

PRAYER & WORSHIP

FROM THE PASTOR ——



As I celebrate my thirtieth anniversary of priestly ordination this week, I am not only blatantly aware of God's goodness to me and how I am the recipient of his gracious love and mercy, but also of the many folks who have enriched my priestly existence. Obviously, I am indebted to my parents, Carl and Loretta, who taught me first about Jesus and love for his Church. I am also attentive to those many, many folks in the course of my four assignments who positively challenged as well as supported me. To commemorate those assignments, I asked Father Alek to create for me a "coat of arms."

Typically, in the Church, a coat of arms is most often seen with regard to a Pope, cardinal or bishop; but tradition also allows a simple priest to possess one. Usually, the coat of arms sets a tone for a future ministry (often with a motto). I have taken a slight curve on that and asked for one that would set in history my assignments over the course of these three decades.



The **cross** that divides the shield is a reminder that the Cross of Christ is the source of salvation and is the reason we can and should attend to the altar regularly. For a priest, the altar is the primary "tool" of ministry. In the upper right quadrant, a **bishop's crozier** commemorates my first assignment (1993-98) at St. Titus Parish in Aliquippa. St. Titus was an "overseer" ($\varepsilon\pi\iota\sigma\kappa\sigma\sigma\iota\iota$) or bishop appointed by St. Paul to attend to the Christians on Crete. Within the Crook

of the Crozier is a commemoration of my second assignment, administrative secretary to then-Bishop Donald Wuerl (1998-2005). The Cross in the crook (and the red background) is from the Wuerl coat of arms and also imitates the crosses on the Arms of the Diocese of Pittsburgh. The knobs on the crook number 11, the place that Bishop Wuerl held in the line of Bishops of Pittsburgh. The Sacred Heart in the middle of the shield commemorates my first assignment as a Pastor, Sacred Heart Parish in Shadyside (2005-2018). I have had a personal devotion to the Sacred Heart from childhood and try to regularly promote it. It recognizes that Christ is the center of my ministry, wherever it may occur. The upper left quadrant commemorates my present assignment, Pastor of St Raphael the Archangel parish (2018-). You will recognize the fish and green background are borrowed from our parish coat of arms and a reminder of the healing that St. Raphael provided to Tobit, as well as my important responsibilities to you, my present parish family. The primary colors of the shield are, as Father Alek puts it, "an added bonus and nod to (my) Italian heritage." Above the shield is the traditional priest's galero with the appropriate number of tassels for my place in the hierarchy of the Church.

Please pray for the souls of the faithful departed.

FAITH FORMATION 2023 - 2024

Registration for children in grades K - 8 is now being accepted.

CARING + GIVING + SERVING


Everyone who acknowledges me before others I will acknowledge before my heavenly Father. But whoever denies me before others, I will deny before my heavenly Father. -Matthew 10: 32-33

On Thursday, June 29, the Church observes the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul. These two saints and martyrs quite possibly had the biggest impact on the Church in its foundational years. Through their lives, teachings, and witness, Peter and Paul provide great hope for each of us in our individual spiritual journeys and confidence in the endurance of the Church.

When we meet Peter in the Gospels, he is a fisherman. He often seems to be impulsive in speaking. In his darkest moment, Peter denies Jesus three times during the Passion. Peter weeps bitterly when he realizes his betrayal of Jesus. Following the resurrection, Jesus appears to the apostles and asks Peter three times, "Do you love me?" In this last passage of John's Gospel, Peter confesses his heartfelt love for Jesus Christ. Filled with the Holy Spirit at Pentecost, we see Peter in the Acts of the Apostles speaking confidently and authoritatively as he claims the leadership role envisioned and prophesied to him by Jesus.

Paul, initially named Saul, makes his debut in scripture at the stoning of St. Stephen in chapter 7 of the Acts of the Apostles. Saul is a persecutor of Christian believers. When he has a dramatic encounter with the light of Jesus Christ knocking him to the ground and blinding him in chapter 9 of Acts, we find out that Jesus plans to use him as "a chosen instrument of mine to carry my name before Gentiles, kings, and Israelites." (Acts 9:15). Through Paul's documented travels and numerous epistles, he led, and continues to lead, people to Christ.

In the lives of both great Saints, we see that even when they betrayed and persecuted Christ, he came to them and sought their conversion. Through God's grace, they were both able to be sincerely contrite and to choose to cooperate with God's plan for them. The Lord's plans for Peter and Paul were not easy, but they prioritized their passionate love of Jesus Christ and courageously spread the truth of the Gospel even when subjected to great persecution, and ultimately, death. All Christians owe gratitude for the lives of Peter and Paul who show us that our faithful, loving God never gives up on us.

KEEPING OUR KIDS SAFE

Frequently Asked Questions and Answers by the Pennsylvania Dept. of Human Services, taken from their website found at KeepKidsSafe.pa.gov:

Who needs clearances?

Adults (age 18 and over) applying for a volunteer position with a school, program, club, or service that has direct contact with children (individuals under the age of 18) need clearances. Examples of volunteer positions are, but are not limited to: chaperones, help with Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, event staff where children are involved, hospital volunteers, and many others.

How is direct volunteer contact with children defined?

Direct volunteer contact is defined as the care, supervision, guidance or control AND routine interaction with children. Routine interaction is defined as regular and repeated contact that is integral to the volunteer's responsibilities.

When are clearances needed?

All prospective volunteers must submit clearances to their safe environment coordinator prior to beginning their volunteer service.






