RENEWAL OF BAPTISMAL PROMISES—RITE OF SPRINKLING

Dear brothers and sisters, through the Paschal Mystery we have been buried with Christ in Baptism, so that we may walk with him in newness of life. And so, now that our Lenten observance is concluded, let us renew the promises of Holy Baptism, by which we once renounced Satan and his works and promised to serve God in the holy Catholic Church. And so I ask you:

Do you renounce sin, so as to live in the freedom of the children of God?

All: I do.

Do you renounce the lure of evil, so that sin may have no mastery over you?

All: I do.

Do you renounce Satan, the author and prince of sin?

All: I do.

Do you believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth?

All: I do.

Do you believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was born of the Virgin Mary, suffered death and was buried, rose again from the dead and is seated at the right hand of the Father?

All: I do.

Do you believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting?

All: I do.

And may almighty God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has given us new birth by water and the Holy Spirit and bestowed on us forgiveness of our sins, keep us by his grace, in Christ Jesus our Lord, for eternal life.











CARING + GIVING + SERVING

"But once Christ is risen, the gravitational pull of love is stronger than that of hatred; the force of gravity of life is stronger than that of death. Perhaps this is actually the situation of the Church in every age, perhaps it is our situation? It always seems as if she ought to be sinking, and yet she is always already saved. Saint Paul illustrated this situation with the words: 'We are as dying, and behold we live' (2 Cor 6:9). The Lord's saving Hand holds us up, and thus we can already sing the song of the saved, the new song of the risen ones: Alleluia!" -Pope Benedict XVI

Lent, 2020 was a true desert experience for Catholic Christians whose ability to attend mass, receive sacraments, and even have funerals for our dearly departed, was abruptly taken away by a fearful, invisible virus. With much of the rest of the world, we stay home in isolation. The joys of classroom learning, activities, and the dances and graduation ceremonies to which students look forward are not to be. Most adults are adjusting to working at home, working in jeopardy in health or essential service and retail, or not working and wondering how they will make ends meet. The loneliest elderly and ill members of our society cannot receive visitors or participate in activities that brighten their long days. This is certainly a time when, as Pope Benedict wrote above, it feels like the Church "ought to be sinking!"

Yet, as we celebrate Easter, we have the assurance that Christ is risen! The angel told the women at the empty tomb, "Do not be afraid!" (Matthew 28: 5). Even through the major challenges of the pandemic we are experiencing, we must keep our fears in check by keeping the joy and hope of the resurrection in our hearts. In Chapter 11 of John's gospel, when Mary Magdalene sees her risen Lord for the first time, she only recognizes him after weeping. We, too, can see, believe, and grow closer to Jesus Christ if we turn to Him in prayer through our tears, fears, doubts, and sorrows.

As members of the Church who cannot even gather on Easter Sunday to celebrate our most sacred feast, how can we experience and witness the salvation that Christ made possible for us by redeeming us through his death and resurrection? We can do this first and foremost by choosing life and love! We can follow the recommendations of social distancing that are meant to protect as many lives as possible from COVID-19. We can pray and reflect on the scriptures in our homes. We can be grateful for the livestreamed masses and prayers that our clergy are providing for us. We can call, text, email, or write to our loved ones. We can reflect on how much we miss our sacraments and our community, and look forward with joy and hope, through our tears, to the day we are able to return to them safely. And, we can communicate and show our thirst for that time to those with whom we are currently interacting at a safe distance.

EASTER RESURRECTION AND THE RCIA

How different this Easter is for all of us and especially those who have waited so many months to be baptized into this tremendous sacramental joy of Jesus' Resurrection through the Easter Vigil.

We have also had the unique privilege this Lent to join those who were unable to receive the precious Body & Blood until they were brought into the Church.

How we all became catechumens and candidates these past weeks and entered the desiring and waiting for our Lord in the blessed sacrament of the altar.

We, the people of our whole grouping, prepare our catechumens and candidates with the desire to enter this holy communion. And now we experience being one with them.

Even though we celebrate the Resurrection as best we can this year; we now have the chance to look forward to the day when we, along with our catechumens and candidates, will partake of our union with Christ through His Holy Sacraments.

We pray together for a joyful and blessed Easter!


