The same information can also be accessed by calling an automated phone system at 1-858-207-6277. It is recommended that if you use any of these sources, you follow-up by calling the church itself and verify the Mass times as some churches change times and the info may not be updated on the MASSTIMES system.

A friendly, but serious reminder...As the summer weather begins both its comfort and scourge, remember that there is appropriate dress for attendance at Mass...and inappropriate. WHO YOU SEEK IS SEEKING YOU

In the *Rite of Christian Initiation* process (RCIA) there is a beginning period for investigating the Catholic Faith. This period is designated as the Pre-Catechumenate or Inquiry or Evangelization. It has an undefined length of time, since the seeker has already been sought by the Holy Spirit.

We, the communities of Grouping #210, are anxiously waiting for those seekers to make themselves known. We don't have all the answers, but we do have a listening ear and a desire to help one understand the traditions of the Catholic Church. In other words, our job is simply to be witnesses to the Catholic faith.

Since Baptism is the primary sacrament of faith and brings one into the community, his/her faith needs the community of believers.
