MANIFESTING THE KINGDOM

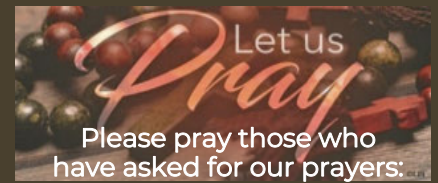

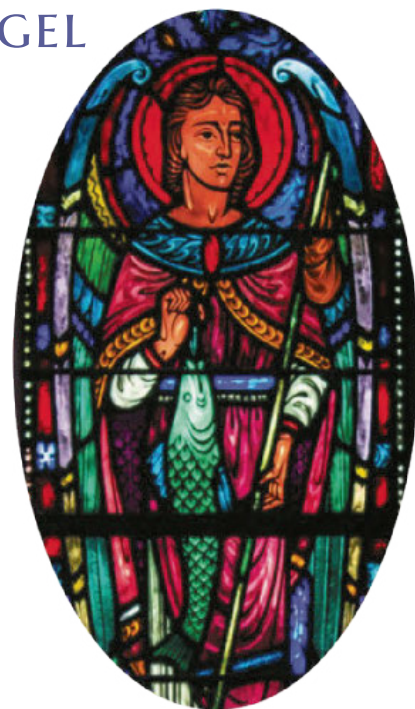
NOVENA TO ST. RAPHAEL THE ARCHANGEL

For the nine weeks leading up to our parish Patronal Feast on September 29, we will be praying a Novena to St. Raphael the Archangel. We invite those in attendance to pray the Novena following our Masses on Wednesday. The Novena will be included in the bulletin each week so that all parishioners can pray the Novena with their families or privately.

Novenas are a popular Catholic Devotion in which prayers are recited for successive days or weeks; nine days or weeks is most common to replicate the nine days the Blessed Mother and Apostles prayed between Ascension Thursday and Pentecost Sunday. Sincere praying of Novenas can help to foster discipline, patience, and perseverance in prayer.

During each week, an intention based on the patronages of St. Raphael the Archangel and his actions recorded in Scripture will be recommended and remembered in our communal prayer of the Novena. We encourage all parishioners to pray for these intentions and to include any private intentions for which they request the intercession of our parish patron. Among the causes for which St. Raphael is patron are travelers, healing, people with blindness and afflictions of the eyes, medical professionals, young people, Christian marriage, and happy meetings.

CARING + GIVING + SERVING

My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord;
my spirit rejoices in God my Savior
for he has looked with favor on his lowly servant.

In today's Gospel from St. Matthew (14:22-33), we hear the episode of Jesus walking on the water. Jesus said, "Do not be afraid" and invited Peter to come to him, but Peter succumbed to fear and doubt as he approached Jesus. Of course, Jesus did not allow Peter to drown, but reached out to save him despite the limits of Peter's faith.



On Tuesday, August 15, we celebrate the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. The words from Luke's Gospel above are the opening verses of the Magnificat, or the Canticum of Mary. As we pray these words, we can sense the trust Mary has in the constant love, faithfulness, and power of God. We also can imagine her joy as she anticipates the birth of Jesus, and her awe in being part of God's plan for salvation for the whole human race.

As Christian pilgrims, most of us have periods of both doubt and faith on our journeys. Sometimes we, like Peter, fall short of trust in God and find our spirits sinking when we encounter frightening situations. At times like this, we can be grateful that our Lord has patience with us and is always ready to reach out to welcome us back with love and mercy. When life is challenging, we can pray to have Peter's humility to ask Jesus to save us. Perhaps if we make it a habit to seek blessings even in trying situations and to thank God for all that he does for us, we can more closely imitate Mary's model of perfect trust and joy.

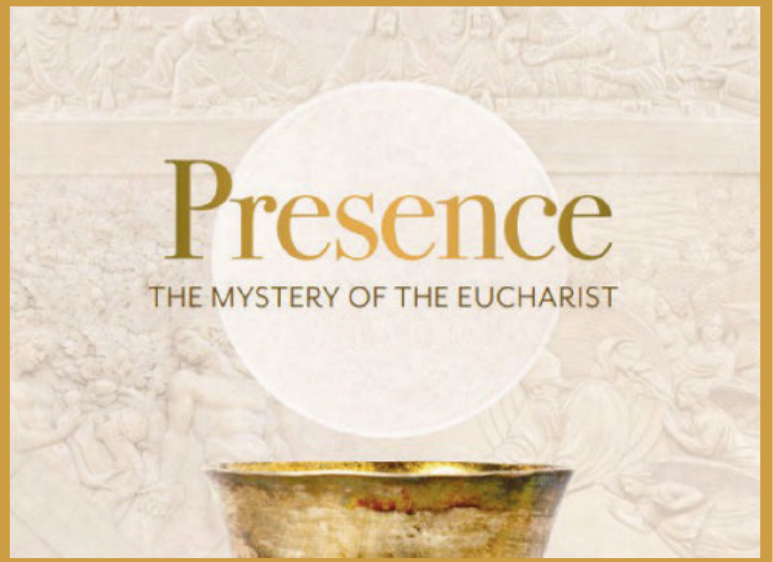

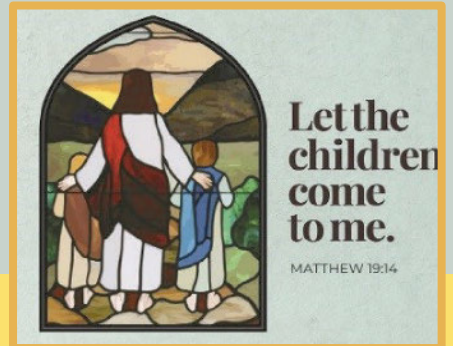

RCIA

(Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults)

The Rite of Christian initiation is designed for adults who, after hearing the mystery of Christ proclaimed, consciously and freely seek the living God and enter the way of faith and conversion as the Holy Spirit opens their hearts. Formation and spiritual conversion are the heart of RCIA. Simply having knowledge of Christ's teachings is not enough. By God's help you will be strengthened spiritually during your preparation and at the proper time will receive the sacraments fruitfully.

RCIA at the Parish of Saint Raphael the Archangel prepares those who have not been baptized, those who have been baptized in other church traditions, or those who have been baptized Catholic, but have not been instructed in the Catholic faith and desire full initiation into the Catholic Church.

The RCIA journey has a two-fold purpose. The first is to learn how the Catholic Church combines Sacred Scripture, Church teachings, and Church traditions to form a rich environment that challenges each of us into a personal encounter with our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. Secondly, each person is prepared for the reception of the Sacraments of Christian initiation: Baptism (if needed), Confirmation, and Eucharist.

The Disciple Maker Index Survey Results are Coming

As you recall, the Disciple Maker Index Survey closed on March 31, 2023, and due to the great volume of information gathered, all of our parish leaders have been and continue to review the results. In next week's bulletin, you will see a one-page parish summary report that will provide information such as:

- How many parishioners completed the survey and the overall response rate
- Key parish strengths and opportunities for growth
- Summary of key responses

These results will enable parish Envisioning Teams, our pastoral planning leadership body, to begin the work of pastoral planning. The information will be repeated in the bulletin for the next two weeks to reach as many of our parishioners as possible during the summer travel season. In addition, stay tuned for a Diocesan summary report to be released the weekend of August 26/27 that will show a snapshot of the DMI Survey results for the entire Diocese of Pittsburgh.

KEEPING OUR KIDS SAFE

A question frequently asked is "How much do clearances cost?" The answer may surprise you!

A PA Child Abuse History Clearance is at NO cost for a volunteer.

A charge of \$13 is needed for a parish/school employee for this BUT is paid by the parish.

A PA State Police Criminal History Clearance has no cost.

There is no cost to a parish/school volunteer or an employee to complete the *Protecting God's Children* classes or to complete the *Mandated Reporter Class* through the University of Pittsburgh.

If you have not been a resident of PA for the past ten consecutive years, you are required to obtain an FBI fingerprint clearance. This has a cost of \$22.60 for parish/school volunteers and \$23.85 for employees, which will be reimbursed to you when a receipt and the fingerprint report is presented to the Safe Environment Coordinator; in other words, no cost to you.

So if you think that you may not be able to afford to obtain your clearances—NO WORRIES!!!

All documents and classes may be obtained and completed at NO COST!

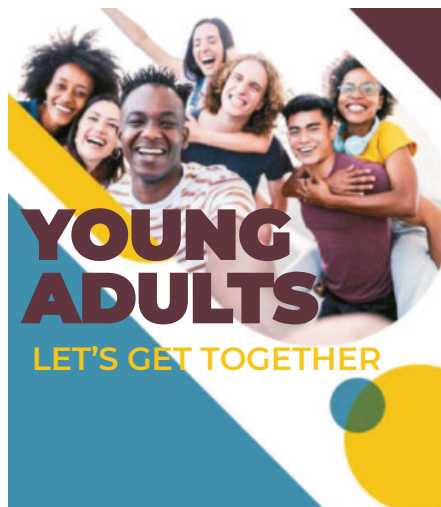
