A Message from Father Ken

Dear Friends,

The Sacraments: New Adult Faith Formation Opportunity Months ago, the Adult Faith Formation Ministry conducted a survey which asked what opportunities and topics you would like us to offer. People wanted more opportunities to adore Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament and to learn more about the sacraments in general and the Eucharist in particular. In response, we introduced Adoration during 'Eventide' every month, that is, during Evening Prayer from the Liturgy of the Hours, which also includes a homily or reflection about some aspect of the Eucharist. This past month, we had a marvelous return of the Forty Hours Devotion, during which we had people come for more than 40 continuous hours of Adoration. To further respond to your request, which jibes beautifully with the U.S. Bishops' call for Eucharistic Renewal, Fr. Carlos and I will facilitate a seven session course on the sacraments.

It will begin on Tuesday, September 20, from 6:30 to 8:00PM in the large room in the Ministry Center. It will continue for seven consecutive Tuesdays and conclude on November 1, All Saints Day. Each week we will discuss one of the seven sacraments. This is an excellent way to contribute to the Eucharistic Renewal because each of the other six sacraments relate to and in a sense service the celebration of the Eucharist, which the Church calls 'the source and summit of our faith', and Fr. Carlos and I will help us see how they relate. These seven weeks promise to be a marvelous learning and faith -sharing experience. Here is irony: the Christmas decorations gave us so much, we didn't use much from the basement of Notre Dame Rectory! So don't be surprised if you see another flea market at La Salle soon, or if you see the Christmas decorations surface again at the Fall Bazaar on November 6. Thanks again to all who worked so hard to make the flea market happen and for providing this model of stewardship.

Vacation Bible School Returns

Earlier in August, we had the triumphant return of Vacation Bible School (VBS) after a three-year hiatus initiated by — you guessed it — the coronavirus. This year's theme was 'Monumental', as in our God is a monumental God, like the

mountains or the ocean. God certainly blessed us monumentally by inspiring parents to bring 31 children to VBS, a fabulous number after that long layoff. Sometimes something needs to be missed to be appreciated and desired again. And we went back to a full day, from 9:00AM to 3:00PM, which is something we stopped doing even before the coronavirus.

Another blessing from God was the great team we assembled to minister to the kids. We thank our staff members Antonia Martinez, Matt Hart and Sister Rosa Maria, especially Antonia, who was in charge of the whole thing. We also thank all the wonderful teachers and helpers: Andrea Alicea, Ada Altiery, Lisa Anderson, Rita Camacho, Louisa and Sofía Henao, Andrea Melendez, Sofía Melendez, Jadiel, Jarelis and Javiel Torres and Natyarie Vilanueva. It was beautiful to see the young catechists do such an excellent job with an equally excellent group of kids. It was especially beautiful to realize that some of these catechists were, not so many years ago, the kids in VBS themselves.

I want to give special thanks to two women who spent the week in the kitchen of the Ministry Center, fortifying the kids with snacks and drinks. The last day, they supplemented the hamburger and hotdog barbecue which Ed Delage and Ajay LaRochelle provided (whom we also thank) with Latino food. I really want to point out the initiative these ladies took by cleaning and organizing the kitchen 'within an inch of its life', as the saying goes. The transformation was remarkable, and we thank Ada and Rita for it.

All I Really Needed to Know I Learned in Kindergarten
This is a title of a book by Robert Fulghum, published in 1986. I

mention it because of the following topic, and Ada's and Rita's great gift of the pristine kitchen prompts this. Fulghum's says that the fundamentals of mutual respect and consideration are (or should be) taught to us when we are toddlers. For example, principles such as putting things back where we found them and leaving them in the same condition (or better) are guidelines we should always follow. Alas, human nature being what it is, it's easy to forget or ignore these guidelines. (I speak especially of myself.)

So I ask us to show our appreciation for Ada's and Rita's gift of an immaculate and clutter-free kitchen by putting things back where we found them and cleaning up thoroughly when we're through. And we need to do the same with *all* the parish property, which has not always been the case.

And as much as it comes from generosity, we nevertheless ask again that no one leave food and drink in the kitchen, which quite often goes to waste and adds clutter which others have to clean up. Thanks so much for your respect, consideration and cooperation. And thanks again to Ada and Rita for giving us this superb model of stewardship.

Financial Report about Festival

This bulletin includes an insert which provides the financial details (income and expenses) for the San Juan Bautista International Festival last June. When we do the math, the amount we netted from the Festival itself (minus the pre-festival events and all the raffles) is \$6,951.68. This could be disappointing when we compare it to past years and consider all the work over 80 volunteers did to make the Festival happen. However, we need to remember what a great day we had and the number of folks who came out and enjoyed the Festival after a three year absence. And if we look at the total amount netted when we include pre-festival food sales and all the raffles (\$20,591.22), we see a great boon for the parish. Again, thanks to everyone who gave so much of their time, talent and treasure to gift the parish and the community with this year's Festival. You are all models of stewardship.



COMENTARIO DEL EVANGELIO (Lucas 15,1-32)

DIOS TE BUSCA

Hay una especial sintonía entre las lecturas de este domingo 24 del Tiempo Ordinario. Hablan de la misericordia y del perdón. El Señor Jesús en el Evangelio nos va a narrar tres parábolas y, entre ellas, el bello texto del Hijo Pródigo. Jesús de Nazaret nos conoce muy bien. Por eso nos perdona porque sabe de nuestra fragilidad. Nosotros hemos de reconocer siempre esa fragilidad y sabernos pecadores. Cuando se abandona ese concepto de vulnerabilidad y de tendencia al pecado, surge la soberbia... y ella es lo que más nos separa de Dios.En este mundo resbaladizo, el hombre y la mujer que son débiles, no saben mantenerse firmes en el camino. Por eso, Jesús, el Buen Pastor, el buen médico nos enseña los remedios contra el extravío, y el juez misericordioso de ninguna manera rechaza la esperanza del perdón. Es por

este motivo que San Lucas ha propuesto las tres parábolas siguientes: la oveja que se había extraviado y que fue hallada, la moneda de plata que se había perdido y se encontró, el hijo que se daba por muerto y recobró la vida. Todo ello es para que este triple remedio nos impulsa a curar nuestras heridas... La oveja cansada es devuelta al redil por el pastor; la moneda extraviada es hallada; el hijo pisa de nuevo el camino y regresa a su padre arrepentido de su extravío... Alegrémonos, pues, de que esta oveja que se extravió en Adán, sea levantada por Cristo. Las espaldas de Cristo son los brazos de la cruz; Las espaldas de Cristo son los brazos de la cruz; es en ella donde he dejado mis pecados, y he encontrado mi descanso. Esta oveja es única en su naturaleza, pero no en sus personas, porque nosotros todos formamos un solo cuerpo, pero somos muchos miembros. Por esto está escrito: "Sois el cuerpo de Cristo y miembros de sus miembros" (1C 2,27). "El Hijo del hombre ha venido para salvar lo que estaba perdido". (Lc 19,10), es decir, a todos los hombres puesto que "si por Adán murieron todos, por Cristo todos volverán a la vida" Tampoco es sin relevancia que esta mujer se alegre de haber encontrado la moneda: pues no es poca cosa que en esta moneda figure el rostro de un príncipe. De la misma manera el rostro del Rey es el bien de la Iglesia. Nosotros somos ovejas: pidamos las praderas: Somos la moneda: conservemos nuestro valor. Somos los hijos: corramos hacia el Padre.
