LENTEN REGULATIONS

All Fridays in Lent are days of abstinence from meat for those who are 14 years of age and older. *Please note, on Friday, March 25, the Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord supersedes the Friday in Lent practices so that abstinence from meat is not required. This is not a day of obligation to attend Mass, but those who wish to attend may do so and those who wish to abstain from eating meat may still do so.

Weekdays of Lent - There is no obligation to fast. However, voluntary acts of self-denial are recommended.

Easter duty — All the faithful, after they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year. This precept must be fulfilled during the Easter season, from the first Sunday of Lent (March 6) to Trinity Sunday (June 12), unless it is fulfilled for a just cause at some other time during the year. After having attained the age of discretion, each of the faithful is bound by an obligation faithfully to confess serious sins at least once a year.

PARISH PROJECTS

Given the generosity of our parishioners, the Facilities Team is pleased to provide regular updates on St. Matthew campus projects, improvements, and ongoing initiatives to provide a safe, healthy, and prayerful environment. All three initiatives are addressed this week.

A quick update on several projects including the school playground. Although our playground is approaching 20-years old, most of the equipment is still in good condition. We had a Little Tikes rep in this week to provide suggestions and options for improvements. The biggest concern is the poured rubber surface, it is soft and safe, but the top finish layer is deteriorating. One solution is to fill the damaged areas, then cover the entire surface with a turf-type product. The current Little Tikes equipment can be repaired and touched-up. We are getting costs of new climbing equipment to replace the original steel monkey bars in the southwest corner of the playground. These few improvements would make the playground look new and extend its life by at least ten years.

We have increased the memory on our video surveillance system to retain over 6-months of recorded history. The next step is to add cameras to increase our video coverage. The new street monument sign proposal is being prepared to present to Gahanna zoning for regulation variances and permits before we can order and schedule installation. The controller manufacturer for our new Sanctuary lights was in this week to access our existing wiring and discuss the many light control options we will have available for Masses and other programs.

In addition to routine cleaning and maintenance, the Facilities Team is helping the Knights of Columbus with their Friday Fish Frys, preparing for the Boy Scouts annual mulch sale delivery, involved in Holy Week planning, meeting with a Verizon regional architect on increasing strength of signal, getting repairs made to our Sanctuary organ, and making seasonal adjustments to HVAC systems parish-wide.

PRO-LIFE CORNER



The Gospel of Life calls for us to protect and defend all life, especially for the weak and vulnerable. The Russian invasion

of Ukraine is a dramatic example of the disregard for human life and has created the worst refugee problem in Europe since WWII. Over 2 million people have fled the country and the number is expected to more than double. Many families have been separated from their fathers and sons and have taken shelter in a country that is totally unfamiliar to them.

The Holy Family experienced the same suffering in their flight to Egypt to escape the wrath of Herod. This is one of the Seven Sorrows of Mary given to St. Bridget of Sweden by the Blessed Mother. "Behold the angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream and said, "Rise, take the child and his mother, flee to Egypt, and stay there until I tell you. Herod is going to search for the child to destroy him"" (Mat. 2:13). The devotion of the Seven Sorrows of Mary calls for seven Hail Marys to be said for each sorrow. Let us pray this Sorrow during Lent for the Ukrainian refugees and for all the innocent people in Ukraine being ravaged by this war. Especially mothers delivering babies and taking care of infants under extremely difficult conditions.


