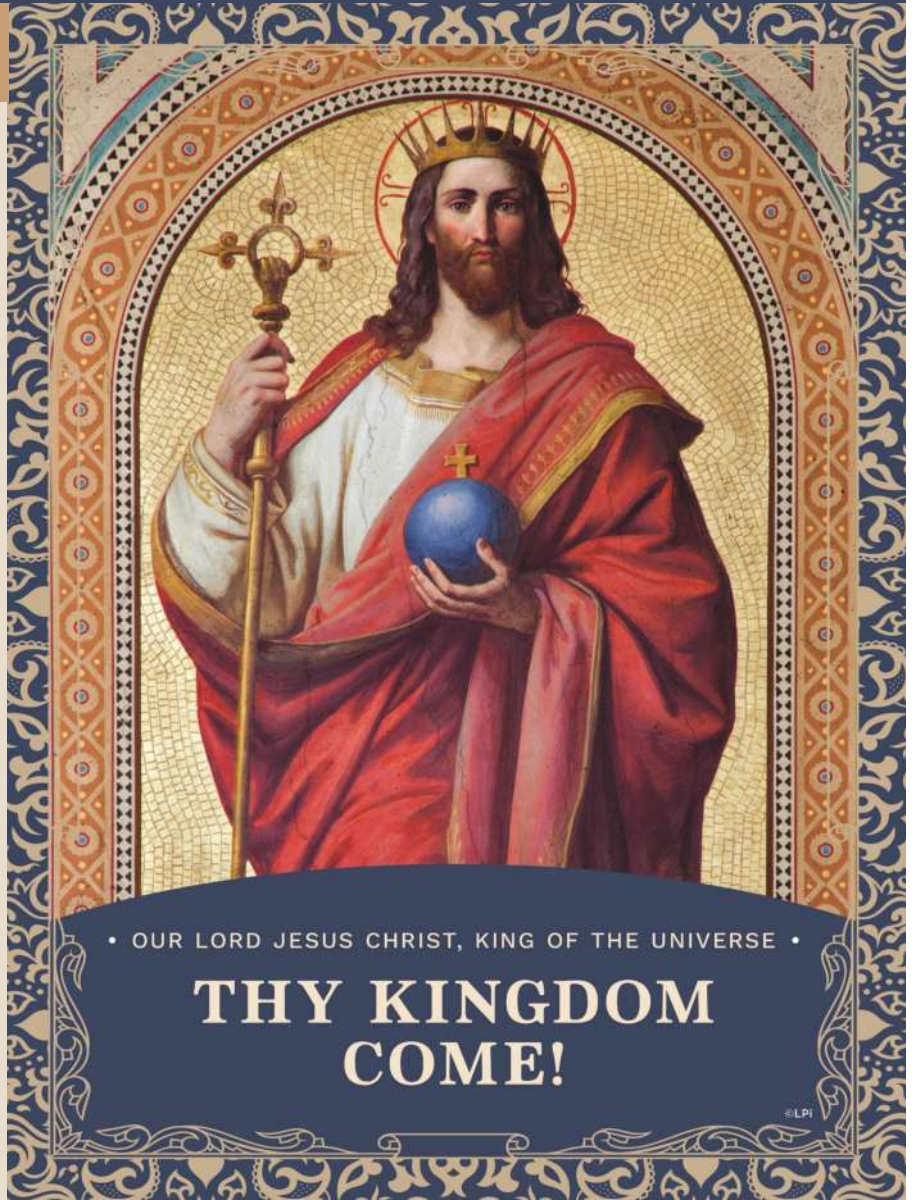

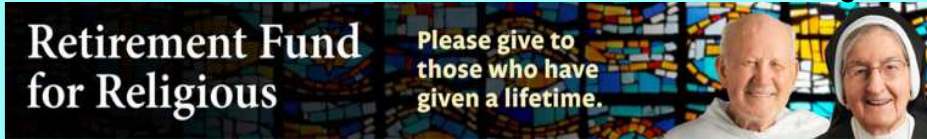

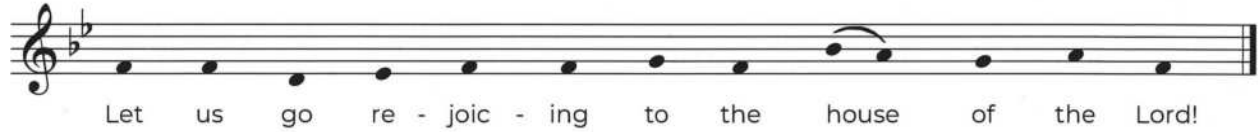
FIRST READING | 2 SAMUEL 5:1-3

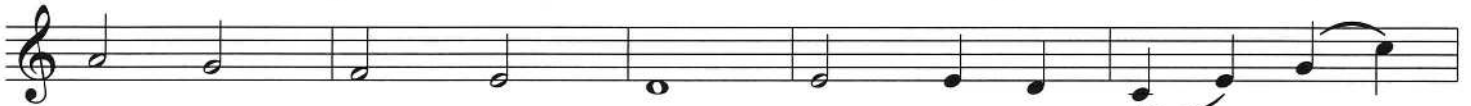



CARING + GIVING + SERVING

He is before all things, and in him all things hold together. -Colossians 1:17

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. The feast of Christ the King helps to draw our attention to the almighty power, steady justice, and merciful love of our Lord. While earthly rulers and heads of state come and go, Jesus Christ's kingship is constant and eternal. Jesus Christ is a king who exemplifies humility, gives himself to us in the Eucharist, and who will be worshiped by all the angels and saints for eternity.

In this week of the Thanksgiving Day holiday, we might also recall that the word "Eucharist" is derived from the Greek term for "Thanksgiving." At each celebration of the Eucharist, we give gratitude to God for all the gifts he has given us, and especially for our redemption through his only Son. Every time we receive Holy Communion, we receive the Body, Blood, soul, and divinity of the King of the Universe. Reflecting on this truth of our faith might help us to approach Communion with awe and reverence. When we meet our King, are we free of serious sin and reconciled with Him in the Sacrament of Penance? Are we mindful of his presence and at peace with our family, friends, and associates? Have we attended to his word and participated in the prayers of the Mass? Have we said "Amen" at the conclusion of the Eucharistic prayer with conviction?

Finally, do we receive the Eucharist respectfully? We are to bow our heads reverently. Whether we receive in the hand or on the tongue, we are to do so in a manner that is fit for royalty. Our hands should be raised with eagerness to receive Him. We should not grab at the sacred host or handle it carelessly. Once the priest, deacon, or extraordinary minister places Communion in our hand, we immediately and gratefully consume it. Cardinal Joseph Ratzinger (later Pope Benedict XVI) cited the following instructions from Cyril of Jerusalem to Christians preparing to receive Sacraments in the fourth century:

They should make a throne of their hands, laying the right upon the left to form a throne for the King, forming at the same time a cross. This symbolic gesture, so fine and so profound, is what concerns him: the hands of man form a cross, which becomes a throne, down into which the King inclines himself. The open, outstretched hand can thus become a sign of the way that a man offers himself to the Lord, opens his hands for him, that they may become an instrument of his presence and a throne of his mercies in this world...God takes an enormous risk-and at the same time this is an expression of his merciful goodness-in allowing not only our hand and our tongue but even our heart to come into contact with him. We see this in the Lord's willingness to enter into us and live with us, within us, and to become from within the heart of our life and the agent of its transformation. (*God is Near Us*, pages 70-71).

When we approach Holy Communion, let us remember who we are receiving and give Jesus Christ, King of the Universe appropriate honor and gratitude.



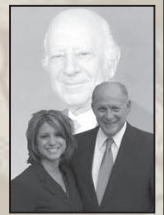
