The Brown Scapular

I'm a big fan of the Brown Scapular. It is an old Carmelite tradition that found new life in the early 20th Century with the Fatima Apparitions. Recently, it has become popular again as Catholics look for some intimate sign to remind them of their commitment to the Faith.

On July 16, 1251, in the town of Aylesford in England, Our Lady appeared to a Carmelite priest named, St. Simon Stock. She handed him a brown woolen scapular and said, "This shall be a privilege for you and all Carmelites, that anyone dying in this garment shall not suffer eternal fire."

Later, the Church extended this privilege to all who wish to be invested and perpetually wear it as a sign of membership in the Confraternity of the Brown Scapular.

The tradition expanded to include the *Sabbatine Privilege*, in which there is a pious legend of the Blessed Virgin of Mount Carmel promising to shorten one's stay in purgatory if one should pass from this world still owing some debt of punishment. It is said she will retrieve one's soul from purgatory on the Saturday after death.

The promise is not mere legend but based on certain conditions that must be fulfilled which, if devoutly observed, will assist one in religious and spiritual perfection:

- 1. One must be invested in the Brown Scapular by a priest according to the Roman Ritual and wear it continuously. (Once a priest invests one with the Brown Scapular, it is not necessary to have replacement scapulars blessed.)
- 2. Observe chastity according to one's state in life (married/single).
- 3. Pray or perform good works: namely, daily recitation of the Little Office of the Blessed Virgin or the Liturgy of the Hours.
 - or abstain from meat on Wednesdays and Saturdays.
 - or daily pray five decades of the Rosary.
 - or with permission of a priest, substitute some other good work.

(usually three Our Fathers, Hail Marys and Glory Be.)

Brown Scapulars are made of wool and are worn over the head with one side hanging down in the front and the other in the back.

True devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary consists in three things: VENERATION, CONFIDENCE and LOVE. By simply wearing the Brown Scapular, we can tell her every moment of the day that we venerate her, love her, and trust in her protection.

As is my custom, I will invest anyone who wishes to wear the Brown Scapular after Sunday Masses the weekend closest to the Feast of Our Lady of Mount Carmel (this year it is next Sunday, July 14.) I will provide the Brown Scapulars. If you would like to be invested, meet me by the statue of the Blessed Virgin!

RECLAIMING MY CATHOLIC FAITH

Who should receive Holy Communion?

In 1905, Pope St. Pius X issued a decree regarding frequent Communion. This decree was issued because many bishops and priests, at the time, were hesitant to encourage the lay faithful to receive Holy Communion frequently feeling their way of life made them unworthy. In fact, for hundreds of years, there was a tendency for laity to avoid the reception of Holy Communion because of the rigorous fasting and prayer necessary to worthily receive the Sacrament. Some Catholics only received Communion once in their entire life and usually right before death. The Fourth Lateran Council in 1215 required all Catholics to confess their sins and receive Holy Communion at least once a year.

Pope Pius X's decree encouraging frequent Communion is summarized by these four stipulations:

- 1. All Catholics can receive Communion frequently provided they are in a "state of grace" meaning free of mortal sin and with the firm intention of never committing a mortal sin in the future.
- 2. Catholics should desire Communion with the devout intention and not out of routine, spiritual pride, or desire for human respect. Devout intention is an expression of our love for Christ and a desire for spiritual nourishment.
- 3. Catholics with devout intention should receive frequently because "union with Christ is strengthened, the spiritual life more abundantly sustained, the soul more richly endowed with virtues, and the pledge of everlasting happiness more securely bestowed on the recipient."
- 4. Catholics should receive Communion after careful preparation (confession and prayer) and make an appropriate thanksgiving after reception, according to one's strength, circumstances and duties.

Despite all the encouragement, the Church lays down

legitimate and important reasons why some Catholics should refrain from receiving Holy Communion despite ongoing responsibility of attending Holy Mass.

No Catholic should receive Holy Communion if he or she:

- is in a state of mortal sin,
- has not fasted one hour before receiving Holy Communion, (including gum, but medicine and water does not break the fast)
- if one has not prepared themselves interiorly by arriving on-time and participating prayerfully at Mass.

Non-Catholics should not receive Holy Communion in Catholic Churches.

There are some conditions that permit Eastern Orthodox and other members of Ancient Christian denominations to receive Holy Communion, but they are very limited, the so called "reformed Christians" aka Protestants are not permitted to receive Holy Communion.

Catholics never receive so-called communion in a protestant church service.

Since Protestants generally believe communion is a symbol and they lack Apostolic Succession or valid Holy Orders, Catholics never consume their bread and wine (or juice.)

Frequency of reception:

Normally, one receives Communion once per day. However, Pope St. John Paul II permitted those who attend a second Mass like a wedding or funeral may receive Communion again. While this permission exists, it does not obligate one to receive a second time. Priests who offer more than one Mass in a day must receive at each Mass since their reception is necessary for the validity of that Mass.

Questions for reflection:

Am I in a state of grace when I receive Holy Communion? Do I carefully prepare to receive Holy Communion? Do I take time after Mass to make a thanksgiving for the gift of Holy Communion?


