PRO-LIFE CORNER

The abortion amendment was decisively passed November 7 with 57% voting Yes and 43% voting No, and about half of Ohio's 8 million registered voters participated. Polls have consistently shown that many Ohioans believe that abortion is acceptable in the first trimester and that exceptions should be made for rape/ incest at any stage. Based on this, the abortion lobby organized a well-funded TV and social media campaign to highlight the Heartbeat Bill. Though currently under injunction, this bill bans abortion after 6 weeks, and has no exceptions. In addition, the ads emphasized that there is no mention of parental rights in the amendment and that the state can restrict abortion after viability. Both of which are not true, but people were persuaded that voting Yes would maintain the current status quo. Many young people voted Yes thinking they were preserving a "right" that they may need to exercise (or already have), and those over 45 voted Yes thinking "let the woman decide what to do, not the government."

What does this tell us? That we still have a lot of work to do to change the hearts and minds of people to accept the grace of God's revealed truth that life begins at conception. To believe that first trimester abortion is acceptable completely undermines this principle, when over 85% of all abortions are committed in the first trimester. While the passage of Issue 1 is a tactical setback, we need to continue our perseverance in prayer and service to witness to another belief: that God's truth will ultimately prevail. God may not answer our prayers in exactly the way we expect, but God will answer our prayers and only asks that we persevere in proclaiming the Gospel of Life.

When the same amendment passed in Michigan last year, their pro-life movement did not give up. They renewed their efforts to witness to life at abortion clinics, support pregnancy care centers, and publicly oppose abortion legislation. Let us follow their example and continue our efforts to establish a culture of life. We do not want to abandon our goal of changing one heart at a time in our daily interactions with people.

Beside the "peace pole" and two benches, you will find carved in stone the names of two sons of the parish who died in 2005 in the War Against Terrorism: Army Private First Class Nick Messmer, son of Richard and Shirley Messmer; and Marine Lance Corporal Ryan E. Miller, son of Ed and Mary Miller. Also, our memorials include Army Private First Class Harrison James Meyer, nephew of our Deacon Joe Meyer (Maureen) who died in 2003 and Army Specialist Donald "DJ" Wheeler, brother of St. Matthew Cub Scout mom Mrs. Bernadette McNeil (Paul) who also died in 2003. Our Marine and three Soldiers were killed in Irag. We also remembered Gahanna Police Officer Charles C. DuVernay who was struck by a vehicle while directing traffic out of the St. Matthew parking lot and died in 1982. His memorial stone is on the west side of our current exit drive to Havens Corners Road. We remember their sacrifice. We are in a time of war and rumors of war. Pray for peace. (Charles "Trey" Porter, Scoutmaster, Boy Scout Troop 317, St. Matthew Parish).

Given the generosity of our parishioners, the Facilities Team is pleased to provide updates on St. Matthew campus projects, repairs, improvements, and ongoing initiatives to provide a safe, healthy, and prayerful environment for you and our children.

As our church returns to full utilization including school Masses, weddings, and funerals, we also hosted several presentations in the Sanctuary worth checking out. Last Saturday evening, William Heyer, the architect for the Sanctuary project made a presentation on many of the design features of the space. He also explained construction considerations to increase wall insulation, the elimination of stud ghosting (dark stripes on the walls), and how the Stations of the Cross were secured to the walls ranging in weight from 200 to 300 pounds each. 




CHARITABLE WORKS MINISTRY NEWS


