One of our intercessions in praying for our society to be built on a culture of Life, is to pray "that all who suffer from participating in abortion may turn to God's loving forgiveness." 



#### PARISH PROJECTS

Given the generosity of our parishioners, the Facilities Team is pleased to provide regular updates on St. Matthew campus projects, improvements, and ongoing initiatives to provide a safe, healthy, and prayerful environment.

Last week offered a little more diversity than most, as we reacted to higher-than-normal Covid cases and bee stings at school. At church, we worked on fixing a wireless mic system and a couple Stations of the Cross statues. The Facilities Team handled these challenges in stride while keeping the church spotless, car lines in order and our buildings cool during an extended period of hot days.

The Governor reported Covid cases are increasing among children. Unfortunately, we are feeling the impact of that trend. We have taken advantage of free mask and Covid test kit programs. Last week, the drinking fountains were turned back off, we implemented the use of disinfecting foggers multiple times a day, additional attention was given to high touch areas, and we are ensuring mask and distancing policies are being followed. We should all be responsible for monitoring our health and the health of our children to reduce the spread.

We have had more bee stings reported than ever. A couple flowering trees have been cut down, hornets nests killed and flowering plants around the playground removed. Measures seem to be helping.

Our Sanctuary Stations of the Cross statues are very old and have endured major repairs during restoration. Several statues have developed stress cracks on extremities resulting in one figure losing a hand. Be patient with us as we make repairs and have paint touched up.
