



The leprosy left him immediately, and he was made clean.

Mark 1:42

We all need time to get away, a place to restore inner strength and resolve. Even the archetypal hero, Superman found inner peace in his Fortress of Solitude. When I was in the seminary, my professors told us to make sure we kept our day off. Over the years I found that getting away from the parish helped me become a better priest. On a more cynical note, one pastor once told me that my day off from the parish is the parish's day off from me.

For Jesus, He found going off alone to a deserted place afforded Him the opportunity to pray and discern how God was calling Him. The Church has placed into its liturgical year the season of Lent which provides us the opportunity to put aside our focus on the things of this world and focus on the things of God.


Using the role model of Jesus, He began His public ministry by spending 40 days in the desert. Remember, Jesus was fully human. So like any human He needed to nurture His relationship with God. He needed to learn how God was calling Him to use His gifts and talents for the greater glory of God. Time alone in prayer would remain a constant habit.

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent. For many Catholics they will receive ashes but in a short time are back to their normal routine. A number of Catholics fail to observe Ash Wednesday as a day of fasting and abstaining from meat.

For the next few days we will enjoy the carnival season of Mardi Gras, but when we enter into Lent, we can make it a time of renewal of faith. Not by fasting on the required days of Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, not by abstaining from meat on the required days of Fridays, but incorporating those penitential acts into other days of Lent. Using them as a springboard for prayer and discerning God's call for us.

As the psalmist reminds us in the Responsorial Psalm, "I turn to you Lord in time of trouble and you fill me with the joy of salvation." In order to find that solace in time of trouble and that joy in drawing closer to God, we need to make the effort. Lent affords us that opportunity.


The Unfailing Goodness of God

I have always wondered why Jesus told the cleansed leper not to publicize how he had been healed by the Son of God. It's not that I can't understand why Jesus would want to keep the matter quiet — after all, he knew that as soon as people heard, he would be mobbed with requests for healings, and his movements restricted.

What gets me is the fact that Jesus simply must have realized the leper would not listen to him. Why give someone a command you know they will ignore? It's a complicated question, and when I reflect on it, I can't help but connect it to another equally complicated question: why does God, all-good and all-knowing, allow bad things to happen?

Yes, God is all-good and all-knowing. So when He gives us free will, He knows what we will do with it. However, He is also all-powerful. He can and will bring good from any situation, any tragedy, or even any instance where someone ignores Him.

Was it a sin for this leper to do other than what Jesus had said? That's a heavy question for a Sunday morning! But it's plain to see that, even though this man ignored Jesus' command, God



still used his actions. How many were brought to Christ because of the news spread by this leper!

As someone trying to live out a stewardship way of life, what is God requesting of you right now?
