IN OUR PARISH

DEAR ST. MATTHEW FAMILY,

May the love of God and the peace of Jesus Christ be with you as we enter Lent. I wish you a faith-filled Lent that brings you more closely to the Lord, so that on Easter we can experience the joy of the Resurrection in all its fullness.

Jesus teaches us in the Gospel of Mark, "The kingdom of God is at hand; repent and believe in the gospel" (1:15). This combination of repentance and belief succinctly describes the message of Lent: we must give up what harms us to make room for the belief in God's love that heals us.

However, simply making room for belief is not enough. We must cultivate belief and grow in the habits that bring us closer to God, who loves us and wants us to embrace our identity as His sons and daughters.

Part of that cultivation involves habit; only by practicing our faith can we build the habit of faith, which is so important for those moments of struggle that we all experience from time to time. No matter where you are in your faith journey, this Lent, I invite you to combine three practices that can lead to life-giving conversion and to a habit of faith: frequent reception of the Sacraments of Reconciliation and Eucharist and making a Holy Hour before the Real Presence of Jesus Christ.

First, the Sacrament of Reconciliation is a gift to our faith life because it allows us to start over and to tell God that, no matter how we have struggled, we are ready to start again with His help. I hope that everyone will take advantage of the graces of this sacrament. We offer additional Confession times during Lent, but you are also welcome to receive the sacrament by appointment or at any other parish. This sacrament is a sacrament of healing, and I pray you will come and ask God to heal you.

Second, consider attending Mass more than just on Sunday - maybe mid-week. We offer Mass every weekday at 6:30 a.m. and 8:30 a.m. and on Saturday mornings at 8:30 a.m. Daily Masses are generally shorter than Sunday Masses, and I think you'll be surprised by how dramatically taking a few extra minutes to start your day with Mass can strengthen your spiritual life.

Finally, I invite everyone to make a Holy Hour each week before the Blessed Sacrament. Our parish offers the Divine Mercy Perpetual Adoration Chapel so that we can spend time with Jesus at any time, day or night, building a strong relationship with Him and strengthening the habit of faith that I spoke of earlier.

I, myself, am committed to a Holy Hour each week, and I can testify to the way that hour has changed my life and has helped with decision-making, stress-relief, and discerning God's path for my life and in my leadership. Because time in Adoration is such a strongly positive part of my life, I want you to experience it as well.

When we come to Jesus Christ in the Blessed Sacrament, we come to know Him better. We build the habit of faith. We know that we are not alone, and we grow in seeing God's will for our lives. Please consider building a Holy Hour into your life. You can learn more or sign up for an hour on our website, https://stmatthew.net/dmc.

LENTEN REGULATIONS

All Fridays in Lent are days of abstinence from meat for those who are 14 years of age and older.

Weekdays of Lent – There is no obligation to fast. However, voluntary acts of self-denial are recommended.

Easter Duty – All the faithful, after they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year. This precept must be fulfilled during the Easter season, from the first Sunday of Lent (February 26) to Trinity Sunday (June 4), unless it is fulfilled for a just cause at some other time during the year. After having attained the age of discretion, each of the faithful is bound by an obligation faithfully to confess serious sins at least once a year.

Good Friday is a day of both fast and abstinence from meat. There is a limit of one full meal and two lesser meals or all who have completed their 18th year and have not yet reached their 60th year.

MONTHLY DEMENTIA/ALZHEIMER'S SUPPORT GROUP — Are you a caregiver for a dementia patient or have you lost a loved one to dementia? DISPENSATION FOR ST. PATRICK'S DAY - The obligation to abstain from meat on the Fridays of Lent is an important element of the Church's observance of the penitential nature of this holy season. This year, March 17, the Friday of the Third Week of Lent, corresponds with Saint Patrick's Day, traditionally an occasion for joy-filled celebrations in this diocese, especially among those of Irish heritage. Bishop Fernandes has granted to the faithful of the Diocese of Columbus, as well as to any visitors or travelers who may be physically present within the territory of this diocese, a dispensation from the obligation of abstinence from meat on March 17, 2023, provided that the member of the faithful taking advantage of this dispensation, undertakes one of the following works: 1) makes a pilgrimage or visit to any church in the Diocese of Columbus named in honor of St. Patrick (Columbus, London, Junction City); 2) assists at Mass at any church, chapel, or oratory on March 17th; 3) prays the "Breastplate of St. Patrick," attributed to St. Patrick; 4) engages in some pious devotion such as the Rosary, the Stations of the Cross, or Eucharistic Adoration; or 5) performs an act of comparable penance (such as abstinence from meat) on some other occasion during the Third Week of Lent.





PRO-LIFE CORNER

Two abortion advocacy groups have decided to unite their efforts to amend the Ohio constitution to guarantee the right to abortion, targeting the 2023 November ballot. The two groups are "Ohioans for Reproductive Freedom" and "Ohio Physicians for Reproductive Rights," a consortium of 2000+ physicians. Their efforts will be supported by a consulting firm that was successful in defeating pro-life constitutional efforts in Kentucky and Kansas. They will model their campaign and amendment language on the abortion amendment passed in Michigan last November, Proposal 3 "Reproductive Freedom for All." Prop 3 passed with 57% voting for the amendment and 43% against. Many people voted for this because they thought there should be some access to abortion, but with limits.

However, Prop 3 allows abortion from conception to birth and disguised this fact by allowing a mother's "mental health" as a reason for an abortion at any time. Prop 3 also eliminated the need for parental consent, the licensing and inspection of abortion facilities, and allows non-physicians to perform abortions. The pro-abortion groups in Michigan had twice the funding of the pro-life groups and advertised many false claims and half-truths about the amendment – leveraging the fact that many people don't carefully read an amendment and vote on "what they had heard."

We need to pray and support the effort to stop this amendment to change our Ohio constitution. 


