



PARISH PROJECTS

Given the generosity of our parishioners, the Facilities Team is pleased to provide regular updates on St. Matthew campus projects, improvements, and ongoing initiatives to provide a safe, healthy, and prayerful environment.

Your Facilities Team continues to push forward in several areas from cleaning, disinfecting, organizing, and bee control.

Our priority remains the health and safety of our students and parishioners. Much of our third-grade class is returning from a 10-day quarantine after several students tested Covid positive. Classrooms continue to be fogged and thoroughly cleaned daily. The mask mandate continues to be enforced in school. Daily sanitizing in the church is required as utilization increases. As we commit major resources to this effort, we are doing everything possible to stop the spread of the virus.

Through a federal grant, we are deploying 45 air purifiers throughout the school this week. Every classroom, the cafeteria and central hallways will have purifiers running 24/7.

After permanently removing surplus desks, chairs, shelves and files from the school, we are now going through and organizing and storing the usable furniture, and disposing of broken and worn-out equipment. Storage areas are being reconfigured and organized.

Bees continue to plague the campus. We are doing our best to remove flowering plants and look for nests. Orkin reports bee control this year is their number one problem. Hopefully, the cooler weather will help reduce their activity.

The Sanctuary sound system continues to be an issue. We have had several of you step up with ideas and funding. Thank you. Don't give up on us as we try different equipment configurations and settings.


