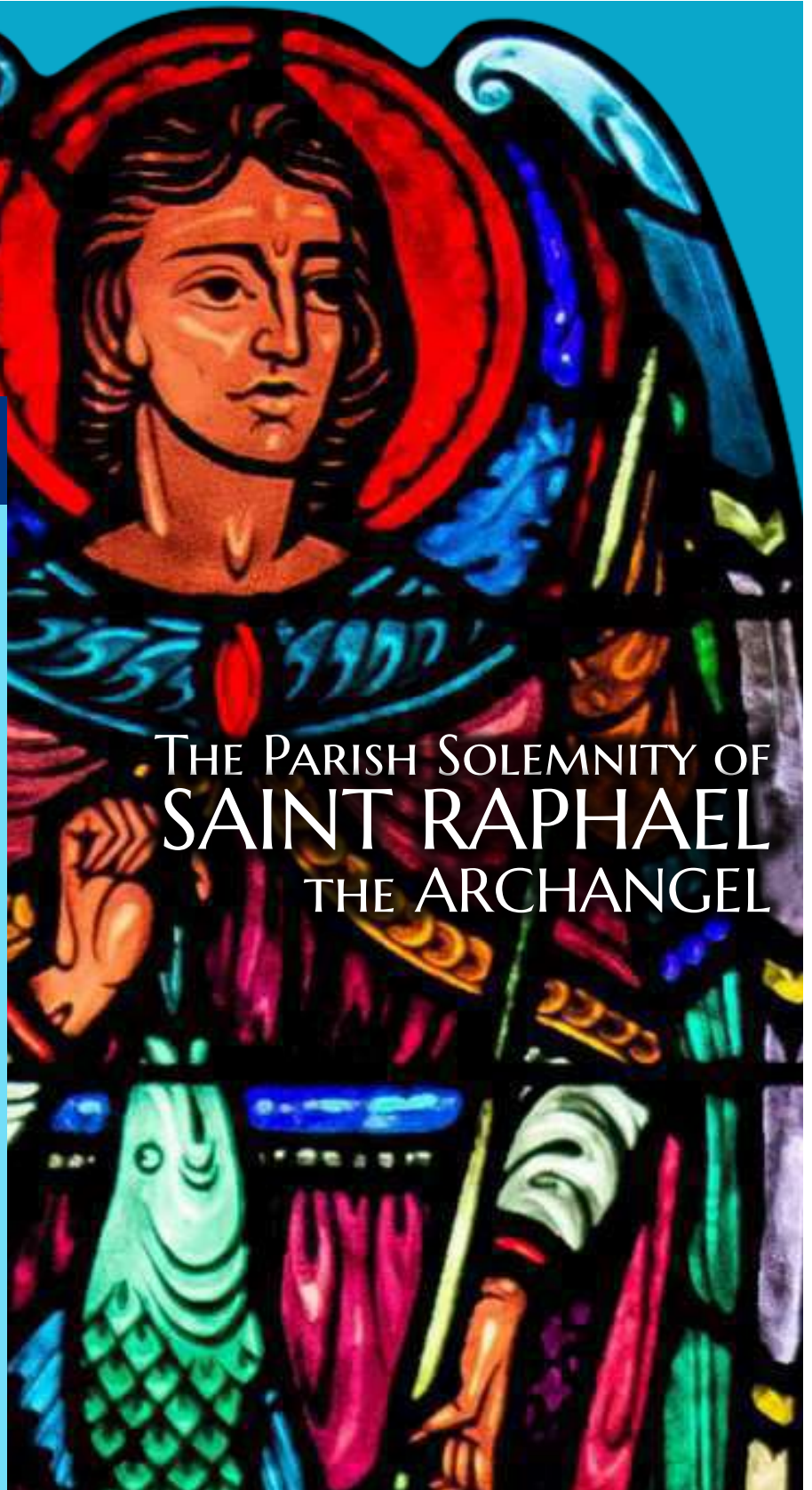

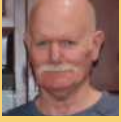

Raphael said to Tobiah before he reached his father: "I am certain that his eyes will be opened. Smear the fish gall on them. This medicine will make the cataracts shrink and peel off from his eyes; then your father will again be able to see the light of day." Then Anna ran up to her son, threw her arms around him, and said to him, "Now that I have seen you again, son, I am ready to die!" And she sobbed aloud. Tobit got up and stumbled out through the courtyard gate. Tobiah went up to him with the fish gall in his hand, and holding him firmly, blew into his eyes.

"Courage, father," he said. Next he smeared the medicine on his eyes, and it made them smart. Then, beginning at the corners of Tobit's eyes, Tobiah used both hands to peel off the cataracts. When Tobit saw his son, he threw his arms around him and wept. He exclaimed, "I can see you, son, the light of my eyes!" Then he said: "Blessed be God, and praised be his great name, and blessed be all his holy angels. May his holy name be praised throughout all the ages, Because it was he who scourged me, and it is he who has had mercy on me. Behold, I now see my son Tobiah!"

Then Tobit went back in, rejoicing and praising God with full voice for everything that had happened. Tobiah told his father that the Lord God had granted him a successful journey; that he had brought back the money; and that he had married Raguel's daughter Sarah, who would arrive shortly, for she was approaching the gate of Nineveh. As we celebrate our Patronal Feast this weekend, we give thanks for God's blessings on our parish, and we honor St. Raphael the Archangel. We have a group in the parish that bears our patron's name: "Raphael's Ramblers," our parish walking group. When our parish was newly established in 2021 and we were still coming out of a pandemic, the Ramblers were formed as a way to gather people, promote health, and invoke the name and intercession of Archangel Raphael.

"I can go with him, for I know all the routes. I have often traveled to Media and crossed all its plains and mountains; so I know every road well."

- Tobit 5:10

When Tobit sought a guide to accompany his young son, Tobias, on a long journey, St. Raphael the Archangel appeared in disguise and offered to lead the young man. Archangel Raphael is the patron of travelers on land, sea, or air. As a walking companion, he is the natural patron for our walking group. One of our Ramblers stated, "Walking can get a bit lonely!" She is one of our fast walkers, but is grateful to slow down and have people to talk with when she becomes tired.

"Greetings to you too, brothers! Good health to you, and welcome!"

- Tobit 7:1

St. Raphael the Archangel guided young Tobias to the home of his cousin where they were received with the warm, joyful salutation quoted above. St. Raphael is the patron of happy meetings, and the Ramblers group has been faithful to this attribute. One of the regular Ramblers stated that she tries to walk with different people each week to learn their stories. She described Raphael's Ramblers as "a bit like the TV show, 'Cheers,' because we are always happy to see each other and miss the ones who are not there."

"As regards to the fish's heart and liver, if you burn them so that the smoke surrounds a man or a woman who is afflicted by a demon or evil spirit, the affliction will leave him completely, ... and as for the gall, if you rub it on the eyes of a man who has cataracts, blowing into his eyes, right on the cataracts, his sight will be restored." - Tobit 6:8-9

Archangel Raphael's instructions allowed Tobias to heal his bride of demonic possession and his father of blindness. Raphael's Ramblers enjoy the health benefits of fresh air and exercise. A couple who regularly walks with the group noted that "the time goes fast as we walk and talk."

"I am Raphael, one of the seven angels who enter and serve before the Glory of the Lord." - Tobit 12:15

Raphael's Ramblers begin every walk with the prayer asking St. Raphael to intercede for our physical and spiritual health. We also end every walk with prayer as we gather around the Marian shrine in the Ss. Simon and Jude parking lot. One of our Ramblers noted that she did not think to incorporate prayer in her solitary walks.

With this week's Feast of St. Raphael comes the end of our evening walks for the year. However, Raphael's Ramblers will have one weekend walk each month until the spring. Watch the bulletin for dates, and know that all are welcome to any of these walks. St. Raphael the Archangel, Pray for us!

Missa Sancti Raphaelis, MH87/111

Composed by Johann Michael Haydn (1737-1806)

Johann Michael Haydn, often known by Michael Haydn, was the younger brother of the famous Austrian-Hungarian composer Franz Joseph Haydn. Ernst Ludwig Gerber (1746-1819), a noted German musician who wrote a famous dictionary of musicians ["Neues historisch-biographisches Lexikon der Tonkünstler"], wrote about J.M. Haydn, "The degree of artistry in his sacred music can be measured by the fact that both his brother and Mozart recognized in him a master of the genre." During J.M. Haydn's 43 years of working in Salzburg, he built a bridge from early Classicism to musical Biedermeier. His church music was characterized by his knowledge of liturgical function and the musical realization of sacred texts. He composed more than thirty Masses, including three Masses for the Archangels: Michael, Gabriel, and Raphael. Missa Sancti Raphaelis was written between 1765-1768 and its first performance at St. Peter Benedictine Abbey Church, a neighboring church to the Salzburger Dom (Cathedral in Salzburg) on the feast day of St. Virgilius, 27 November 1768, which was a Sunday that year and was lavishly celebrated, as St. Virgilius was not only a bishop of Salzburg, but also was the Abbot of the Benedictine Abbey of St. Peter's Abbey. The musical style of this Mass is "missa brevis et solemnitas," a term meaning "short and solemn" and was coined by Mozart in 1776 in a letter as a reference to the Archbishop of Salzburg Hieronymus Colloredo (1732-1812).

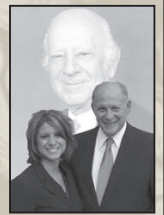

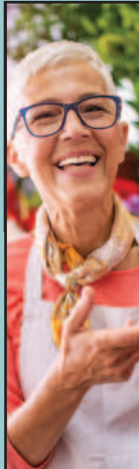
