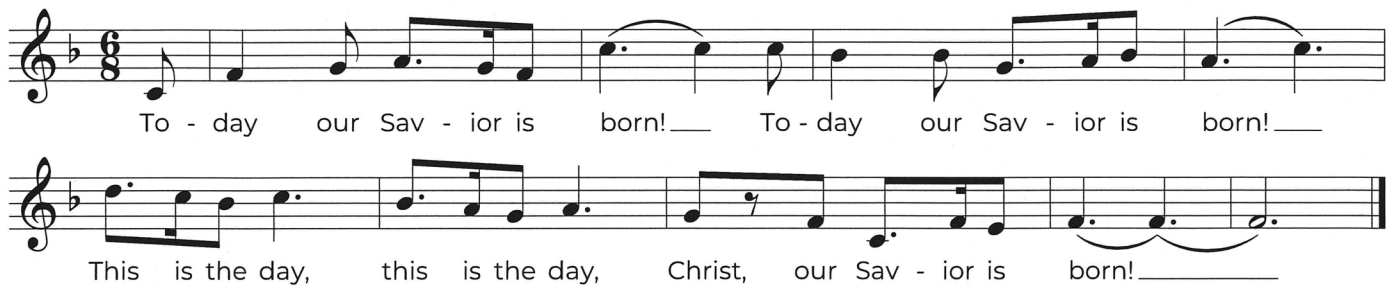
## FIRST READING | ISAIAH 9:1-6

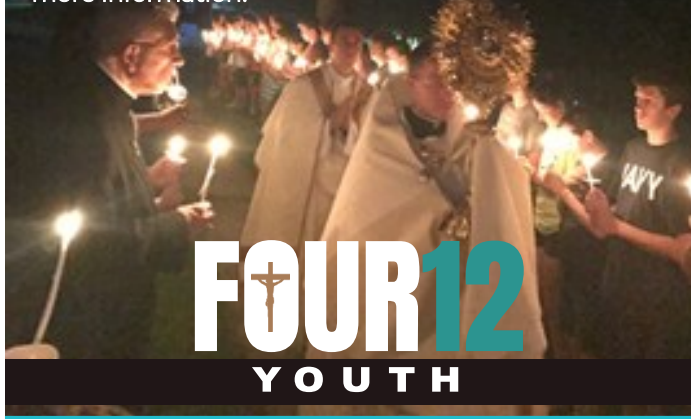


## MISSION TRIP 2020 SAVE THE DATE
