From Father Grecco regarding the celebration of the Sacred Triduum 2019

Friends, I present to you the schedule for the Holy Week services in our grouping. This decision was extremely difficult to make because of the attachment we still have to "our "church building and" our" Mass times. As with the preparation of the Christmas schedule, I am aware that I cannot please everyone. I assure you I made my best effort.

The Sacred Triduum (Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Easter Vigil/Day) is ideally celebrated in one place. That is a practice toward which we will work. Although separate ceremonies, they are enmeshed and celebrate one reality--the passion, death, and resurrection of the Lord. The circumstances in which we now find ourselves make one location impossible without hurt feelings or presumed favoritism toward one church building.

Many aspects of the location selected for particular services are based on the benefits/unique aspects of a church building. Of course, the size of the building is always primary in the process. We need to be able to fit into the space all who want to attend for the holy days. Additionally, as we now have a combined traditional choir, there needs to be appropriate space for them as well as acoustics that will enhance the singers and instrumentalists. The ability for the participants to view what is happening (i.e. the washing of the feet; veneration of the cross; lighting of the Easter fire) is an important component when selecting a site. Additionally, the scheduling must keep in mind the availability of priests and organists and their ability to be available for the numerous Mass times required.

Based on this information, there is only one site that could easily accommodate the numbers. What follows will be the plan, as a trial run, for this year's Triduum celebration. Next year, based on what we as priests experience, the schedule may be very different and we may concentrate services to fewer sites. In the coming year, we should make the effort to visit the other churches so as to become more comfortable, recognizing that we will not remain three separate parishes.

I BELIEVE!

As we continue our weekly reflections about the beautiful gift of the Mass from the perspective of evangelization, we now come to the moment in the Mass when we stand as a community and profess the Creed. The Creed is a summary of our Catholic faith, and is the result of many years of prayer and study by Church Fathers, theologians, and the like. Not one single word in it is accidental. Some of the words in it are ones we don't use very often, but they have been carefully chosen by our ancestors in the faith to explain very deep truths. The Creed has the potential of being one of our most effective evangelization tools. Why? Because it's a concise, but very thorough, statement of what we, as Catholic Christians actually believe. It's a powerful statement of the Gospel message that we live by and live for. Dr. Edward Sri, theologian, author, and Catholic speaker, says that if we proclaim the truths of the Creed with our life, it becomes our story. So, if it's well understood and proclaimed with intention and meaning, it will help us to be able to talk about 'the reason(s) for our hope'. (1 Peter 3:15) St. Augustine preached about the importance of the Creed:

"You have received it and recited it, but in your minds and hearts you must keep it ever present, you must repeat it in your beds, recall it in the public squares and not forget it during meals: even when your body is asleep, you must watch over it with your hearts."

Knowing all of this, let's really pay attention to the words, understand their meaning, say them as a prayer, and be ready to share and explain them to others. Our faith, indeed our whole Catholic life, is based on these precious words!




