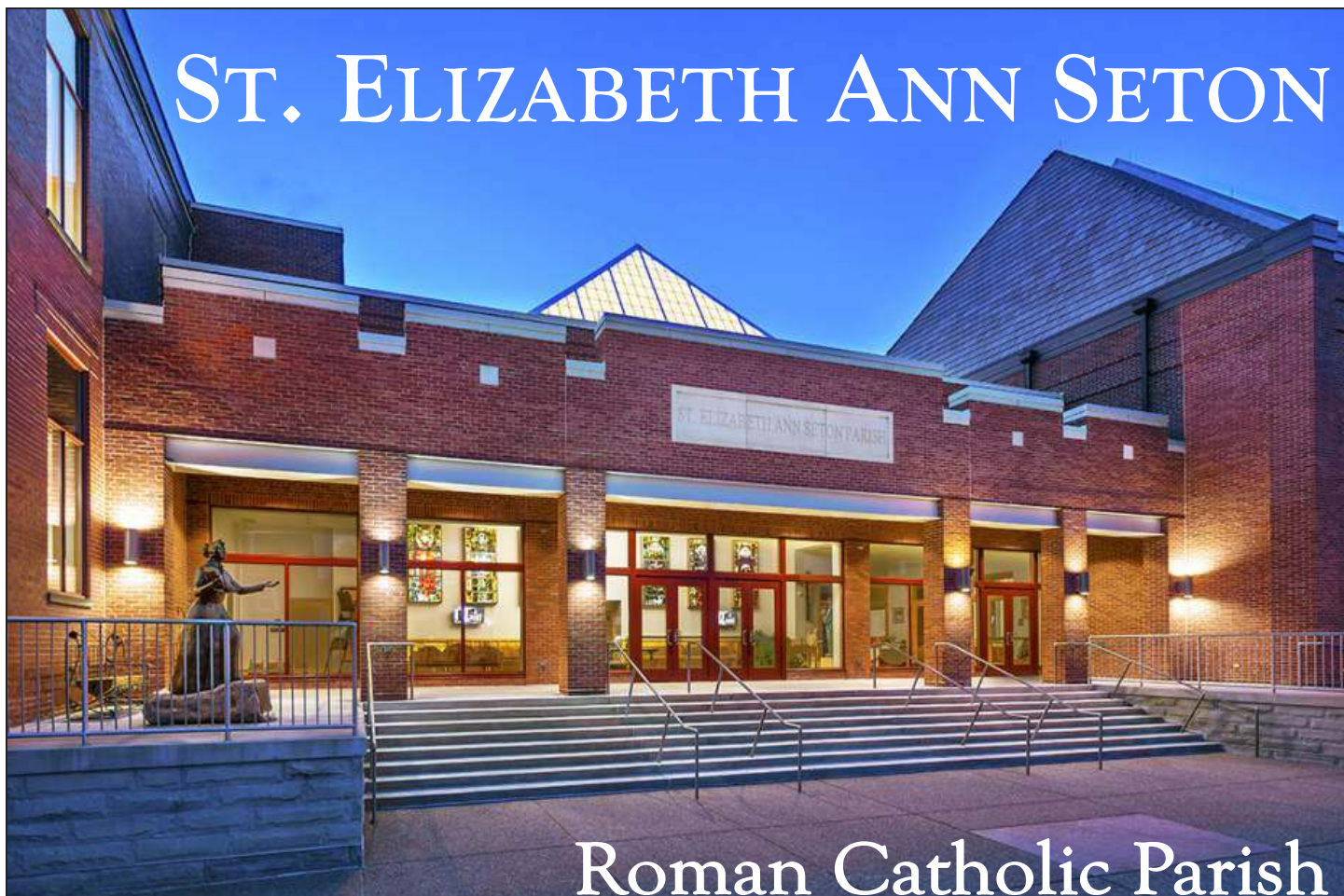

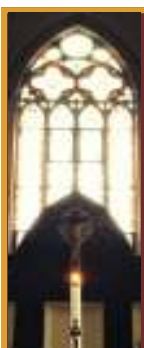

ANNULMENT PRESENTATION

GATHERING OF CATHOLIC MEN

Each year the Catholic Men's Fellowship (CMF) of Pittsburgh has a one day event called the "Gathering of Catholic Men", aimed at strengthening the resolve of Catholic men to remain faithful to Christ and His Church, and to their families, in the face of a culture that is extremely counter-Christian. This year the event was held on September 19th at the David Lawrence Convention Center. The event started off with a Holy Hour and ended with a Mass, both presided over by Bishop Zubik. There were four nationally known Catholic authors and speakers to fill the day with inspirational talks specifically aimed at encouraging us to be men of God first, and using the power of that commitment to make us better husbands, fathers, and citizens. Two speakers (Deacon Harold Burke-Sivers and Dave VanVickle) encouraged us, very powerfully, to fight the good fight and to not be afraid to defend, and be good witnesses for the faith. Paul George cited statistics that show the importance of a father attending Mass faithfully, demonstrating that that can lead to a more stable family, and children more likely to continue going to church into adulthood. Statistics show that 25% of married women go to church without their husbands, and that about 70% of children continue to go to church if the father goes and only 35% if only the mother goes without the father. Scott Hahn, a biblical scholar, broke down in detail the "Our Father". He has written many very educational books, some of which are often available on the kiosk in the narthex of our church. Seven men from SEAS attended this year. All of us came away inspired. We encourage all male parishioners who feel the call to deepen their faith to attend the event next year, November 12, 2016. Also we encourage participation in our parish CMF chapter. We have 2 men's faith-sharing groups on-site here at the church, one that meets every Tuesday morning and another that meets twice a month on Wednesday evenings. 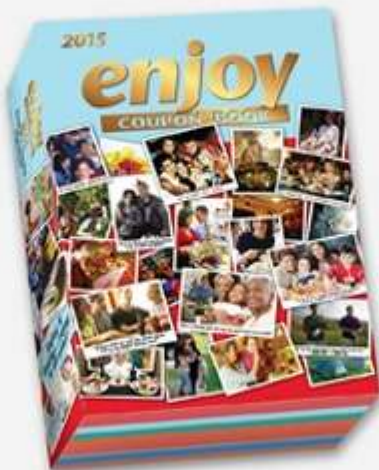
