SCRIPTURE 102 – A NEW TESTAMENT STUDY FOR THE FALL

Scripture 102 is a unique Bible Study on the New Testament that digs deeper into Scripture unlike any other. Fr. Sebastian Carnazzo from the Institute of Catholic Culture follows up from the Scripture 101 class by using typology, that is, seeing how the Old Testament is fulfilled in the New. He shows us the errors in the religions that have strayed off course all the while helping us to understand how knowing the Bible and salvation history will assist us with the culture we live in today.

Scripture 102 may be a little difficult for those who are new to taking Bible Studies, but Fr. Sebastian takes you step-by-step as he reads what he considers are important passages in a particular book of the Bible and, in turn, looks at a corresponding book to compare its similar themes. He is especially remarkable on how he intertwines the book of Acts with the epistles of Paul and the Catholic letters to give a timeline of when these letters were written and why. History comes alive with this study.

Fr. Sebastian also is quite the comedian and keeps the class laughing. It is NEVER boring! He is a Melkite Rite priest and he sometimes explains differences between the Latin and Eastern Catholic churches, which is fascinating, while emphasizing that we are One, Holy, Catholic and Apostolic Church.

PARISH PROJECTS

Given the generosity of our parishioners, the Facilities Team is pleased to provide updates on St. Matthew campus projects, repairs, improvements, and on-going initiatives to provide a safe, healthy, and prayerful environment for you and our children during the summer break.

As you look around the Sanctuary, you can see all stages of our repairs and renovation. Painting has started, which is a sign areas are approaching completion. Construction has been going faster as the project moves forward. An opportunity has presented itself to get back one of the two weeks we fell behind early in the project. It will require the removal of a few more rows of pews before the first pews are reinstalled. This further reduction in seating is only temporary. We appreciate your patience and willingness to sit closer to each other. Continuing to celebrate weekend Masses in the church remains a priority.

Our new proposed electronic monument sign went before the Planning Commission on July 26. We participated in a spirit of compromise to get approval. Our stated objective before the Commission was to give into their demands of a single color, agree on message changes hopefully more than once a day, and to have more than 33% of the sign electronic. It was noted that Burger King was allowed message changes every minute with 56% of their sign being electronic. It is worth noting that since 2015, BK was the only sign granted a variance – all others were denied. Peace Lutheran got approval by appeal. After much seemingly positive conversation and compromise, the vote was unanimously against approval.

It was clear prior to the hearing that the Commission had already decided that we don't need an electronic sign, we are on a minor road in the middle of a residential neighborhood, the sign would be distracting, block line of sight, and they just don't like electronic signs. There was no consideration given to the multiple communities our campus serves (Church, School, Charitable Works), our willingness to work with the Commission, or the unsightliness of utilizing banners and signs to share parish information and events.

The entire hearing is on YouTube https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=Jvp2wc0gS-A&t=2185s from minute 17 to 57. We will be appealing their decision. Our sign serves to inform the community and is necessary for the benefit, growth and development of our school, church, and ministries.

Final note: The Columbus Diocese is encouraging us to vote "Yes" on issue 1 on Tuesday, August 8.








CHARITABLE WORKS MINISTRY NEWS

Recap of June 2023 – Another VERY busy month for CWM. We equaled our May record of 362 families served with an identical number of families served in June. The St. Matthew Charitable Works Ministry provided an estimated 16,425 meals to 1,095 individuals in 362 households within the greater Gahanna community during the month of June. We continue to see increasing demand from large families. Our food costs continue to be high as we get less free/low cost food from Mid-Ohio Food Bank, and we purchase more at retail. The below graphs provide a view of the trends and increases dating back to January 2022. Thank you for your continued support to those families who are experiencing difficult times through your financial support and volunteer efforts.

PRO-LIFE CORNER



There has been a lot of back and forth in the press and social media between pro-life and pro-abortion advocates, as to what is actually in the "Reproductive Freedom" November 8 amendment.

Most of the controversy centers around the right to have transgender changes and nullification of parental rights for minors. The pro-abortion lobby contends that these are not specifically stated in the amendment the pro-life side says they are implied. It is interesting to note that in the proposed 2024 Florida abortion amendment the wording now specifically states the right to abortion does not negate parental rights for minors, so that the Florida pro-abortion lobby does not get caught up in arguing parental rights.

Setting aside these debates, what the Ohio amendment does clearly state is that abortion is a right, and that the state cannot restrict it until after viability. Viability is decided on a case-by-case basis by the physician (an abortionist) and the baby must have a significant likelihood of survival. Most medical journals put "reasonable" viability at 24 to 26 weeks when the baby has a better than 50% chance of survival. Just taking this amendment for what it explicitly states would in essence legalize abortion. The Pew Research Center has found that 98% of all abortions are committed within 20 weeks of pregnancy. What is specifically stated in this amendment ignores the science of life beginning at conception and the moral teaching of our Catholic faith that killing the innocent is immoral. This is why this amendment is extreme.

Why is the abortion lobby opposed to Issue 1, the amendment to increase the threshold from 50% to 60% to pass an amendment? That, too, is simple. In 2022, there were six abortion-related amendments on a state ballot. Two of those states, Vermont and California passed their amendments with 70% – which was not a surprise given their pro-abortion culture. However, Michigan passed their abortion amendment at 56%, and three other conservative states (KS, KY, MT) declined pro-life amendments at less than 60%. The pro-abortion lobby fears that if Issue 1 passes, they will be in trouble getting the Reproductive Freedom amendment passed at 60%. They view that Ohio has similar conservative value as the four states where they succeeded at less than 60%. This is why Bishop Fernandes has encouraged us to vote YES in August and NO in November.


