You may have received an email from our new Safe Environment Platform Provider, VIRTUS, about the need for you to take a new training course entitled, "Protecting God's Children Maltreatment 3.2 and Vulnerable Adults Training." This is a re-certification training program that is being required of ALL clergy, staff, and volunteers. It is a follow-up course to Protecting God's Children that you have taken to become a volunteer; some people have taken it as far back as 2003! Additionally, every three years everyone will be required to re-certify. It takes a little more than an hour to complete online. You will watch informative videos and answer questions. At the conclusion you will be able to earn and print out a certificate. The GOOD NEWS is that you do not have to send me a copy; I have access to print it out and put it in your file. Just go to virtus.org and log in; if you forgot your password, click on "Need login information" under the password box. The ACCESS word is PROTECT.

As always, please feel free to call or email with any questions or problems, and I can walk you through the process. You can also leave a message and I will get back to you. Thank you for your volunteer service, and for staying up to date with the latest trainings and requirements.

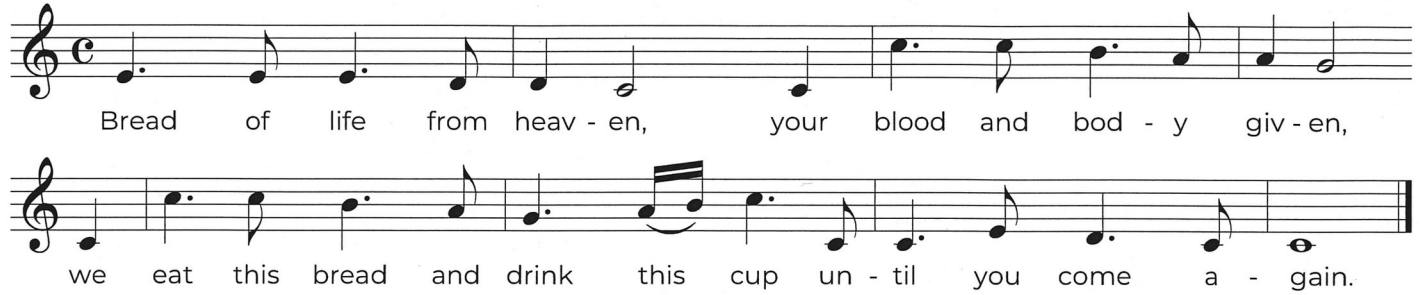

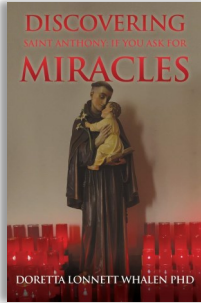

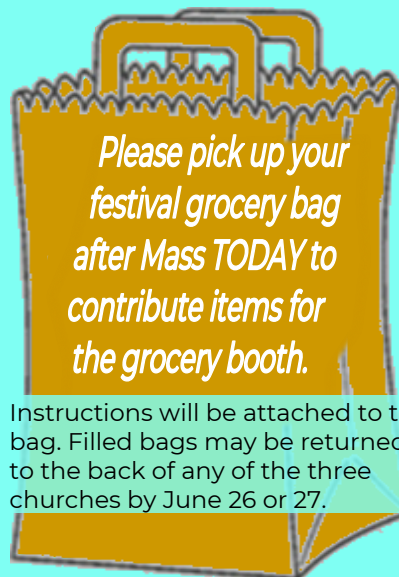
