

So the Twelve called together the community of the disciples and said, "It is not right for us to neglect the word of God to serve at table.


Brothers, select from among you seven reputable men, filled with the Spirit and wisdom,

They presented these men to the apostles who prayed and laid hands on them. The word of God continued to spread, and the number of the disciples in Jerusalem increased greatly; even a large group of priests were becoming obedient to the faith.



I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.



CARING + GIVING + SERVING

Say the Rosary every day to obtain peace for the world. -Our Lady of Fatima, May 13, 1917



On Saturday, May 13, the Church observes the Memorial of Our Lady of Fatima. The apparitions of our Blessed Mother to three young shepherd children in Fatima occurred at a time of great turmoil, when both World War I and the Communist Revolution were going on. As humankind was turning from God and increasing the brutality of modern warfare, the Blessed Mother brought warnings to the children and instructed them to pray for the conversion of sinners and peace in the world. Mary, who we honor in a special way

throughout the month of May, also brought a message of hope, stating that, "My Immaculate Heart will triumph." Cardinal Joseph Ratzinger, later Pope Benedict XVI, explained the mechanism of Mary's triumphant Immaculate Heart:

The Heart open to God, purified by contemplation of God, is stronger than guns and weapons of every kind. The fiat of Mary, the word of her heart, has changed the history of the world, because it brought the Savior into the world-because, thanks to her Yes, God could become man in our world and remains so for all time. The Evil One has power in this world, as we see and experience continually; he has power because our freedom continually lets itself be led away from God. But since God himself took a human heart and has thus steered human freedom towards what is good, the freedom to choose evil no longer has the last word. From that time forth, the word that prevails is this: "In the world you will have tribulation, but take heart; I have overcome the world" (John 16: 33). The message of Fatima invites us to trust in this promise.

Throughout the Easter Season, we are reminded constantly of Christ's victory over sin and death. The message of Fatima reinforces the importance of personal conversion and prayer. By honoring Mary through daily prayer of the Rosary in the month of May, we can grow closer to her Son as we contemplate the Joyful, Sorrowful, Luminous, and Glorious Mysteries. As rejection of God, violence, and war continue to manifest the power of evil in our world, we Christians need to regularly renew in our hearts the Baptismal Promises we renewed aloud on Easter Sunday. We can be assured through the Gospel and message of Our Lady that evil will never have the last word.

At this gathering, we learned about the various ministries of compassion that reach out and serve, on a daily basis, the ever-growing population of marginalized and underserved men and women in our communities.

From our Diocese, we heard from Dr. Jim Withers of Operation Safety Net, the "Street Ministry Doctor" of Mercy Behavioral Health, St. Joseph House of Hospitality, and The Red Door.

These ministries are well known to our community. Our Ladies of Charity prepare and deliver sandwiches and much needed coffee, tea, creamer, etc. to Operation Safety Net twice a month. One Saturday a month the Order of Malta volunteers also make sandwiches at the Red Door and hand out clothing at Faustina's Gate.

Although not represented at this gathering, our Ladies of Charity serves on the average 65 to 70 dinners to Shepherd's Heart one Sunday a month. This ministry helps homeless veterans to transition back into society. Our dinners also serve the homeless in the community who attend the Sunday Worship Service

DID YOU KNOW?

"You shall not carve idols for yourselves in the shape of anything in the sky above or on the earth below or in the waters beneath the earth; you shall not bow down before them or worship them."

This command from Exodus 20:4–5 is sometimes cited by other Christians to argue against the familiar Catholic practice of having images of Christ, his Blessed Mother, and the saints in our homes and churches. These images and statues are more than mere decoration for us; they are objects of devotion and an expression of faith. So how do we explain that in light of the passage above?

First, we must remember that at the time God gave Moses the Ten Commandments, no one had ever looked upon the face of God — not even Moses himself. "My face you cannot see," said the Lord, "for no man sees me and still lives" (Ex 33:20). But God did not remain invisible and unseen. As we know. Jesus Christ, who is true God and true man. entered this world and took on our human flesh to dwell among us. We call this wonderful mystery the Incarnation. As Saint John proclaims. "No one has ever seen God: but it is God the only Son, ever at the Father's side, who has revealed him" (Jn 1:18).

It is the Incarnation that informs the art of our faith. Since the first days of Christianity, we see depictions of the Lord, saints, and scenes from Sacred Scripture painted on the walls of the catacombs and early churches.

And yet even among Christians this practice has been a matter of dispute. In the eighth century, in fact, it reached a boiling point in the Greek-speaking churches of the Eastern Roman Empire. A movement sprang up called the Iconoclasm — "the breaking of images," and they broke and burned many holy pictures in their enthusiasm for a "purer" expression of faith.

Against this violent and mistaken idea, which surfaced again almost a millennium later during the Protestant Reformation, Saint John Damascene (675–749) asserted: "Previously God, who has neither a body nor a face, absolutely could not be represented by an image. But now that he has made himself visible in the flesh and has lived with men, I can make an image of what I have seen of God and contemplate the glory of the Lord, his face unveiled."

Of course, in no way does a statue or picture depicting a religious subject become an object of worship for us. Simply stated, Christ is not a statue. To think of a statue or picture as the actual person or to worship that statue or object would indeed be idolatry. And yet when we honor an image of Christ in the proper way, we honor Christ himself.

The purpose of these sacred images is to help us human beings picture more clearly the God who became visible in this world in order to bring us home to heaven. And we see his reflection in the saints and holy people whose images we also honor and cherish, just as we cherish precious family portraits and honor the people depicted in them.

In both our churches or in our homes, sacred images are a visible reminder of our Lord, the Blessed Mother, and the saints. Conscious of their living yet invisible presence in our lives, we join our prayers with our Blessed Mother and the saints to our Lord, looking forward to the time when we will see him face to face.
