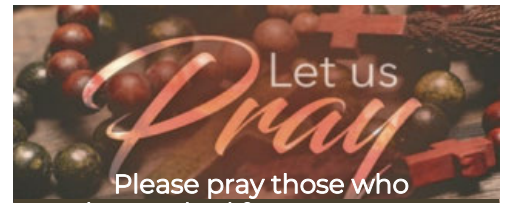

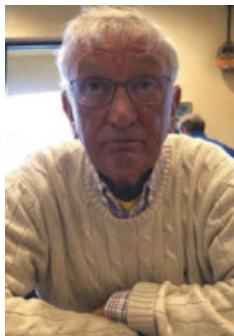

Forgiveness does not seem to be fashionable these days. Any brief perusal of the news is filled with war and terrorism around the world; acts of violence in our city and country; impasse and personal attacks between political rivals; and sparring over social and cultural values with no attempts at civil discussion. If we browse social media, we see public feuding in prominent families; bullying by young people; and people criticizing and vilifying anyone who disagrees with them in a forum where they don't need to listen or attempt to understand the view of the other. Many people have adopted the perspective that they deserve to be happy, and consequently, they choose to simply eliminate people they label as "toxic" from their lives.



A saint from whom our current world has much to learn is St. Rita of Cascia, whose Feast is observed on Monday, May 22. St. Rita's life was filled with broken dreams, disagreement with her parents, an abusive marriage, and a family that engaged in violent feuding in 14<sup>th</sup> century Italy. Following the death of her husband, Rita was even denied entrance into the convent because some of the other sisters belonged to families that held a vendetta against her family. In the eyes of the world in her time and ours, St. Rita had every reason to be negative, selfish, and vengeful. Instead, she turned to prayer in all her many difficulties and aligned her own sufferings with those of Christ in his Passion. She became a model of charity and holiness. St. Rita, who forgave the many wrongs she endured and prayed for the conversion of those who hurt her, is now called the Patron Saint of the Impossible.

The attainment of peace in our world needs to begin with peace in our own hearts. The teachings of Jesus on forgiveness are uncompromising. In today's second reading, St. Peter tells us, "Rejoice to the extent that you share in the sufferings of Christ" (1 Peter 4:13). Whether we are persecuted for our beliefs, experiencing tension in our families, carrying wounds of past hurts or wrongs, or holding a grudge for a reason we cannot even recall, we will not be truly at peace until we can forgive. Jesus paved the way for us to forgive on the road to Calvary. He has given us a great help in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. We know it is possible through the example of the Saint of the Impossible.

## DID YOU KNOW?

Today we find ourselves in the period of liturgical time between Ascension and Pentecost. It's almost like another Holy Saturday: Christ is gone! He has disappeared from the sight of his apostles. But this time he has gone in glory. He has been lifted up into heaven, taking our humanity with him and presenting it, crucified and risen, to the Father. The apostles leave the Mount of Olives with great joy, praising God in the Temple. And they gather in prayer in the Upper Room, together with Mary, and await the coming of the Holy Spirit.

This time of holy tension — when Christ is taken from our sight and we confidently await the fulfillment of his promise — is reflected in the devotional life of the Church. The time between Ascension and Pentecost is nine days. This nine-day period of prayerful preparation is reflected in the practice of the novena, which comes from the Latin word for nine (novem). Aside from its basis in Scripture, the Church Fathers assigned special meaning to the number nine. Because it comes just a little bit short of the solid perfection of the number ten, they saw it as symbolic of imperfect human beings turning to God in prayer.

Novenas take many forms, but in essence, they are a set of prayers, offered either privately or publicly, repeated for nine successive days or

weeks. You'll find novenas dedicated to specific angels, saints, patronages of the Blessed Virgin Mary, or one of the persons of the Holy Trinity. Novenas are often offered for a specific intention, or perhaps more generally for an increase of devotion and grace in our lives. There are even "perpetual" novenas, which are offered all throughout the year in certain churches, so you can join in and make your nine days starting any week of the year.

While we're already a few days into the Pentecost Novena, why not join in now? You can find many beautiful novenas to the Holy Spirit in devotional booklets or on the internet, but you can also keep it simple. Offering even a short prayer every day between today and Pentecost will help you open your heart to the gifts of the Holy Spirit and join yourself to the Church in prayer. Why not offer this traditional prayer, published below, either on your own or with your family?

Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love. Send forth your Spirit and they shall be created, and you shall renew the face of the earth. Let us pray. O God, who did instruct the hearts of your faithful by the light of the Holy Spirit, grant us in the same Spirit to be truly wise, and ever to rejoice in his consolation. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

## BOOTH CHAIRMEN NEEDED

The **festival provides** the game, all the prizes, and the starting change.  
A **booth chairman** is responsible for the running of the game, getting people  
to help run the game, displaying the prizes, returning the prizes to the prize

- ♦ **Green Light Go** – There are 3 wheels on a pole with 1 Red, 1 Yellow, 1 Green space on each wheel. Each wheel is spun and the winning combination is decided. Up to 5 players each time – each player fills their container with 3 balls in the order they think the wheels will stop. The one that matches the wheels wins.
- ♦ **Plinko** – 1 Disc is dropped inside the game and makes its way through a maze of pegs. If the disc lands in the winning slot at the bottom, you win.
- ♦ **Roller Ball** – The player rolls a ball through a series of flappers. If the ball stops behind the last flapper they win. If the ball drops into the trough and rolls back to the beginning, they lose.

When they leave, they get to pick a prize of their choice. **One prize per night.** They may re-enter multiple times but can only win once each night.
- ♦ **Big Dollar Darts** – An **adult** game – needs someone to **run it on Friday night.**
