

- FROM THE PASTOR -

"Christ is always present to his Church, especially in the actions of the liturgy. He is present in the sacrifice of the Mass, in the person of the minister (it is the same Christ who formerly

offered himself on the cross that now offers by the ministry of priests) and most of all under the eucharistic species. He is present in the sacraments by his power, in such a way that when someone baptizes, Christ himself baptizes. He is present in his word, for it is he himself who speaks when the holy Scriptures are read in the Church. Finally, he is present when the Church prays and sings, for he himself promised: Where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there in their midst." (Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy, Vatican Council III)

The annual observance of "Catholic Schools Week" begins this weekend. We are truly proud of the accomplishments of both the community at Guardian Angel Academy (under the administration of Mr. Rob Munz) and that of the Saint Raphael the Archangel Preschool (under the direction of Mrs. Trisha Costantino).

Traditionally the Church honors St. Blaise, bishop and martyr on February 3. He is closely associated with the sacramental blessing of the throats. The blessing will take place of the final blessing for all in attendance at the weekend Masses.

The re-opening of Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton Church will take place next weekend with the celebration of Mass at 4:30 p.m. With that Mass we begin the use of the regular Mass schedule that was in force prior to the restoration work. Please be attentive to that schedule beginning next weekend. I am grateful to Mr. Tim Castello, parish facilities manager, for his oversight of the project and Mr. Tim Thorsen, parish business manager, for his regular association with the property and planning, and insurance offices of the Diocese of Pittsburgh during the whole process.

You will notice next weekend that the tabernacle being used temporarily at Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton Church is an old one from Saint Luke Church. A very generous donor has provided funding for the restoration of the tabernacle that usually serves as the "house of the Lord" in that church. I am truly grateful to the donor and look forward to the beautifully restored tabernacle to return for our use in the Spring.




PENITENTIAL RITE

PROFESSION OF FAITH


I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible.

I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.







CARING + GIVING + SERVING

Brothers and sisters: I should like you to be free of anxieties.

-1 Corinthians 7: 32-35



This winter is colder and snowier that the last couple of winters. Such conditions trigger much anxiety. School administrators need to decide whether to delay or cancel a day of instruction. Families need to make arrangements for childcare or parents need to call off work. People circle grocery store parking lots in their cars hoping to find a space before the bread, milk, and toilet paper are sold out. Just hearing a bad weather report seems to put everyone on high alert, especially regarding the safety of travel.

Last Friday, the snow plows were out early and often, and by late afternoon, the roads were clear. I had to drive about ten miles for an important errand and found myself at the five-mile mark in a sudden, blinding snow squall I had not heard predicted. The roads were quicky and completely covered, and visibility was severely diminished. It had been a long time since I drove in such poor conditions, and my knuckles were white from tightly clenching the wheel. When I reached my destination, I accomplished what I needed to do, then realized that the drive home would be no better. I took a deep breath and asked my Guardian Angel and St. Raphael to guide me home safely and to protect all the drivers on the road. It was a tense journey, but praying and placing my trust in the Lord and his angels made a difference. My own anxiety lifted, and I noticed that most drivers were exercising necessary caution.

My driving episode and the quote above from today's Second Reading brought a famous saying of St. Pio of Pietrelcina (Padre Pio) to mind: "Pray, hope, and don't worry." This practice can serve us well in any stressful circumstance. When worldly concerns distract us from our practice of prayer, it is very easy to lose hope and trust in God. If, however, we make a regular practice of prayer, even the most grave situations become more bearable. I met a man in a nursing home who had a recurrence of an aggressive brain tumor. Across from his bed, he had a plaque that read, "Thy Will be done." He told me that he lived by these words from the Lord's Prayer throughout his years of dealing with several brain surgeries. He accepted that he might be nearing death, and even when his condition deteriorated, this man seemed completely at peace. On September 11, 2001, the passengers on Flight 93 who sacrificed their lives to keep the plane from doing greater harm and destruction, were heard on the airphone reciting Psalm 23 in the midst of a terrifying circumstance.

When winter weather limits our ability or desire to leave our homes, let's be grateful for more quiet time to pray, read Scripture, and grow in trust of the Lord.

Altar Server

As early as the second century, altar servers have assisted the priests and deacons during Mass, Stations of the Cross, and other liturgical ceremonies so that they can be conducted with grace and reverence. In addition to the adults who help with this special ministry at daily Mass, funerals, and other occasions, we want to develop a core group of children and teens who the Lord is calling to participate more closely at the altar for weekend liturgies and other solemn times.

Requirements to be an altar server:

- -Be a registered parishioner and attend Mass regularly
- -Have been baptized and received First Holy Communion
- -Be in the fourth grade or older and able to carry out their responsibilities
- -Enrolled in the Faith Formation Program or attend a Catholic School

Parents of interested children and teens should register to attend one of the two introductory sessions via the sign up on our parish website. Interested kids (and their parents) can attend at either location regardless of where they attend Mass most often.



HEARING LOOP

at St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Church

Digital hearing aids have significantly improved in the last decade, but they do not restore hearing to normal. Difficulties often remain when in challenging listening situations. Hearing loops help hearing aid users overcome this problem by broadcasting sound directly to the hearing aid without background noise.

If you wear hearing instruments you will need to find out if your hearing aids have the wireless receiver called a T-coil or Telecoil in order to hear better with the hearing loops in the church.

Look for the Hearing Loop brochure at the church, or talk to your audiologist.

Headset receivers will still be available for those without T-coil hearing aids.
