HEARTS SPEAK TO HEARTS

HUMBLE EVANGELIZATION

Today's Mass readings from Holy Scripture teach us about humility. What does humility have to do with evangelization? Read on!

Dr. Jeff Mirus, Founder of CatholicCulture.org talks about humility as being one of the specific characteristics which will always make our efforts at evangelization more fruitful:

Humility...is the virtue by which we recognize who God is and who we are, that we are not God, and that in point of fact we depend entirely on God not only for our existence but for every good work. There are two sides to this virtue. The first is a radical reliance upon God...The second is the recognition and acceptance of our own inescapable inadequacy in sharing the Christian life with others...

...It takes humility to open ourselves to others, but humility is the mark of personal authenticity. It cannot be faked, and it is always attractive...An effective evangelizer will always be frank about his own deficiencies in both virtue and knowledge...Far better to be willing to engage another in the Christ life on terms of equal need than either to hide our light or be correctly perceived as a self-righteous know-it-all.

And from one of our non-Catholic friends, Wes Simmons, a campus minister:

"...what if evangelism is more about our weakness than our strength, more about humility than boldness? What if it's more about sharing why you need Jesus, inviting people into your brokenness, than it is about trying to convince them why they need Jesus?

It has been said that friendship begins at the moment when one person looks at another and says, "What, you too? I thought I was the only one." What if this same principle applies to evangelism? What if inviting people into relationship with you, by sharing about your sinful brokenness, was more convincing than having the right answers to questions people aren't asking?"

It sounds like humility is a great virtue for us to be sure is in our toolbox for our evangelization efforts! Perhaps we can pray for the gift of humility...see the Litany of Humility on page 11 of this bulletin.


KNIGHTS NEWS


