A reminder that Ash Wednesday occurs on Valentines Day, February 14, this year. There are no dispensations from the required fasting and abstinence of that day (based on age and health). *See pages 12 and 13 for the Lenten regulations and the Lenten schedule.*

Be sure to pick up a copy of "The Word Among Us" devotional for the season of Lent. The daily readings are included in these books and will be very helpful for daily Lenten reflections.

You have received in the mail from me (yes, really from ME) the notification of the 2024 Annual Parish Appeal (formerly Parish Share). The assessed goal for this year is \$278,987 (same as last year). You may remember from last year that under the new directions, the program requires a "cap" on the amount of money retained and not assessed. Although we do retain here all of the money received over and above the assessment, only the first 10% in excess will remain unassessed. We ended last year's appeal with an excess of \$214,615! I am so grateful to all who contributed to make the goal of the past year's appeal, and I am confident that they will step forward with the same generosity this year. Hopefully those who did not assist with reaching the goal will do so in 2024.



CARING + GIVING + SERVING

He cured many who were sick with various diseases,
and he drove out many demons. -Mark 1: 34

In Mark's Gospel today, we find Jesus busily engaging in his ministry of healing. It is this ministry of Jesus throughout the Gospels that is the origin of the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. Other scriptural foundations of the Sacrament include the commissioning of the apostles to cure people (Mark 6: 13) and the recommendation to the sick in the Letter of James to ask the presbyters (priests) to pray over them and "anoint them with oil in the name of the Lord (James 5: 13-15)."

Soon the Care Ministry office will be mailing out letters from Fr. Grecco to the homebound members of our parish. These letters are invitations to have one of our priests visit during the Lent or Easter Season for reception of Sacraments, including Anointing of the Sick. At this time, we will take the opportunity to clarify some misunderstandings about this beautiful Sacrament.

Often, we receive calls at the parish requesting a priest for "last rites" for someone who is close to death. Through the long, rich history and tradition of the Church, the anointing of the sick became associated exclusively with the dying in the early church where severe periods of penance were imposed and individuals could not be anointed until the completion of penance, which was often just before death. The sacrament continued to be associated with the dying and was referred to as "last rites" or "extreme unction" until the Second Vatican Council.

Vatican II restored the understanding that the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is intended to provide healing, strength, comfort, and peace to those who are sick and to recognize in their suffering, the passion of Christ and hope for the resurrection. Ideally, a person has the opportunity for reconciliation beforehand, and receives Eucharist as their last sacrament, or "food for the journey" prior to death. Reception of this Sacrament is healing and peaceful, and should not be feared or associated with imminent death. Most of us realize that the longer we live, the greater our chances of illness occurring and the closer we move toward our eventual death. Those who are of advanced age, even in good health, should therefore not put off reception of Anointing of the Sick.

When, then, should people be anointed? Ideally, as soon as one receives a serious medical diagnosis; when reaching advanced age; when anticipating surgery; or when first recommended for hospice care. The Sacrament can be administered in the case of sudden or tragic illness or injury as long as the individual is still alive. Optimally, the recipient of the Sacrament is conscious and able to understand and benefit from the healing effects of the Sacrament as well as being able to confess and swallow Holy Communion. This Sacrament can be received more than once. In the reality we face of fewer priests, it is increasingly urgent to receive the Sacrament at the initial point of serious illness or advanced age when one is possibly in danger of death, and not to wait until just before death. If admitted to a hospital or nursing home, please ask the nursing staff to contact the Catholic chaplain or priest on call for that facility. Contact the parish office at 412-857-5356, ext. 431 or one of our priests to arrange to receive this Sacrament if able to come to the Church or office or homebound. It is always our desire to meet the sacramental needs of our parishioners, particularly those undergoing difficult circumstances.

LENTEN REGULATIONS

1. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fast and abstinence. The Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence in the United States.
2. **The obligation of abstinence (refraining from eating meat) begins at the age of 14. The law of fasting (limiting oneself to one full meal and two lighter meals) obliges all between the ages of 18 and 59.** No one should consider this obligation lightly.
3. Those individuals who have a medical condition in which fasting may be considered harmful are not obliged to fast, but should perform some other act of penance or charity.
4. Pastors and parents are to see to it that minors, though not bound by the law of fast and abstinence, are educated in the authentic sense of penance and encouraged to do acts of penance suitable to their age.
6. All members of the Christian Faithful are encouraged to do acts of penance and charity during the Lenten season beyond what is prescribed by the law.
7. As a general rule, a request for a dispensation from the obligation of abstinence on Fridays of Lent will not be considered unless some serious reason is present. The attendance at social events, banquets, wedding rehearsals or receptions, or funeral wakes is not considered sufficient reason to request a dispensation.

HEARING LOOP

at St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Church

Digital hearing aids have significantly improved in the last decade, but they do not restore hearing to normal. Difficulties often remain when in challenging listening situations. Hearing loops help hearing aid users overcome this problem by broadcasting sound directly to the hearing aid without background noise.

If you wear hearing instruments you will need to find out if your hearing aids have the wireless receiver called a T-coil or Telecoil in order to hear better with the hearing loops in the church.


Look for the Hearing Loop brochure at the church, or talk to your audiologist.

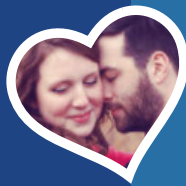
