

#### A Message from Father Ken

Dear Friends,

Happy Easter! Alleluia!! He is risen!!! We are into the Season of New Life, Resurrection and Hope. This week, I write again about the Divine Mercy and what gifts the Lord gave the world through this private revelation.

#### **Divine Mercy Sunday**

One week after Easter, we celebrate the Second Sunday of Easter, also known as Divine Mercy Sunday. On this day, April 24, we will mark Divine Mercy Sunday with a procession with the Blessed Sacrament from Notre Dame Church to St. Mary Church, where we will then have Exposition and Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament until 3:00pm. At 3:00pm, we will have a bilingual recitation of the Divine Mercy Chaplet and conclude with Benediction and Reposition of the Blesses Sacrament. Please join us.

Now some background on how Divine Mercy Sunday came to be. Throughout the 1930s, Jesus appeared to St. Faustina and spoke many times about his desire that the Sunday after Easter, the Second Sunday of Easter, also be celebrated as the Feast of Divine Mercy and be called Divine Mercy Sunday. St. Faustina wrote in her diary in August or September of 1936: 'On one occasion, I heard these words: "My daughter, tell the whole world about My inconceivable mercy. I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, especially for poor sinners. On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My Mercy. The soul that will go to confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. On that day all the divine floodgates through which graces flow are opened. Let no soul fear to draw near to me even though its sins be as scarlet. My mercy is so great that no mind, be it of man or angel, will be able to fathom it through all eternity. Everything that exists has come forth from the very depths of My most tender mercy. Every soul in its relation to me will contemplate My love and My mercy throughout all eternity. The Feast of Mercy emerged from My very depths of tenderness. It is my desire that it be solemnly celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter. Mankind will not have peace until it turns to the Fount of My Mercy".

Although St. Faustina received these apparitions in the 1930s, the Chaplet, the Divine Mercy Image, the Feast of Mercy and St. Faustina's diary did not spread throughout the Church and the world for decades after. For example, although all these things existed in her brief lifetime (she died at age 33 in 1938 of tuberculosis), she was not beatified until 1993. And although the Second Sunday of Easter was informally celebrated as the Feast of Mercy, it was not until many years later when it was officially codified and promulgated as Divine Mercy Sunday throughout the universal Church. The circumstances around this show the hand of God.

For one thing, it was the first Polish pope (and the first non-Italian pope in about half a millennium), St. John Paul II, who beatified and then canonized this Polish nun. He did it on the Second Sunday of Easter, Divine Mercy Sunday, on April 30, in the year 2000. On the same day, he declared that the Second Sunday of Easter would be celebrated as the Feast of Mercy, Divine Mercy Sunday, throughout the universal Church. So she whom our Lord tasked with being the Apostle of his mercy looked down from her place with Him in Heaven to

see that the mission was accomplished 62 years after she passed from this world. Fourteen years later, on Divine Mercy Sunday in 2014, Pope John Paul II himself was canonized a saint.

Now a word about how we can drink deeply from the fount of Jesus' mercy on Divine Mercy Sunday. One thing it means is that we can receive a plenary indulgence, as Jesus told St. Faustina, 'For the remission of sins and all punishment'. I know this sounds harsh, but it is really loving. When we sin, we not only need to seek forgiveness, but also to heal from our self-inflicted wounds. The healing can be trying at times, as with physical wounds, but Jesus wants us to be perfectly whole. That's why a priest gives penitents a penance as part of the Sacrament of Reconciliation: we are completely forgiven of the sins we confess, but we still need spiritual medicine to heal. The Lord is so merciful that he allows this healing process to continue after death if necessary. We call this process Purgatory. However, Divine Mercy Sunday gives us a chance to heal now.

That's why Jesus, through his Church, encourages us to include the Sacrament of Reconciliation as part of Divine Mercy Sunday. If, eight days before or eight days after Divine Mercy Sunday, we celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation and then, without any attachment to even venial sin, we receive Holy Communion, then we obtain what's called a plenary indulgence. This means that we ask for and receive a superabundance of God's healing mercy: we are healed completely and continue our spiritual journey with an absolutely fresh start. If we were to be called home to the Lord, we would bypass Purgatory completely and go straight to Jesus' loving embrace, where we would spend eternity contemplating his unfathomable and inexhaustible mercy in perfect bliss.

#### **Divine Mercy Chaplet and Novena**

Another gift the Lord gave to Faustina is the Divine Mercy Chaplet, a simple prayer said with rosary beads which takes only seven minutes. For more information on how to pray the Chaplet and the Novena prayers, visit the website www.thedivinemercy.org.

Jesus told Faustina that those who pray the Chaplet throughout their lives can obtain great mercy throughout life, and especially as death approaches, both for others and themselves. I can testify to this because I have prayed the Chaplet at the bedside of several dying people who passed peacefully soon after, sometimes only minutes later. This includes my own mother.

The Lord said to St. Faustina about the Novena, 'By this Novena, I will grant every possible grace to souls'. That includes those who pray the Novena and those for whom it is prayed.

Although the Novena can be prayed at any time. The universal Church traditionally prays it together from Good Friday to Divine Mercy Sunday. Through Faustina, our Lord instructed us to pray for specific intentions each day of the Novena. In order, they are: 1. All humanity, especially sinners, 2. Priests and religious, 3. Devout and faithful souls, 4. Those who do not believe in God or Jesus, 5. Souls who have fallen away from the Church, 6. Meek and humble souls and children, 7. Souls who honor and glorify Jesus' mercy, 8. The souls in Purgatory and 9. Lukewarm souls.



# A Letter from Bishop McManus

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

"Peace be with you" (Jn 19:19)

In a world saddened by devastating images of lives lost, homes destroyed and families separated, Christ's Easter greeting sounds quite contrary to the tenor of recent events. We strive for peace. We pray for peace. But, all too often, unjust aggression, acts of terrorism and even domestic violence mar modern life. Two thousand years later, the greeting, "Peace be with you" seems sadly far from fulfillment.

We must, however, remember the context of that first Easter Sunday. The disciples were gathered in secret behind locked doors for fear of those who had three days before connived, condemned and committed Christ to a violent and barbarous death. The Divine hands that reached out to the disciples in peace on Easter still bore the scars of the nails. His side still revealed the thrust of the lance that pierced the Sacred Heart. The scars were as present and real as were the disciples' fears.

Easter didn't erase the horror of Good Friday. It didn't banish the oppressive presence of the occupying Romans or the hostility of some of the Pharisees and Sadducees. Easter came amidst those things, not after. But Easter and Christ's Resurrection gave the disciples the hope - the certain hope - that earthly tyrants, invading armies, demonic powers and death would not have the last word. Those fearful forces can still inflict wounds, wreak destruction, cause division and death, but for the faithful followers of the Risen Christ, all those real and painful things will pass. Jesus didn't promise Heaven on earth. But He did promise, and Easter does show, that the hell on earth that sin causes will be overcome. Wounds will heal, wrongs will be righted, death will give way to life and, in the end, goodness will triumph.

Until then, may Easter and the promise of the Resurrection enable us to face life's trials, tragedies and losses with indomitable hope, dauntless courage and peace in our hearts even if that peace is still far from realized in our world.

# A Candle of Faith, Hope and Love

A Votive Candle represents a remembrance of Love of a loved one, or simply as one's devotional prayer choice before God.

The present list of offerings is:

- A votive candle of one month for an offering of twenty dollars (\$20)
- A votive candle of three (3) months for an offering of fifty dollars (\$50)
- A votive candle of six (6) months for an offering of one hundred dollars (\$100)
- A votive candle for 12 months (1 yr.) with an offering of two hundred dollars (\$200)

Please note that the 4 categories mentioned above are the "two top rows" of the votive candle stand. These are sponsored candles in support of the parish and must be activated for use. The remaining rows (blue candles) still require an offering of \$2.00 for each candle for 3 days, using the present method posted on the candle stand for the offering procedure. 

We pray in the name of Jesus, the Prince of Peace.



## ESTE ES EL DÍA!!!



"Este es el día en que actuó el Señor, sea nuestra alegría y nuestro gozo" (Sal. 117,24). Como cristianos nacimos para el Reino de Dios desde nuestra más tierna infancia pero, aun siendo conscientes de esta verdad y creyendo plenamente, tenemos muchas dificultades en acoger este privilegio y pasamos largo tiempo en comprenderlo. Nadie, por supuesto, lo comprende plenamente. Y hasta en este gran día, este día entre los días, donde Cristo resucita de entre los muertos, nosotros estamos como recién nacidos a los que les faltan ojos para ver y un corazón para comprender quiénes somos verdaderamente. Este es el dia de Pascua, repitámoslo una y otra vez, con un respeto profundo y una gran alegría. Como los niños cuando dicen: "Ha llegado la primavera" o "miren el mar", para expresar la idea, digamos: "he aquí el día entre los días, el día real (Ap. 1,10), el día del Señor. He aquí el día en que el Cristo ha resucitado de entre los muertos, el día que nos trae la salvación". Este es el día que nos trae lo más grande que podemos comprender. Es el día de nuestro descanso, nuestro verdadero sábado; Cristo ha entrado en su descanso, y nosotros con Él. Este día nos conduce, en prefiguración, a través de la tumba y las puertas de la muerte, hasta el tiempo del descanso en el seno de Abraham (Hech. 3,20; Lc 16,22). Estamos bastante cansados de la oscuridad, el cansancio, la tristeza y el remordimiento. Estamos bastante cansados de este mundo agotador. Estamos cansados de sus ruidos y su jaleo; su mejor música, es sólo un ruido. Pero ahora reina el silencio, y es un silencio que habla : tal es nuestra suerte en lo sucesivo. Hoy es el comienzo de días tranquilos y serenos, en los que podemos escuchar a Cristo, con su "voz dulce y tranquila" (1R 19,12), porque el mundo ya no habla más. Despojémonos de este mundo, y revistámonos de Cristo (Ef. 4,22; Rm 13,14). ¡Esforcémonos en desvestirnos así, para revestirnos de cosas invisibles e imperecederas! Esforcémonos en crecer en gracia y en el conocimiento de nuestro Señor y Salvador, día a día, año tras año, hasta que nos lleve con Él en el Reino de su Padre y nuestro Padre, de su Dios y nuestro Dios (Jn 20,17).
