### IN OUR PARISH

Dear St. Matthew Family,

Happy Easter! How wonderful it is to be able to spend Easter in person with you this year, in contrast to last year when public Masses were suspended: "Alleluia! Let us rejoice and be glad!"

Our Gospel this Easter Sunday begins with those closest to Jesus discovering the empty tomb and gradually moving from panicked confusion to clear understanding of what had happened. As the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* notes, Easter for these first witnesses of Jesus' Resurrection marked the beginning of a "new era." Their lives would never be the same. Their understanding of God would never be the same.

We, too, are beginning a new era as a parish community. I don't know how long the dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass will continue, but as vaccines become more widely available to those who choose to receive them and as many of us start to resume some activities that we have avoided for the past year, the dispensation gives us the privilege of *choosing* to do what once was habit.

Imagine with me the vibrancy of a parish family who, by choosing to return to Mass even before the dispensation is lifted, renews their commitment to the Eucharist and to serving each other. Our world tells us that faith is a fantasy. Imagine the witness we can bring to this world by choosing to commit part of our Sunday to attending Mass. Even those who are not yet able to return to public life can choose to keep Sunday holy by praying with a live stream Mass or other means and can be witnesses to their friends and family by expressing their desire for the Eucharist and to be united with us in worship of our Savior.

Jesus' Resurrection on the first Easter Sunday began a new era; this Easter Sunday, we are again called to renew our commitment to the Risen Jesus and to embark on a new era for our parish. Please join us in whatever way you can.

We hope you had a wonderful Holy Week and an enjoyable Easter. The short work week provided us all time to reflect and relax. The Facilities Team was no different as they reflected on their summer break project lists.

Although last week was short, Holy Week was packed with activities requiring support and coordination to ensure the church was clean for a constant flow of visitors. Reconciliation Monday was taken advantage of by many. Tuesday, our eighth-grade students performed the Living Stations of the Cross for the first time ever in the Sanctuary. Our school students had an opportunity to experience one of the three daytime performances with a fourth evening performance for parents and parishioners. A performance is posted on YouTube with our streamed Masses – they did great!

Wednesday and Thursday provided time to prepare the church for the Paschal Triduum starting Holy Thursday night through the Easter Vigil and Easter Sunday Masses. 


