

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible.



He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end.




Celebrating the Sacraments

CARING + GIVING + SERVING

The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with all of you. -2 Corinthians 13: 13

We celebrate one of the great mysteries of our faith today on the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. During one of his "Wine, Cheese, and the Creed" sessions in 2021, Fr. Alek Schrenk quipped that many of us think when we get to heaven, we will see "an old man, a young man, and a bird." In our human limitation, we have often portrayed the Holy Trinity this way over the centuries.

Although the three persons of the Trinity are one God, we often relate more to one person of the Trinity as we pray. Because each of us has a unique and dynamic relationship with God, I will share a little of my own experience to illustrate this point. When I was a little child, I liked the image of the old man with the regal robes, the strong arms and the long, white beard like Santa Claus that I saw in my prayer book. I heard the message from my parents and my catechists that God made me and loved me. We often included the song, "He's Got the Whole World in His Hands" as a sing-a-long during car trips, and I could imagine that benevolent old man as a giant literally holding the globe.

I vividly recall my father telling me when I was a sensitive nine-year-old to pray to the Holy Spirit for guidance and strength. For most of my life, I felt very connected to the Holy Spirit. I never made a major decision without praying to the Holy Spirit, and I often felt very strong internal movements of the Spirit guiding my actions. When those I love or those for whom I am asked to pray are experiencing physical, emotional, or spiritual difficulty, I invoke the Holy Spirit to give them counsel and fortitude. Even when I write one of these columns, I ask the Holy Spirit for inspiration and words that might move at least one heart a little closer to God. I have been told that many people have difficulty relating to the Holy Spirit, but for me, the Spirit is the person of the Trinity to whom I feel closest.

The incarnate Son of God looked liked us and was like us in all things except sin in his human nature. We have his words in the Gospels and receive his body and blood in the Eucharist. We are reminded of his profound love and sacrifice for us each time we gaze on a crucifix. My personal relationship to the Son was strengthened in middle age, possibly due to increased awareness of physical aches and pains, as well as witnessing the suffering and death of loved ones. Frequent Scripture reading and Eucharistic Adoration helps me to continue growing closer to the person of Jesus Christ.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church describes the Trinity this way:

"We worship one God in the Trinity and the Trinity in unity without either confusing the persons or dividing the substance; for the person of the Father is one, the Son's is another, the Holy Spirit's another; but the Godhead of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit is one, their glory equal, their majesty coeternal." (CCC 266)

St. Teresa of Avila eloquently stated that "The three Persons are distinct from one another; a sublime knowledge is infused into the soul, imbuing it with a certainty of the truth that the Three are of one substance, power, and knowledge and are one God." We can't fully understand the Trinity, but we can trust that our one God lives in a perfect relationship of love and offers that love to us. All we are, all we have, and all the love we will ever know is from our triune God.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, as it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.



A booth chairman is responsible for the running of the game, getting people to help run the game, displaying the prizes, returning the prizes to the prize room at the end of the night and decorating the booth.


WE NEED 7 GAME BOOTH CHAIRMEN TO COMPLETE THE FESTIVAL.






Widowed, Divorced, Separated?
