FROM THE PASTOR

Feast of the Presentation of the Lord (& St. Blase Day)

The feast of the Presentation of the Lord on Monday, February 2, is also the traditional day for the annual blessing of candles to be used in devotions. If you have candles you would like to have blessed, you are welcome to bring them with you to Monday Mass at either 8:00 a.m. or 12:00 noon and place them on or near the designated table. SEAS Parish still has a supply of devotional candles you can buy (for \$2 per box, near the literature rack); if you buy any of these you may have them blessed on February 2.

The next day, Tuesday, February 3, is the memorial of St. Blase and the traditional day for the blessing, "May God deliver you from diseases of the throat...." Priests will provide the blessing at the 8:00 a.m. Mass and at special opportunities at 11:30 a.m. and 6:30 p.m. in the church.

♣ Antonio & Amabilia Filicchi changed the world. They cared for Willy & Betty Seton while Willy was dying—as pictured in the relief at the left of our sanctuary. They prayed for Willy alongside Betty, and taught her the Rosary. They knew the Catholic faith well enough to explain it to Betty when she asked questions. After Willy died, Betty became Catholic. She founded the Sisters of Charity. Her order established schools across the country, inspiring both the public and parochial school systems in the U.S. Betty is revered worldwide as the holy Mother Seton, the first canonized saint native to the U.S.—all this because Tony & Mabel Filicchi responded to their vocation as a married couple to extend hospitality to the needy, to learn and teach the faith, and to pray.



▼ The Capital Campaign matching offer concluded last month. Thanks to your generosity, we raised an additional \$67,000 for the parish capital campaign, which pays down the debt we owe on our new church and facility. Our donors will match your gifts with at least an additional \$67,000, for a total of \$134,000. Last week, I was able to send a check for over \$100,000, bringing our debt down to less than \$2,300,000.

On Sun., Jan. 25, Bishop David Zubik announced the results of Our Campaign for The Church Alive! More than 44,000 donors representing about 130,000 Catholics across the Diocese of Pittsburgh have pledged gifts totaling \$230,309,054. The target was \$125,000,000. To date, \$62,667,752 has been

received, including \$55,000 here at SEAS Parish. Thanks to all who are sacrificing for the work of the Church!

A CELEBRATION OF LIFE!

Over 100 children and their parents came together on January 22, 2015, to show their support and pray together for the Gift of Life! While thousands marched the streets of Washington, D.C., we raised our voices from right here in Carnegie. Our sidewalks were lined with "Respect Life" signs that were lit by luminaries at dusk to guide all into the church. The Luminous Mysteries of the Rosary were led by members of the Knights of Columbus. Each decade was preceded with a small talk, accompanied by a film clip, song, or picture.

- •We prayed for life from conception to natural death.
- •We prayed for those who believe life is just a "choice" and not a gift from God.
- •We prayed for married couples.
- •We prayed for pregnant women and for those who have had or are contemplating abortion.
- •We prayed for those who are dying and for their caregivers and/or family.

It was lovely to hear all of those young voices lifted in prayer. After the rosary, the littlest of our guests were invited to St. Luke Hall while our Jr. High students remained in church for one more talk —this talk was geared specifically towards teens.

St. Luke Hall was converted into an indoor carnival! We celebrated our beautiful children with popcorn, snow cones, funnel cakes, games and prizes. There was our own March for Life bus on the wall where the students could play musical chairs. They played "Mass Confusion" where teams raced to chronologically order cards with the parts of the Mass written on them. Students could also race to match the popsicle sticks (with the Seven Sacraments written on them) to the popsicle (with the definition of each Sacrament). They played "Wrong Pong Plunge" trying to avoid dunking into the cups marked with various sins. They tossed bean bags hoping to spell the word "GOD." And even picked a snowman's brains to see if he was thinking about Jesus. Every child won at least one prize! Most won several!

There was a parent table with Pro-Life bumper stickers, pamphlets, and petitions to sign for our Government leaders. Pro-life tee shirts and most of our prizes were donated for the evenings event. If you look on the Fourth Street side of the building, you will see a Pro-Life banner that was signed by many who attended.

Our Eighth Grade students were our carnival workers (supervised by our catechists). They were so wonderful with our little ones, and with their peers! Many thanks to them!

Thanks to all who participated, worked, set-up, cleaned-up, and donated! And a million thanks to our Knights of Columbus for sponsoring the entire event so that the cost to our families was ZERO and the fun was 100%!


WORKSHOP
