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CARING + GIVING + SERVING

**Freedom consists not in doing what we like,
but in having the right to do what we ought. -Pope Saint John Paul II**

We often hear the expression, "Freedom is not free." In the secular sense, for our nation to protect the freedoms we celebrate on Independence Day, thousands of members of our military have made the ultimate sacrifice over 250 years. The Fourth of July Holiday we observe this Saturday is an opportunity to reflect on the lives lost and risks taken to forge and sustain a nation that enjoys more liberties than most other countries in the world.

From a Christian standpoint, freedom is even more profound. We must recognize that true freedom from sin and death was purchased for us by Christ's death on the cross. For our salvation, we must cooperate with God's plan for us. This is not easy. Sometimes, people confuse rights granted by our secular country with true freedom. Just because we can do something without fear of political persecution does not mean that it is consistent with God's laws that we must follow for our eternal salvation.

One way to grow in our understanding and desire to pursue true freedom as children of God is to learn and be inspired by Christians who have gone before us. Three saints on our liturgical calendar in the days ahead can teach us much about the challenges of truth, faith, and forgiveness that are essential to attaining our ultimate freedom to rejoice in the presence of God.

Wednesday, July 1, is the Feast of St. Junipero Serra, the Spanish Franciscan missionary who journeyed to America, founded missions throughout California, and brought over six thousand people to the Catholic faith through baptism and teaching the Gospel. Fr. Junipero Serra traveled far at great risk because of his conviction in the truth revealed by Jesus Christ and the mission to teach that truth to others.

We can learn much about faith from St. Thomas the Apostle who we celebrate on Friday, July 3. Thomas was not with the other Apostles when the risen Jesus first appeared to them. He has become known as "Doubting Thomas," because he did not believe their report of seeing the Lord. When Jesus next appeared and showed his wounds to the skeptical Apostle, Thomas proclaimed with total faith, "My Lord and my God!" (John 20: 28) Thomas carried the Gospel message to India, where he died as a martyr for his great faith in Christ.

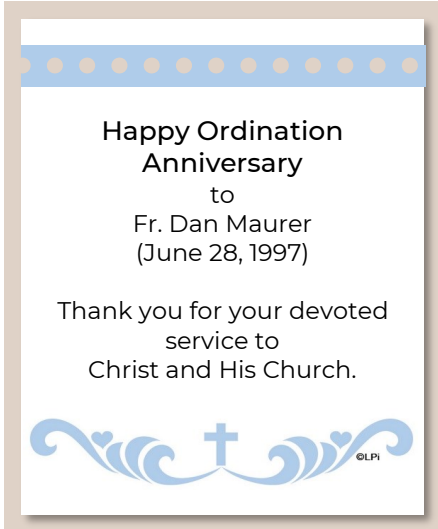
On Monday, July 6, we observe the Feast of St. Maria Goretti. Maria Goretti is a virgin and martyr who died at age 11 while resisting the sexual advances of a 20-year-old neighbor. As she was dying of stab wounds, Maria forgave her assailant and prayed that he would be in heaven with her. The attacker later dreamed of Maria giving him lilies and experienced a powerful conversion. Maria's murderer begged her mother for forgiveness and became a religious brother.

Many Catholic Christians struggle at times with embracing the truth of our beliefs; having the faith to trust in Jesus and his plans for us when life is challenging; and forgiving those who harm us or our loved ones. Reflecting on the stories of our saints and their commitment and sacrifices when facing the same obstacles we do can be very helpful. As we thank God for our nation's freedom this week, let us also dedicate ourselves to striving for the freedom He alone can give. "Human freedom is a force for growth and maturity in truth and goodness; it attains its perfection when directed to God, our beatitude." (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 1731)

GUIDELINES FOR THE RECEPTION OF COMMUNION

FOR CATHOLICS

As Catholics, we fully participate in the celebration of the Eucharist when we receive Holy Communion. We are encouraged to receive Communion devoutly and frequently. In order to be properly disposed to receive Communion, **participants should not be conscious of grave sin and normally should have fasted for one hour.** A person who is conscious of grave sin is not to receive the Body and Blood of the Lord without prior sacramental confession except for a grave reason where there is no opportunity for confession. In this case, the person is to be mindful of the obligation to make an act of perfect contrition, including the intention of confessing as soon as possible (canon 916). A frequent reception of the Sacrament of Penance is encouraged for all.

FOR OUR FELLOW CHRISTIANS

We welcome our fellow Christians to this celebration of the Eucharist as our brothers and sisters. We pray that our common baptism and the action of the Holy Spirit in this Eucharist will draw us closer to one another and begin to dispel the sad divisions which separate us. We pray that these will lessen and finally disappear, in keeping with Christ's prayer for us "that they may all be one" (Jn 17:21). Because Catholics believe that the celebration of the Eucharist is a sign of the reality of the oneness of faith, life, and worship, members of those churches with whom we are not yet fully united are ordinarily not admitted to Holy Communion. Eucharistic sharing in exceptional circumstances by other Christians requires permission according to the directives of the diocesan bishop and the provisions of canon law (canon 844 §4). Members of the Orthodox Churches, the Assyrian Church of the East, and the Polish National Catholic Church are urged to respect the discipline of their own Churches. According to Roman Catholic discipline, the Code of Canon Law does not object to the reception of Communion by Christians of these Churches (canon 844 §3).

FOR THOSE NOT RECEIVING HOLY COMMUNION

All who are not receiving Holy Communion are encouraged to express in their hearts a prayerful desire for unity with the Lord Jesus and with one another.

FOR NON-CHRISTIANS

We also welcome to this celebration those who do not share our faith in Jesus Christ. While we cannot admit them to Holy Communion, we ask them to offer their prayers for the peace and the unity of the human family.

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Note: If you are wearing a mask at Mass, you must lower it, or remove it, to receive Holy Communion. No one, for any reason, is permitted to walk away (or even take a few steps) with the Eucharist in his or her hand.

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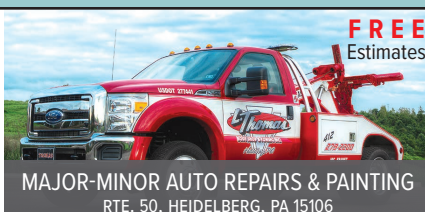


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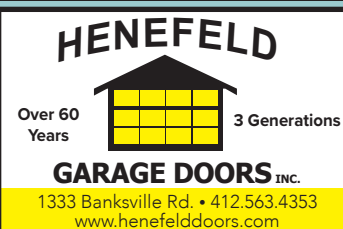
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
