PRO-LIFE CORNER



The Catholic Catechism states that "By creating the human being as man and woman, God gives personal dignity equally to the one and the other. Each

of them, man, and woman, should acknowledge and accept their sexual identity." Altering this identity through medical treatments is morally wrong, and considering this, the USCCB has issued a ruling that Catholic hospitals cannot perform gender transformations. The Church acknowledges that some people experience feelings that their personal characteristics do not match their biological gender, but this should be treated by appropriate counseling and therapy, not physically. Attempting to change your gender is embracing a falsehood.

But the November "Reproductive Freedom" amendment subtlety implies that gender transformation is a right of all individuals, adults, and minors. It does this in two ways. When it lists the five specific reproductive rights, it begins this list with the phrase "includes, but is not limited to." If they just wanted to enshrine abortion in our constitution, this phrase is unnecessary. But this phrase opens the door for other reproductive treatments such as gender transformation and sterilization. The ACLU and Planned Parenthood have a long history of litigating the rights of minors to access gender change treatments. Planned Parenthood, in fact, forecasts hormone blockers as their next big money maker.

Secondly, the amendment never mentions the word "woman" in relation to abortion but refers to the woman as a "pregnant person." This is to account for the possibility that transgender men can become pregnant, and they don't want the biological term of woman to stand in the way. Supporters of the November amendment assert that transgenderism isn't even mentioned in the text. It isn't, but the implication is clearly there, they were just smart enough not to state it explicitly knowing for Ohioans this would be a red flag. Especially with the passage in the House of HB 68 which prohibits doctors from providing "gender affirming care" to minors. This bill was in its earlier stages while the amendment was being drafted.

PARISH PROJECTS

Given the generosity of our parishioners, the Facilities Team is pleased to provide updates on St. Matthew campus projects, repairs, improvements, and ongoing initiatives to provide a safe, healthy, and prayerful environment for you and our children

Please drive carefully, as of Monday, all staff and students are back in session for the 2023/2024 school year. We have accomplished much in the last eleven weeks, with still more to do.

Last week, we were tasked with planned as well as unplanned major undertakings. A small water leak in the church undercroft resulted in closing the church Tuesday to replace a four-inch water main connection and valve. As the Facilities Team attempted to remove trees and abandoned conduits next to the school, a fiber optics cable was cut resulting in the Church Office closing for a day until repairs could be made. The PAC experienced a major drain clog. As we brought back the students during a staggered start last week, we removed several large portions of deteriorating and dangerous sidewalks from the playground to the Kindergarten classrooms, including two entrances. New concrete was poured on Friday to allow curing over the weekend. Although inconvenient, the above work was completed prior to everyone's return.

With campus (school and church) safety remaining our priority, the fire department conducted an exhaustive inspection and assessment of our school last week. The placement of three-foot spheres and cement planters in front of main entrances is part of a larger security initiative including new entry door hardware, ballistic glass film installation, and enhanced lockdown procedures during school Masses. All these security measures are thanks to a Corporate Safety Grant we received last year.

We know the Sanctuary repairs and remodeling have caused major inconveniences, particularly during days of obligation. Your continued patience is greatly appreciated as we push toward completion. Thank you.








CHARITABLE WORKS MINISTRY NEWS

RECAP OF JULY 2023 – Another busy month for CWM. Although we did not set a new record for July, we still served 346 families. The St. Matthew Charitable Works Ministry provided an estimated **15,585** meals to **1,039** individuals in **346** households within the greater Gahanna community during the month of July. We continue to see increasing demand from large families. Our food costs continue to be high as we get less free/low cost food from Mid-Ohio Food Bank, and we purchase more at retail. The graphs below provide a view of the trends and increases dating back to January 2022. Thank you for your continued support to those families who are experiencing difficult times through your financial support and volunteer efforts.







I want to make a special call out to all of the volunteers who help us at CWM. As we have continued to serve more families, we also get more volunteers to help, both in the daytime hours and in the evening hours. Thanks to all of you who help out at the Pantry!

WHERE DOES IT SAY THAT?



THIS CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT...

THREATENS PARENTAL RIGHTS

By using "individual" instead of adult or woman, anyone under the age of 18 could have an abortion or make any other reproductive decision without their parents' consent or notification.

PUTS WOMEN AT RISK

Current Ohio laws* require abortion providers to explain procedure risks and ensure access to hospital transfer if needed. These health and safety standards could be seen as a "burden" and be eliminated, making it even less safe for women seeking an abortion.

ALLOWS ABORTIONS THROUGH 9 MONTHS OF PREGNANCY

In U.S. law,** "health" includes age or physical, emotional, or psychological well-being. This means a woman's age or emotional health could be cited to justify aborting a full-term baby. An abortion-providing physician would decide when a baby could survive outside the womb, leaving no clear protections for preborn children.

IS MISLEADING

Referring to "miscarriage care" promotes a myth that a "right to abortion" is necessary to preserve care for miscarriages and ectopic pregnancies. This is false. Catholic hospitals have always provided comprehensive miscarriage care and will continue to do so regardless of the outcome of this vote.


ARTICLE I, SECTION 22

The Right to Reproductive Freedom with Protections for Health and Safety

- 1. Every individual has a right to make and carry out one's own reproductive decisions, including but not limited to decisions on contraception, fertility treatment, continuing one's own pregnancy, miscarriage care, and abortion.
- 2. The State shall not, directly or indirectly, burden, penalize, prohibit, interfere with, or discriminate against either an individual's voluntary exercise of this right or a person or entity that assists an individual exercising this right, unless the State demonstrates that it is using the least restrictive means to advance the individual's health in accordance with widely accepted and evidence-based standards of care.
- 3. However, abortion may be prohibited after fetal viability. But in no case may such an abortion be prohibited if in the professional judgment of the pregnant patient's treating physician it is necessary to protect the pregnant patient's life or health.
- 4. As used in this Section, "Fetal viability" means "the point in a pregnancy when, in the professional judgment of the pregnant patient's treating physician, the fetus has a significant likelihood of survival outside the uterus with reasonable measures. This is determined on a case-by-case basis"; and "State" includes any governmental entity and political subdivision.
- 5. This Section is self-executing.


