


Special Collection - April 25th Archdiocesan Priest Retirement Collection

Welcome Fr. Cyril!

Ascension of Our Lord would like to welcome Fr. Cyril who will be succeeding Fr. Walter as our pastor following his retirement in July. Fr. Cyril comes to us from St. Maria Goretti parish in New Orleans where he is

currently serving as the Parochial Vicar.

Fr. Cyril Buyeera was born in 1968 in Uganda, the fourth child in to a family of ten, seven boys and three girls. His father was a teacher and his mother a nurse. After completing his primary and secondary education, he was admitted to Katigondo National Major Seminary where he obtained a Bachelor of Arts degree in Philosophy from Makerere University, Uganda. He then joined Ggaba National Major Seminary where he pursued his theological studies obtaining a Bachelor of Arts in Theology from Makerere University. Upon completing his Seminary formation, he was ordained a priest for the Archdiocese of Tororo on August 28, 1999.

He served as a Parochial Vicar in two parishes from 1999 to 2001. He then served as Pastor of St. Stephen Church, Kamuge Olinga (2001-2005) and Mater Dei Church, Tunyi (2005-2012). From 2001 to 2012 he also served as a diocesan Director of Pontifical Mission Societies.

In 2012 the Archbishop of Tororo loaned Fr. Cyril to the Archdiocese of New Orleans. Since 2012, he has served as Parochial Vicar at St. Maria Goretti Church in New Orleans East, where he has served as its administrator. While at St. Maria Goretti, he enrolled and completed a Master of Arts degree in Moral Theology at Notre Dame Seminary Graduate School of Theology.



"Thus it is written that the Christ would suffer and rise from the dead on the third day and that repentance, for the forgiveness of sins, would be preached in his name."

Lk 24:46-47

There once lived a great king whose generosity was known and felt by one and all. Everyone in the kingdom had experienced his kindness first hand.

Now the king would invite all his subjects to a great banquet. Many of the people saw this as an opportunity to thank him.

The entire community would be invited since all recognized their need to show their gratitude. Unfortunately when the day of the banquet arrived many would fail to show up. Some gave good reasons such as an illness or they would be away. Others lied to hide the fact that they were too lazy to come.

Many guests arrived in their finest clothes befitting the respect in which they held the king. Others came as they were.

Once inside the banquet hall, troubadours recounted story after story of the great king's history of charity and kindness. No one failed to see that the great king's charity and kindness extended to each one personally.

The people gathered around the banquet table where a magnificent feast lay waiting. As they ate many people in their own words each gave thanks to the king for the times he helped them in their hour of need. Others became engrossed in their own thoughts or caught up in eating the feast to remember their own debt to him.

As the meal progressed a few people arrived late, they would hurriedly find an empty seat and quickly gobble down the food before them. Once finished they quickly got up to leave for home.

As for the king, he knew the people loved him. Those who did not come to the banquet saddened him. He was disappointed in the manners of others. He was embarrassed that a few chose to come late, eat and then leave without even an acknowledgment. Yet he loved them all.

For those who remained, they soon left for their homes with a sense of joy and satisfaction. While they could give back little in return for what the king did for them, their presence became a reflection of their love for him. The same love he had for them.


How to Fail Your Way to Heaven

You know what are some of my favorite moments in Scripture? The little "Easter eggs" of Jesus' humanity, things like Jesus falling asleep, Jesus drawing in the sand, Jesus playing with kids. And how about Jesus rising from the dead, appearing to his disciples and saying, "So, have you got anything to eat?"

It's right for us to always keep in mind that Jesus is God. But we also have to remember that he was man. He got hungry. He cried when he felt sad and laughed when he felt happy. He got tired. He got bored.

Because he was God, none of those feelings ever led him into sin, like they do us. He never spent a car ride trying to pass the hours by seeing how annoyed he could make his older sister. He never smacked Peter over the head for saying something really stupid. But he did unleash some Biblically righteous anger on those traders in the temple, didn't he? And he wasn't shy about calling Peter "a Satan" when his friend tempted him to take the easy way out.

It's the tightrope walk we all try to balance every day, honoring our human emotions while still answering God's



call to be better. Being perfect isn't the domain of the Christian — that's the domain of Christ only. Trying and failing, then trying again (and failing again) and again and again? That's the domain of the Christian.
