

FROM THE PASTOR

LIVE WITH JESUS: FASTING, PRAYER, ALMSGIVING

Jesus was sometimes criticized for not being too strict about fasting. But Jesus did indeed fast, and made many other less obvious sacrifices of his time and comfort. Want to think more about what Jesus is doing with us? Our Lenten renewal program, *Live Jesus: Live with Jesus, Live for Jesus, Live like Jesus* continues each week of Lent, from today through March 23. Join us Sundays 10:35 to 11:20, or Mondays either at 1:00 or 7:00 p.m.

We all know the Lenten basics: Catholics ages 18-59 must fast at the beginning of Lent, Ash Wednesday, and the beginning of Easter, Good Friday and Holy Saturday, as far as possible up to the Easter Vigil. Catholics over 14 years must abstain from meat on Fridays in Lent, and again on Good Friday and Holy Saturday as far as possible up to the Easter Vigil. These basic disciplines are meant to redirect us in following Jesus through self-denial, devotion, and charity. If you haven't already committed yourself to Lenten sacrifices, consider these:

- Give up your favorite food, or condiments/salt/sugar/ketchup/milk, or ice.
- Set yourself a strict bedtime. Take only cool or cold showers. Don't use mirrors.
- Use your least favorite household chairs. Away from home, take the least popular seats and parking places.
- Give up television, either for all of Lent or for certain days. Don't use the car radio.
- Set aside time for spiritual or educational reading.
- Use the internet only for specific purposes; don't surf.
- Set smaller budget limits for groceries or other expenses.
- Don't talk about yourself. Take care to ask questions about others.
- Consult your spouse and other family members. Call or visit someone you've neglected.

My thanks to Ron Astfalk and the dozen or so volunteers who helped stuff and mail nearly 20,000 envelopes last week!

My thanks also to those of you who participated in the diocesan *Church Alive!* campaign. We now have a building permit, and \$40,000 of the parish's 40% share of your gifts will go toward building our maintenance facility. The remainder of what we have received thus far—another \$16,000—will go toward paying down our mortgage.







LENT AT ST. ELIZABETH ANN SETON

The season of Lent begins Ash Wednesday, February 18. The season begins and ends with days of *fasting. (Others are encouraged to make alternative personal sacrifices for those days.) Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent are also days of **abstinence from eating meat. The fasting and abstinence set the rhythm for the community. Called to continuing conversion, to a deeper spiritual life, and to prepare for Easter, all Christians are encouraged to undertake works of:

- prayer, i.e, special devotions such as Stations of the Cross, a Bible study, a daily rosary, etc.;
- **self-denial**, i.e., to "give something up for Lent," usually some lawful pleasure such as a kind or quantity of food, drink, entertainment, or any other satisfaction;
- **charity**, i.e., a habit of special kindness extended to others, especially to those in need, often in the form of contributions to charities or to the poor.
