

FROM FR. GRECCO

"It was necessary that she who preserved her virginity inviolate in childbirth should also have her body kept free from corruption after death. It was necessary that she who carried the Creator as a child on her breast should dwell in the tabernacles of God. It was necessary that the bride espoused by the Father should make her home in the bridal chambers of heaven. It was necessary that she, who had gazed on her crucified Son and been pierced in the heart by the sword of sorrow which she had escaped in giving him birth, should contemplate him seated with the Father. It was necessary that the Mother of God should share the possessions of her Son, and be venerated by every creature as the Mother and handmaid of God." —St John Damascene

The Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary is commemorated this Thursday, August 15. This is a holy day of obligation. Healthy Catholics who are not truly restricted from attending are expected to participate at Mass as on Sunday. Just as freely choosing to miss Mass on the weekend is a serious sin, so it is for absence from celebrations of the holy days that occur during the week.

In addition to last week's announcement of vocations from our parish grouping, I am happy to include Michael Healy from SSJ who recently entered the Marians of the Immaculate Conception. He has begun his year of postulancy in Steubenville, OH. Please pray for Mike and all who have accepted the call to priesthood, diaconate, and religious life.

We receive numerous requests for "authorization" for folks to act as sponsors and godparents. To fulfill that role one must be a registered "practicing Catholic", attending mass regularly on Sundays and holydays; be at least 16 years of age; if married, married in the Church by a Catholic priest or deacon; if unmarried, not in a cohabiting relationship. Ideally, the request for eligibility form comes three weeks before the event. I cannot assure that last minute requests will be honored as the caller expects. Registration in the parish must also take place in advance. We have to be able to authentically confirm that you have a "history of Faith".

HEARTS SPEAK TO HEARTS

For we are God's co-workers; you are God's field, God's building.

—1 Corinthians 3:9

Last week we talked about ministry opportunities and the connection between ministry and evangelization. But what qualities lend themselves to being the type of ministry volunteer who can be an effective agent of evangelization?

One quality would be to be a person of prayer, someone who is in 'constant contact' with the Father, learning His will and His desires for our life, through relationship with Him.

Another important quality of an evangelizing volunteer is to be a person who strives to understand the beautiful faith that has been taught and handed down to us by Jesus, so that we can better live it out in our daily lives, and so that we can explain the 'reason for our hope'.

Finally, evangelizing Catholics need to be reaching out to share with others the fruits of the Holy Spirit that come to us as a result of our prayer life and our study of the faith.

Ministry actually gives us a forum to practice our faith, hope, and charity with our sisters and brothers in the faith, and also to reach out to help those who don't yet know the real answer to what they need, and for what they are seeking.
