



PROFESSION OF FAITH



When we celebrate the start of a new year, we often approach it as an opportunity for fresh starts, better habits, and exciting opportunities. January 4 marked the one year anniversary of the establishment of our Parish of St. Raphael the Archangel. Today, we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord, when Jesus began his public ministry. 
