

A Ballad of Flesh and Spirit

"My yoke is easy and my burden is light," says the man hanging from a cross. And if we only went on what we see with our eyes — flesh driven through by nails and sword, swollen from beating and inches from expiration — it would seem like a joke.

I'll tell you something we all know: this life on earth is hard. It's either too long or it's too short. It's frequently painful. It's riddled with problems that seem to make no sense. It is, as Dickens wrote, "made of ever so many partings welded together."

But it's also shockingly, senselessly beautiful. It is full of physical experiences of love, joy, and peace that are so powerful they leave you breathless.

It is both these things — good and bad, hard and wonderful, just as we are both body and soul, spirit and flesh.

No one knows the Father except the Son, who entered into our bodily existence to free us from enslavement to it. No one knows the Son except the Father, and the means by which they know one another — the love passing between them, the Third Person himself — has been shared with us, has made its dwelling within us through baptism.






the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets.







Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest.

-Matthew 11: 28

Every year, I try to make time for a silent retreat weekend. This year, I brought some heavy "baggage" with me to the retreat center. Looking forward to the opportunity for quiet, concerted prayer, I found that I was too upset and restless to pray when I arrived. I am usually drawn immediately to the chapel, but feeling distracted, I chose to begin my retreat in the garden.



To clear my head and refresh my soul, I needed to take a walk. I felt the warm breeze, breathed in fresh air, and

literally grounded myself into calmness with each foot strike on the path. As I looked down to protect my eyes from the bright sun, something caught my eye. It was iridescent and blue. Bending down, I saw that the soft, shiny object on the pavement was a feather, probably from a pigeon or blue jay.

I picked the feather up, admiring its delicate form. Each fine "hair" came together into a graceful plume. Although mostly gray and white, the feather was crowned with a fine line of striking blue. The beautiful detail of this little feather was a reminder of the care that our wondrous God puts into even His most humble, insignificant creations.

This simple feather aided a bird in the incredible act of flight. Having served its most important and noble purpose, even discarded, it was a sign granted.

As I twirled my prize between my thumb and forefinger in the sun, I realized how light it was. I thought of how far it might have journeyed and the challenges its avian owner might have faced finding food, building a nest, and protecting eggs and hatchlings from predators. Once the bird lost this feather, the wind could have blown it any direction and distance.

I allowed this feather to lighten my heart and remind me why I had come to spend time alone with God. He created all of us with great care and attention to detail. He gives us what we need to meet every challenge. Whatever difficulties, sorrows, or anxieties we experience, we need to place them in His hands and know that He will care for us, guide us, and stay with us on our journey until we truly rest in Him.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults

RCIA is the journey by which adults can join the Catholic Church. RCIA takes place within the context of the parish community, and after a suitable period of formation, culminates in the reception of the Sacraments of Initiation—Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation.

Formation is informal and introduces inquirers to several areas: Scripture: The stories of God's people; Teaching: What Catholics Believe; Prayer: How we communicate with God; Liturgy: How the community worships: Mission: How we live out what we believe. RCIA is also suitable for adults who were baptized Catholic, but have not vet received the Sacraments of Eucharist and Confirmation. FAITH FORMATION 2023 - 2024

Registration for children in grades K - 8 is now being accepted.



Faith Formation is for any child who is not enrolled in a Catholic school. A child is to be enrolled in a faith formation program throughout these years to receive formal religious education and faith formation in preparation for reception of the sacraments.

Our Faith Formation program simply could not conduct the religious education and sacramental preparation programs without special individuals to serve as teachers. It is our goal to recruit teachers, substitutes, and aides to fulfill the needs of handing on our faith to the children enrolled in our program.

Are you a PARENT? Parents are the primary evangelists for their children. Serving as a teacher supports all parents' responsibilities for handing on the faith.

Are you SINGLE? What a wonderful way to develop unique relationships with young people.

Are you BUSY WORKING? The powerful witness of the priority you give your faith speaks volumes to the young people you would serve and to your own family.

Are you a GRANDPARENT? Stay connected with the vitality of youth while handing on the faith.

KFFPING OUR KIDS SAFF

Many times people ask the following questions: *Why do I have to get my clearances?*

I never had to have clearances before: why now? (Actually, yes you did!)

Can't I be "grandfathered in"? (No one is grandfathered in).

You know me —I never did anything to anyone—why do I have to get clearances? (You have to get them because you are a volunteer.)

All I do is ______ (fill in the blank: put fish on a dish, count money, take out garbage, pass out water, assemble food items, etc., etc., etc.). Why do I have to get clearances?

The answer is simple: ALL VOLUNTEERS MUST HAVE CLEARANCES.

This is a mandate from the State of Pennsylvania and the Diocese of Pittsburgh. This is not new; in fact, most long-time volunteers in our system have documents dating as far back as 2003.

Other states and even foreign countries have similar requirements, and sometimes all or most are transferable.

The first step to become a volunteer is to obtain clearances.
