FROM THE PASTOR



"The Eucharistic celebration is the action of Christ himself and the Church. In it, Christ the Lord, through the ministry of the priest, offers himself, substantially present under the species of bread and wine, to God the Father and gives himself as spiritual food to the faithful united with his offering." (Code of Canon Law, 899)

The reception of the Most Holy Eucharist is truly a privilege for those initiated into the Catholic Church. It is a privilege that requires appropriate preparation. There remains a one-hour fast from food and drink (other than water or medicine) and freedom from any mortal sins that need to be confessed. Reception requires as well, due reverence. If you are accepting the Eucharist into the hand, please be attentive to what you are handling. You are required to place the Sacred Host into your mouth before leaving the Communion distributor. If it is obvious that you are carrying the Eucharist away, you will be stopped and politely reminded to consume the Host before moving further.



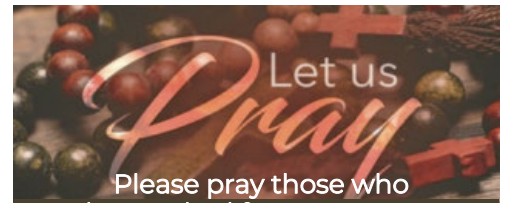

CARING + GIVING + SERVING

"Just as the living Father sent me and I have life because of the Father, so also the one who feeds on me will have life because of me."

- John 6: 57

One of the most popular film depictions of the life of Christ is the 1977 mini-series, "Jesus of Nazareth." In this classic series, a particularly effective example of dramatic license is the depiction of a centurion in two pivotal scenes. Although the episodes are drawn from different Gospels, and there were certainly many centurions in Roman-occupied Jerusalem at the time Jesus lived, the producers chose to imagine the same centurion in these key moments.

The first scene is when a centurion approaches Jesus and asks him to heal his servant. This story is included in both the eighth chapter of Matthew's Gospel and the seventh chapter of Luke's Gospel. Jesus is willing to go, but the centurion tells him that it is not necessary, saying, "Lord, I am not worthy to have you enter under my roof; only say the word and my servant will be healed." (Matthew 8: 8) Jesus praises the great faith of this Gentile, and we know from the Gospels that the servant recovered fully at that moment. The second scene in which we see the centurion is at his post at the cross following the execution of Jesus. Gazing at Jesus drawing his last breath, the centurion states, "Truly this man was the Son of God!" (Mark 15: 39)

Every time we are invited to "Behold the Lamb of God," during the Communion Rite, our response is a modification of the centurion's profession of faith in Matthew's Gospel. We say, "Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed." When the Body of Christ is presented to us, our "Amen" is an affirmation that we truly believe we are receiving the body, blood, soul, and divinity of the Son of God.

On this Feast of Corpus Christi, consider the two lines of the centurion and our responses as we approach Holy Communion. We might pray for the grace to approach Jesus in the Eucharist with humility, awe, and faith like that of the centurion. When we acknowledge our sinfulness and unworthiness, let us be contrite and trust in His mercy. When we say "Amen" before consuming the Sacred Host, may we know in our hearts that truly, this is the Son of God.

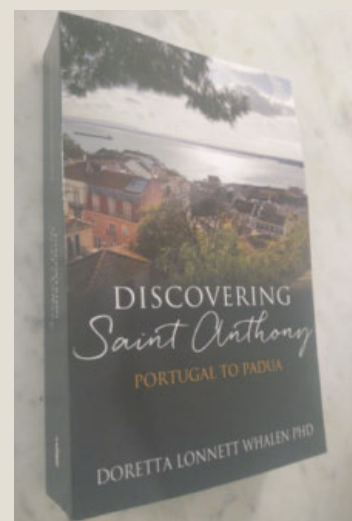

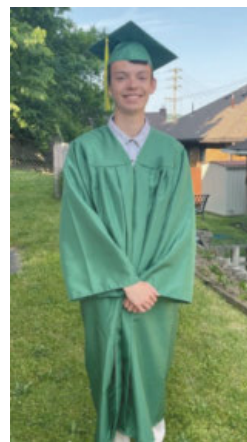

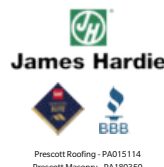
