#### FROM THE PASTOR -

"Let justice descend, O heavens, like dew from above, like gentle rain let the skies drop it down. Let the earth open and salvation bud forth; let justice also spring up! I, the Lord, have created this."

-Isaiah 45:8

"The blessing of the "Bambinelli" [Baby Jesus figurines] as they are called in Rome, reminds us that the crib is a **school of life** where we can learn the

secret of true joy. This does not consist in having many things but in feeling loved by the Lord, in giving oneself as a gift for others and in loving one another. Let us look at the crib. Our Lady and St. Joseph do not seem to be a very fortunate family; their first child was born in the midst of great hardship; yet they are full of deep joy, because they love each other, they help each other and, especially, they are certain that God, who made himself present in the little Jesus, is at work in their story" (Pope Benedict XVI, Angelus/ December, 2009).

#### ANNIVERSARY BLESSINGS THIS WEEKEND




#### PENITENTIAL RITE

They asked him,

and the life of the world to come. Amen.







#### Third Week of Advent: Jov

As we continue our Advent preparation, we have been focusing on a theme each week. We began the season heeding the call to readiness with the theme Watch, Listen, and Commit. After attending to the call to be prepared, we focused on taking action to Repent. This week, our theme is given to us by the liturgical calendar. Today, the third Sunday of Advent, is Gaudete Sunday. Gaudete means Joy!



When we feel good about our mission and prepare ourselves well, joy flows naturally from our hearts. It is enjoyable to welcome guests to a home that is clean, orderly, and to a meal that is prepared in a timely fashion so that we can savor our visit with our guests. On the other hand, when we are rushing to run the vacuum cleaner, dust the cobwebs, and conceal the piles of junk mail from the dining room table in the spare room while figuring out how to make sure the main course will be out of the oven on time, we have anxiety and embarrassment. If we are prepared to greet our Lord, we will know joy beyond anything we can imagine when we come into his light. If we are unprepared, we face the possibility of being left outside and away from his presence like the foolish bridesmaids in Matthew's Gospel (Matthew 25: 1-13).

Joy is an emotion that is difficult to conceal, and joy is very attractive to others. We might consider if our joy is evident to others when we come to Mass. If our neighbors see us leaving the house, are we dressed in our "Sunday best," and appearing as excited to go to Mass as we would if we were going to a concert or sporting event? When we get out of our cars, do we smile and greet the other parishioners in the parking lot? Do we use our voices to praise God in song and respond audibly and enthusiastically to the prayers at Mass?


As we prepare to commemorate the arrival of Baby Jesus, are we decorating, writing cards, baking, shopping, and wrapping gifts with love and joy in our hearts, or just doing these things out of obligation and creating unnecessary stress? Are we including acts of charity in our preparations? Have we been lighting an Advent wreath and praying special prayers with our family throughout this beautiful season? If not, rejoice! There is still a full week of Advent remaining to prepare our hearts.


Opłatki is now available at the Parish Administration Center for \$4.00 a package, while supplies last.

Opłatki, pronounced o-pwaht-kee, is a Christmas tradition that originated in Poland. The word Opłatki means "Angel Bread." There are three white wafers and one pink wafer, imprinted with beautiful Christmas images, in each package. The white are to be used by the humans in the family and the pink are for the family pet(s).

The Opłatki are enjoyed by families, typically right before the Christmas Eve meal. The entire family will gather around the table with the Opłatki. Generally the eldest member of the family will begin the ritual by

breaking off a piece of the wafer and passing it to another family member with a blessing. This blessing can simply consist of what you desire for your loved one in the upcoming year – whether it be good health, success, or happiness. The purpose of this act is primarily to express one's unconditional love and forgiveness for each member of his or her family.



- Harbor Light Mission part of Salvation Armylong-term residential treatment program for adult men with substance use disorders

Thank you so much to all who contributed their time and resources to enable us to get all these warm beautiful blankets out to these facilities. I am sure we can't even know how much they are appreciated by the recipients. These blankets feel like a warm hug!

#### **Testimony**

When my grandmother heard the news that my cousin had fallen from a second-story window, she immediately went and washed her hair.

Grandma had been sitting alone in her house, listening to the morning radio when the announcer shared a news bulletin stating that the previous night, a little boy with the same name as her grandson, living in the same community and of the same age, had fallen onto the pavement from a window on the second floor of his house. He had been rushed to the hospital but miraculously survived his injuries.

She thought she was hallucinating and wanted to look pretty when the "men in white coats" came to take her away. Thus, the hair-washing.

As it happens, the whole story was true — it was her grandson, but this was before the age of mobile phones and had happened so late at night that his parents had been unable to notify any family members before the whole thing showed up on the news.

It wasn't until my grandmother received a phone call from another relative corroborating the story that she realized it hadn't been a figment of her imagination. What a waste of styled hair, no hospital committal for her that day.

There are certain truths that we cannot accept unless they are supported by the testimony of others. We find them to be unbelievable without the reassurance of another person whispering, "It's okay. I see it, too."

This is the value of testimony, and the purpose of John the Baptist and every saint who ever died with the name of Jesus Christ on their lips. And this is the sacred duty of all the baptized, to give testimony with our words and our actions.

# Why do we do that? Catholic Life Explained

#### Question:

Why do Catholics give the sign of peace to one another at Mass?

#### Answer:

The sign of peace is a part of the Mass that takes place immediately after we offer the Lord's Prayer. Inspired by the Jesus' words to his first followers, we stand together in a spirit of communion to pray as Jesus taught us: "Our Father who art in heaven..." In this prayer, we call for the coming of God's kingdom in all its fullness and ask that God provides for our needs — "Give us, this day, our daily bread" — to forgive our sins and to bring us to the joy of heaven.

It is almost natural, then, that the rite of peace would follow. As the celebrant prays that Christ's peace will fill our hearts, our communities, the Church, and the whole world, we extend to those around us a sign of peace (usually a hug or a handshake) as a symbol of the communion that we experience now and will experience forever in the fullness of the reign of God.

We are also reminded of Jesus' teachings that if we are at prayer and remember that a brother or sister is holding something against us, then we are to go and seek reconciliation with them before we continue our prayer (see Matthew 5:23). And so, the sign of peace also reminds us of the need to truly be in communion — united in love and peace — with God and one another before we approach the altar to receive the Eucharist.

So, the next time you're at Mass and the time comes for the sign of peace, remember that this is a moment to celebrate the gift of Christ's peace that each of us has received from God and to pass that peace along to those around us. We need this moment to practice, because this is also the same peace of Christ that we are instructed to carry out into the world at the end of Mass when the priest or deacon says to us, "Go, in peace, glorifying the Lord by your life."

#### GUIDELINES FOR THE RECEPTION OF COMMUNION

#### For Catholics

As Catholics, we fully participate in the celebration of the Eucharist when we receive Holy Communion. We are encouraged to receive Communion devoutly and frequently. In order to be properly disposed to receive Communion, participants should not be conscious of grave sin and normally should have fasted for one hour. A person who is conscious of grave sin is not to receive the Body and Blood of the Lord without prior sacramental confession except for a grave reason where there is no opportunity for confession. In this case, the person is to be mindful of the obligation to make an act of perfect contrition, including the intention of confessing as soon as possible (canon 916). A frequent reception of the Sacrament of Penance is encouraged for all.

#### For our fellow Christians

We welcome our fellow Christians to this celebration of the Eucharist as our brothers and sisters. We pray that our common baptism and the action of the Holy Spirit in this Eucharist will draw us closer to one another and begin to dispel the sad divisions which separate us. We pray that these will lessen and finally disappear, in keeping with Christ's prayer for us "that they may all be one" (Jn 17:21).

Because Catholics believe that the celebration of the Eucharist is a sign of the reality of the oneness of faith, life, and worship, members of those churches with whom we are not yet fully united are ordinarily not admitted to Holy Communion. Eucharistic sharing in exceptional circumstances by other Christians requires permission according to the directives of the diocesan bishop and the provisions of canon law (canon 844 §4). Members of the Orthodox Churches, the Assyrian Church of the East, and the Polish National Catholic Church are urged to respect the discipline of their own Churches. According to Roman Catholic discipline, the Code of Canon Law does not object to the reception of Communion by Christians of these Churches (canon 844 §3).

#### For those not receiving Holy Communion

All who are not receiving Holy Communion are encouraged to express in their hearts a prayerful desire for unity with the Lord Jesus and with one another.

#### For non-Christians

We also welcome to this celebration those who do not share our faith in Jesus Christ. While we cannot admit them to Holy Communion, we ask them to offer their prayers for the peace and the unity of the human family.




