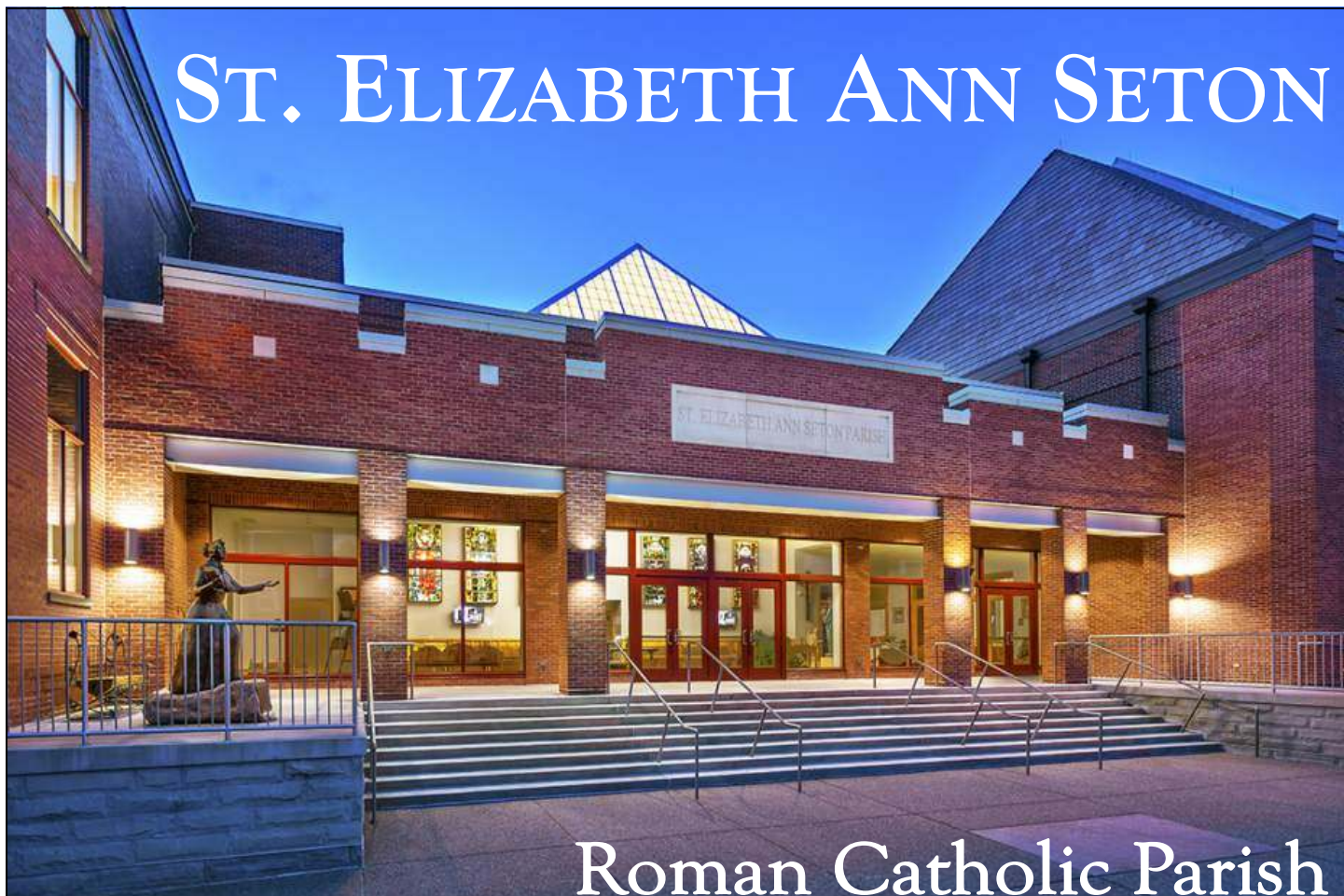

## EASTER FAITH

There's a compelling picture frequently passed around the internet—a dog, racing with joy, with the caption, “Live like someone left the gate open.”

Next week is the solemnity of Pentecost—the end of the Easter season and the commemoration of the outpouring of the Holy Spirit on the Church. The gate is open!

As we began the Easter season, I asked you to consider how you came to faith, why you believe what Jesus has said and promised. And then I asked you to consider how your answer represents an invitation from God—an invitation to help others to come to faith in the same manner.



- Have you come to faith because you've studied, thought about it, and judged it to be true? Great! Then learn it well enough to teach it. Read the Bible, study the Catechism, learn how to speak of these things to others, and start talking!
- Have you come to faith because of others' heroism? Many Christians are persecuted even now; others in earlier decades suffered for their faith. A few of you are old enough to recall martyrdoms of Christians at the hands of Nazis or Communists. Do their wonderful endurance and faithfulness inspire you? Great! Then give a similar example to others: Maintain your good cheer even in the face of suffering. Set aside your complaints and protests, and be a source of friendship, joy, and encouragement for others.
- Have you come to faith because of the loving compassion shown you by another Christian? Perhaps a loving mother or grandfather nourished your soul? Or maybe it was a public example like Mother Theresa of Calcutta who has moved you. Either way, great! Now pass it on to others: Commit yourself to works of charity, hospitality, and compassion. Tend to the needy and the suffering.

These three modes of faith correspond rather neatly to Bishop Zubik's recent exhortation, “Learn Jesus, love Jesus, live Jesus!” So, do it! Do not be a spiritual dead end—someone who receives the faith from others, but proves incapable of passing it on to others. Live like the gate is open!

Many thanks to our wonderful catechists who spent numerous hours preparing lessons based on the Catechetical Guidelines from the Diocese of Pittsburgh. These remarkable men and women also spent their precious free time checking papers, creating quizzes and tests, and organizing/decorating the classrooms. They dealt with children with the sniffles, and children with the sudden onset of a stomach bug. They kept track of assignments, chapters due, and got to know each parent at dismissal. They worked here after long days at their "real" jobs —most times missing dinner. They left meetings early, missed family events, and ignored their own physical limitations just to teach our children. They frequently used their own money to buy snacks, gifts, and supplies.

Being a Catechist is not easy. You are required to take classes, attend meetings, and complete student assessments. You have to deal with many social and intellectual differences in the classroom. You have to reach out to students who do not know how to make the Sign of the Cross, while challenging those who can quote Scripture.

Not one of our catechists expect a pat on the back. They offer their talents, their creativity, their patience, and their time as a gift to God.

As this school year comes to a close, I ask that you take a moment this week and just say a prayer for our catechists: for the ones who just lost a loved one, for the ones who have become caregivers of a family member or friend, for the ones searching for a better job, for the one who is fighting cancer, for the one governing a community, for the one praying for the health of a grandchild, for the ones recovering from a hospital stay, for the ones struggling to make ends meet, for the ones that never take time for themselves, and to all who never put their own struggles before their work as a catechist. We are truly blessed to have these special "ones" in the Religious Education Program. May God give them a wonderful summer to relax and rejuvenate! —*Mary Kay Smith*

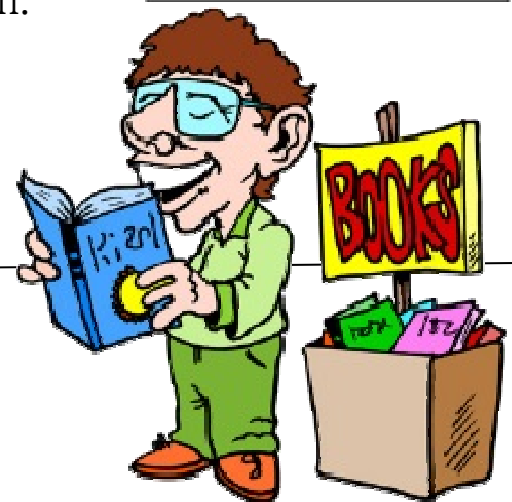

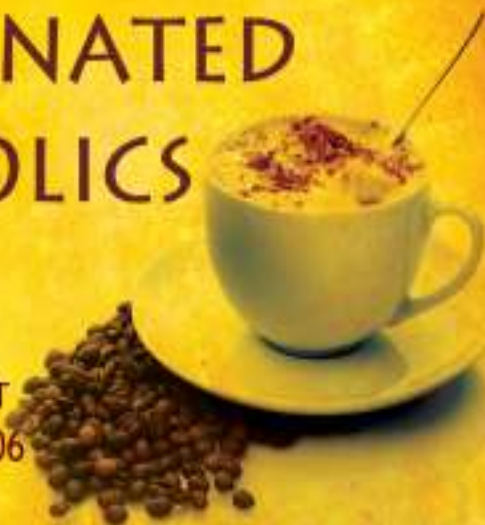

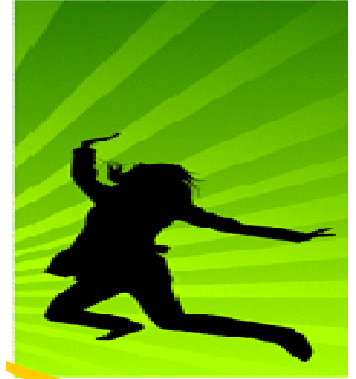
