All Fridays in Lent are days of abstinence from meat for those who are 14 years of age and older.

Weekdays of Lent – There is no obligation to fast. However, voluntary acts of self-denial are recommended.

Easter duty – All the faithful, after they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year. This precept must be fulfilled during the Easter season, from the first Sunday of Lent (March 6) to Trinity Sunday (June 12), unless it is fulfilled for a just cause at some other time during the year. After having attained the age of discretion, each of the faithful is bound by an obligation faithfully to confess serious sins at least once a year.

PARISH PROJECTS

Given the generosity of our parishioners, the Facilities Team is pleased to provide regular updates on St. Matthew campus projects, improvements, and on-going initiatives to provide a safe, healthy, and prayerful environment.

During a special Mass last Monday evening, the Divine Mercy Perpetual Adoration Chapel reopened as the Most Blessed Sacrament was moved to the Chapel where it will now be available to Adorers 24/7. Anyone may enter the Chapel through the church front handicap door from 6:00 a.m. until 7:00 p.m. The back stairs door will have shorter unlocked hours. For the safety of our visitors and security of the church both doors are accessible 24/7 via a personal code obtained from Bryan Gebhart when doors are locked. The bell tower now glows red as a sign that the Lord is present. Thank you to all that made this reopening possible.

With additional activity in the church at all hours, we are pleased to announce the addition of an automated external defibrillator (AED) in the lower level near the elevator in case of a medical emergency. The main level AED is between the elevator and the Sanctuary entrance. We also added another AED in the school. With the help of an Ohio Grant, we now have a total of five of these emergency devices on campus with the three in the school placed at the front entrance, rear entrance #7, and in the Parish Activity Center (PAC) lobby. These devices are designed to analyze the heart rhythm and deliver an electric shock to victims of ventricular fibrillation to restore the heart rhythm to normal.

It is good to see the weather finally breaking to access the outdoor needs of our facilities. The ice has taken its toll on our parking lots, sidewalks, and playground surface. Temporary patches will be made as temperatures permit. We are looking at more permanent repairs this summer, particularly in the playground. The typical playground surface has a ten-year life with equipment life of 20-years. Gahanna Parks and Recreation maintains 18 playgrounds. They replace their playground surfaces every 9-years with equipment replacement every 18-years on a rotating basis. Our playground surface and equipment are now approaching 20 years old. Our equipment is maintained safe, and the surface still provides a soft surface, but everything is showing wear. We will keep you updated on ideas to improve.

PRO-LIFE CORNER



Concerned that Roe vs Wade could be overturned this June by the Supreme Court, pro-abortion advocates passed the Women's

Health Protection Act (WHPA) in the US House of Representatives last September. The WHPA would codify the legality of abortion up to the moment of birth and override state laws restricting abortion in any way. This would make the override of Roe vs Wade "merely interesting" since it would now be a federal law to allow abortion under all circumstances. However, this bill was defeated in the US Senate by a vote of 48 to 46. Let us thank God that this extreme bill was defeated which also eliminated restrictions on parental consent, funding, and conscience laws under the Religious Freedom Restoration Act.

In other good news, the pro-life Thomas More Society has filed lawsuits against two groups that have admitted that they funded abortions in Texas after a fetal heartbeat was detected. Under the Texas Heartbeat Law, passed last August, private citizens can sue abortion providers for up to \$10,000. A heartbeat is detectable around 6 weeks after conception. Just the threat of a lawsuit has reduced the number of abortions in Texas by over 50% saving an estimated 75 babies per day. If successful, this will put Texas clinics on further notice that the Texas law is not just a "scare tactic." There are at least seven other states that are looking to enact legislation similar to the Texas Heartbeat Law.

Let us continue to pray for the Gospel of Life to prevail in our culture:

"Lord Jesus Christ, You took our human nature upon Yourself. You shared our life and death, our childhood and adulthood. You also shared our time in the womb. We ask You today to bless and protect the children who are in their mothers' womb." Amen.

A Synod is a process that gathers Christ's disciples so that their voices can be heard. The history of the Church also shows us that the model of Synodality was a critical tool at times of crisis and challenge. 




