



FROM THE PASTOR

TRANSFIGURATION

The feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord transpires every August 6, even if it happens to fall on a Sunday, as this year. The mystery shows the glory of the Lord Jesus, his divinity peeking through his humanity, just for a moment. While Jesus' disciples were reluctant to accept his teaching that he must walk the way of the cross—and they must follow him!—he is momentarily transfigured in order to reveal how his way of the cross is also the way to eternal life.

At the 9:30 Mass today, the Lord's suffering and glory are both on display. I will preach only briefly, allowing Pastor John Kent to speak to you on the subject of addiction and his ministry—a point of great pain for many people and families in southwest Pennsylvania, sharing in the sufferings of the Lord Jesus and his blessed Mother.

But the Lord Jesus continues to glorify himself, calling us to his service, and in particular calling young men to be configured to him as ordained priests. Parishioner Brian Hindt today receives his prayer books, *The Liturgy of the Hours*, as he enters seminary this month. Please take a moment after Mass to greet Brian and offer him your prayers and best wishes.

Many weeks ago I asked whether some of you might find it more convenient to have confession periods on Sundays. Very few responded, but I'm going to experiment with it nonetheless. For the rest of this year, we'll have **confessions on the first Sundays of the month** between the later two Masses—that is, from about 10:30 to 11:30 a.m. If it makes it possible for people to come to confession who wouldn't otherwise be able, and if it turns out to be not too hard on the priests, we may continue into 2018.



Next weekend, at all Sunday Masses August 12-13, Father Hector del Rosario will be preaching. He's the representative of the mission Diocese of Virac, Philippines.

Virac has been assigned to us this year as our parish's participation in the Mission Co-Op appeal, a means by which the faithful of the U.S. hear of mission work overseas, and an opportunity for them to contribute. The second collection will be for the work of the Church in Virac. Make checks payable to St. Elizabeth Ann Seton.

LIVING JESUS

Living Jesus is a six-week program designed especially for those responsible for shaping others' faith, those whom the Spirit is moving to new responsibility for or in the Church, and those who are going "out into deeper water" (those who are exploring, reviving, or deepening their faith). Living Jesus now becomes a parish preparatory requirement for many sacraments.

Infant Baptism: Parents anticipating infant baptism will have approximately nine months to fit the six weeks of Living Jesus into their schedule (instead of the former "baptism class"). Living Jesus will run seasonally, so expectant parents are encouraged to participate in mid-pregnancy rather than wait until they have a newborn to attend.

1st Communion: Parents anticipating a child's 1st Holy Communion will be expected to participate in Living Jesus any time during the 21 months preceding the anticipated sacrament.

Confirmation: Parents anticipating a youth's Confirmation will be expected to participate in Living Jesus any time during the 33 months preceding the anticipated sacrament. (For many, that will be while the youth is in 6th, 7th, or 8th grade.)

We are offering two six-week courses this Fall; one on Mondays, starting September 11, at 6:00 p.m. (dinner included) and one on Sundays, starting October 29, at 12:45 (lunch included).


MORE ABOUT THE DIOCESE OF VIRAC

The Diocese of Virac, formerly a part of the Diocese of Legazpi in the province of Albay, was created a separate diocese on May 27, 1974. Up to the present it has remained a suffragan of the Archdiocese of Nueva Caceres, Philippines. The Most Rev. Manolo A. de los Santos, D.D. was appointed as second bishop of the diocese on August 12, 1994.

The Diocese of Virac comprises the entire island province of Catanduanes. The local church attends to 227,354 Catholics within the 19 parishes and 8 parishables covering the 11 towns of the province. With a total land area of 1,511.5 sq. km. The island-province is basically agricultural. Since it lies along the Pacific, the lands and their fruits are frequently exposed to strong typhoons. Recent statistics show that, of the total population of 234,386 of this province, 87% are living below poverty line, 96% of said population belongs to the Catholic flock.

PURPOSE OF THE APPEAL

- 1. Priestly formation of the poor but deserving seminarians.
- 2. Catechesis and Evangelization (specifically, for the on-going implementation in different parishes of the *New Evangelization Pastorale*, the Diocese's main pastoral thrust and result of the unprecedented Diocesan Synod of 1999 and the Diocesan Pastoral Assembly in 2004).
- 3. Pastoral care of orphans and malnourished children.
- 4. Pastoral care for families.
- 5.On-going formation program for the young people.
- 6.Medical mission for the poor.
- 7. Food distribution for the poor.
- 8. Financial assistance for the emergency needs of the poor.
