

FROM FR. GRECCO

Congratulations to staff Care Minister, Laura O'Keeffe who recently graduated from Duquesne University graduate program with a Master of Arts in Pastoral Ministry!

The bishop recently provided priest administrators with the guidance needed to prepare for the re-opening of the churches for public services and prayer. Some highlights:

Immediate Preparation to Open Your Church

- Review guidelines and evaluate your church space. Keep in mind that social distancing of 6- feet is required and must be maintained for all
- Clean and sanitize a designated space before opening as well as before and after each use following the Cleaning and Sanitizing guidelines.
- Designate one entrance and a separate single exit in each church building, and clearly mark them as such.
- Make hand sanitizer stations available at key locations within the church including at the entrance.
- Mark off pews, floors, open church areas, and any guidance needed regarding access to bathrooms to fulfill 6-feet social distancing requirements.
- Communicate necessary guidelines and requirements to parishioners so they know what to expect.

Requirements for Attendees

- Number of attendees will be designated by state and federal guidelines,
- Follow all CDC guidelines as posted, and stay home when sick.
- Must follow facility protocol in order to enter and remain in facility.
- Wear facial covering/mask
- Rostering of attendees if an attendee becomes ill with COVID-19, attendees will be contacted to be alerted of the potential risk and symptoms of COVID-19.
- Most vulnerable (over 65, compromised immune or respiratory health, diabetes) encouraged to stay home.
- Must observe safety guidelines regarding the celebration of Mass including directives regarding Holy Communion and the Sign of Peace

As the obligation to attend Mass will be suspended for the foreseeable future, I encourage those who are retired and are of the particular demographic for the illness to "Keep Sunday throughout the week". I will provide more information about my plan on the parish website and in next weekend's bulletin.

A EUCHARISTIC BLESSING ON PENTECOST SUNDAY

Sunday, May 31 1:00 to 2:00 p.m.

At all churches in the 210 Grouping

The priests and deacons will be stationed at each of the churches between 1:00-2:00 p.m. to bless with the Blessed Sacrament any cars that stop for this purpose. You are not permitted to leave your car. The churches will not opened for visits. The minister will maintain the six-foot social distancing. All you need to do is pull-up and a Eucharistic blessing will be given to those in the vehicle. Following the blessing, participants are to immediately depart the property.

Directions to access the churches and the Eucharistic blessing:

SS

Enter from Greentree Rd as usual. Stay in the travel lane along the curb where the Stations of the Cross are located. Follow the travel lane along the curb lane passing the administration building and stopping at the designated location for the blessing (indicated by traffic cones). Proceed out of the campus as you would usually on to Greentree road.

SMOS

Enter off of Greentree Road at the School sign (school sign indicates this procedure). Follow the curb lane and pass IN FRONT of the school to arrive at the church car port. (Do NOT proceed down the hill behind the school.) You will receive your blessing and then exit FOR THIS INSTANCE ONLY on to Mansfield Avenue.

SEAS

Proceed to the Third Avenue entrance of the church from Third Street toward Forth Street. Pull up into the curb lane so as to allow traffic to continue to move.

At all locations there will be an altar and members of the clergy. You are welcomed to visit all three if your wish, being attentive to the entrance and exit procedure of each location.

As we celebrate Memorial Day on May 25, our thoughts and prayers are with our dearly departed loved ones, especially those who sacrificed their lives in military service. We pray for the repose of their souls and treasure our precious memories of the gift of their lives.

The pandemic situation which we are in has caused unprecedented disruption of our lives, and more sadly, in the way we part with those we love. Families are not able to be at the bedside of those who are dying, and we have not been able to celebrate any funerals for the past two months. Pray for God's mercy and comfort for the members of our community who are approaching the end of their earthly lives and those who are grieving, as their burdens are especially heavy at this time.

As we are transitioning into the "yellow" phase of the state of emergency in Pennsylvania, the Church is now able to have funerals on a limited basis. Because we are still at risk for spread of the coronavirus, many precautions are in place for funeral Masses. We are making every attempt to comfort the grieving as the sacrifice of the Mass is offered for their loved one and prioritizing the health and safety of all present. Some of our current procedures include:

- A total of 25 people can gather in the church (clergy, staff, and funeral home staff are included in this number).
- All attendees must wear a mask.
- Attendees must sit in designated pews.
- Family members and friends of the deceased cannot have liturgical roles (no readers or gift bearers) or deliver remarks of remembrance (eulogy) at this time.
- Church restrooms are not open.
- Committal prayers will be offered in church and clergy will not go to the cemetery.


These and other measures will be taken to minimize exposure to, and spread of, infection. In the future, we are working to be able to schedule Memorial Masses for those who died when we were completely unable to celebrate funeral Masses. Please know that all of our beloved deceased members are in the prayers of our community, and our clergy and pastoral care staff are available by phone if we can be of any service to those in need of consolation and prayer.

Most recently, Teresa, now 7, was diagnosed with Stage 4 thyroid cancer. She underwent a 10-hour surgery to remove as much of the disease as possible.

This week she endured multiple tests so she could begin iodine treatments in the hopes of shrinking any remaining cancer cells. This procedure requires her to be in isolation for 4 to 6 days. Imagine being just seven years old in isolation!



If you would like to send some love by way of cards and letters, it would be such a nice gesture from her parish family! Wouldn't it be great to keep her busy for weeks opening all the mail? She is such a faith-filled, kind, and loving little girl! Let's flood her with faith and love and prayers!
