, and I realize that the groundwork was laid for me to understand these things. It was those times before the Holy Eucharist that I began to understand true sacrifice. It was at



those times that I began to understand how actions and realities that seem so simple to the human eye can be so profound. And it was at those times that I began to see true love knows no bounds.
