SIMPLE, PRACTICAL STRATEGIES OF EVANGELIZATION - PART 1

Bishop Robert Barron has what he calls "Practical Strategies of Evangelization": four simple ideas that he believes can make an impact on those around us.

This week let's look at the first strategy: "Deepen your knowledge of the Catholic tradition." Bishop Barron believes that doing this will help us to be better able to explain our Catholic faith to others. We can come at it from the angle of scripture, theology, spirituality, art, literature, or studies of the saints. Choose the one or ones that work for you!

Right now, and for a couple more weeks, right here in Grouping 210, Barron is helping us to do this very thing as we go through Volume I of his Pivotal Players dvd series. (And, for the record, Barron tends to use ALL of the angles mentioned above in his dvd teachings!) We've been learning about the holy lives of various holy people, with two now left to study: G. K. Chesterton, on July 11, and Michelangelo, on July 18. Consider joining us at 1:00 pm in SEAS' St. Maximilian Kolbe Room. Bring your lunch, some curiosity, and a friend for one or both of these delightful sessions!
