

FROM THE PASTOR

"The Lord has given us many counsels and commandments to help us toward salvation. He has even given us a pattern of prayer, instructing us on how we are to pray. He has given us life, and with his accustomed generosity, he has also taught us how to pray. He has made it easy for us to be heard as we pray to the Father in the words taught us by the Son."

Additionally, as we are still limited to the number of participants in the churches, (and because of the "high volume" of attendees expected for the Masses and services beginning with Palm Sunday and through to Easter Sunday), please remember to visit the "Sign-Up Genius" on our website to make your "reservations".

I am grateful to Greg & Carol Knorr for the beautiful "veiling curtains" in use at SEAS church. They were made for last year, but we were not able to make use of them because of the virus closing of the churches.

Why do we "veil" images in our churches during these weeks prior to Easter Triduum?

Prosper Louis Pascal Guéranger, a French priest and Benedictine monk, who served for nearly 40 years as the Abbot of the monastery of Solesmes, answers:

"As Christ hid himself from the rage of the Jewish authorities (John 8:59), so now he is hidden from the world in preparation for the mysteries of his passion."

"The presentiment of that awful hour [of our Savior's passion] leads the afflicted mother [the Church] to veil the image of her Jesus: the cross is hidden from the eyes of the faithful. The statues of the saints, too, are covered; for it is but just that, if the glory of the Master be eclipsed, the servant should not appear."

"The interpreters of the liturgy tell us that this ceremony of veiling the crucifix during Passiontide, expresses the humiliation to which our Savior subjected Himself, of hiding Himself when the Jews threatened to stone Him, as is related in the Gospel of Passion Sunday [They took up stones therefore to cast at him. But Jesus hid himself, and went out of the temple (John 8:59)]. The Church begins this solemn rite with the Vespers of the Saturday before Passion Sunday."

The optional custom was "revived" in the United States with the promulgation of the Roman Missal in 2011.

Please pray for the souls of the faithful departed.

LENTEN REGULATIONS

- 1. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fast and abstinence. The Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence in the United States.
- 2. The obligation of abstinence (refraining from eating meat) begins at the age of 14. The law of fasting (limiting oneself to one full meal and two lighter meals) obliges all between the ages of 18-59. No one should consider this obligation liahtly.
- 3. Those individuals who have a medical condition in which fasting may be considered harmful are not obliged to fast, but should perform some other act of penance or charity.
- 4. Pastors and parents are to see to it that minors, though not bound by the law of fast and abstinence, are educated in the authentic sense of penance and encouraged to do acts of penance suitable to their age.
- 5. Notable during this Lenten season is that the Solemnity of Saint Joseph falls on a Friday. Because of this, there is not an obligation to abstain from meat on Friday, March 19, 2021, the Solemnity of Saint Joseph, according to the norm of canon 1251.
- 6. All members of the Christian Faithful are encouraged to do acts of penance and charity during the Lenten season beyond what is prescribed by the law.
- 7. As a general rule, a request for a dispensation from the obligation of abstinence on Fridays of Lent will not be considered unless some serious reason is present. The attendance at social events, banquets, wedding rehearsals or receptions, or funeral wakes are not considered sufficient reason to request a dispensation.





For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures.


He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end.

Amen.




This week, on Thursday, March 25, a little joy breaks into our Lenten desert journey as we observe the Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord.

TENEBRÆ SERVICE OF DARKNESS: PASSION AND VENERATION OF THE CROSS

Good Friday at 8:00 p.m. — St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Church

Tenebræ, which means "darkness" in Latin, is a service recalling the suffering and death of Jesus Christ. Our Tenebræ service will include a sung Passion according to Saint John and conclude with the Veneration of the Cross. This solemn liturgy will be presided over by Fr. Alek, and a *schola*

cantorum (a choir of cantors) will provide music for the liturgy.

Traditionally, the only light for a Tenebræ service came from the Tenebræ hearse, a large candle holder. This is placed in the sanctuary with fifteen lit candles. One by one, the candles are extinguished throughout the service. As the church draws closer to complete darkness, we recall the death of our Lord — a stark visual reminder of Christ, slowly but surely left alone in the darkness of a world fraught with sin. At the end of the final chorus, the final candle is removed, signifying the burial of our Lord in the tomb. A noise is made, symbolizing the earthquake at the Crucifixion.

While most of the ceremonies of the Catholic Church are joyous and celebratory, Tenebræ is stark and somber. The service ends with a simple prayer and leads into Veneration of the Cross. The Schola



will sing motets of Christ's Passion and Glory of the Cross. Tenebræ at St. Elizabeth Ann Seton will be a moving and fitting way to mark Good Friday — particularly if you are not otherwise able to attend the afternoon Liturgy of the Lord's Passion and Veneration of the Cross.



In recent weeks our St. Vincent de Paul Society Conference has received a wide variety of requests from Friends in Need, but unfortunately we had to put a limit on expenditures because of our dwindling treasury. It seems that the Holy Spirit intervened and our parishioners perhaps sensed the need, because once again you have overwhelmingly donated - - \$11,333 to February's appeal. In addition, the SEAS Food Pantry also generously contributed. Thank you again for thinking of those in need and making a Lenten almsgiving.

One of our neighbors, whom you have helped this past month, is a woman who has been timely with her rent for nine years at the same residence, but fell behind due to a hospitalization. Now she cannot work because of a respiratory ailment requiring oxygen. Fortunately, her landlord has been understanding and we were able to assist with the rent.

A young man, with a degree in finance and business management, lost his job due to a severe reduction in commissions since the pandemic. He came to us for help with his rent, while he continues to seek steady employment.

A shut off notice from the sewer authority puzzled one neighbor, who discovered that there was a mix-up in the address and hence she hadn't received any bills; nevertheless the sewer authority demanded payment and our Conference was able to assist.

In these three cases we were not the only source of help. If our clients are unaware, we provide them with other resources such as the Lazarus Fund, Salvation Army, LIHEAP and CAP, plus the CARES Act has been a timely help for several; however, the need still remains great. As we learn from Deuteronomy 15:11 "The poor will never cease from the land;" therefore your altruism and generosity will always be needed and recognized. God Bless you for your continued kindness.


Middle School Language Arts Classes:

Middle school is excited for both the start of spring and the start of a new novel unit in March! In sixth grade, students are interested in learning more about the subgenre of historic fiction as they read *Number the Stars* by Lois Lowry. Similarly, seventh grade is doing the important work of discussing and learning more about the atrocities that millions of people faced during the Holocaust as they read Anne Frank's "*The Diary of a Young Girl*". Canon Law requires that "a special lamp to indicate and honor the presence of Christ is to burn at all times before the tabernacle in which the Most Holy Eucharist is reserved" (940). This special lamp is known as the sanctuary lamp or the tabernacle lamp.

Although its color is not assigned by the Church, the sanctuary lamp is often red to distinguish it from other candles. Its decorative holder sets it apart from the altar candles or any other votive candles. Its purpose is to indicate that the Blessed Sacrament is reserved in the tabernacle.

The sanctuary lamp is removed or extinguished when the Blessed Sacrament is not reserved in the tabernacle such as on Good Friday or when there is a practical concern such as construction/renovation in the church.

It can be a common practice for parishioners to make a contribution to cover the cost of the candle as an offering and prayer intention.
