PRO-LIFE CORNER

At the USCCB plenary meeting this month, the US Bishops reaffirmed that the threat of abortion is the preeminent issue in their guidance for Catholic voters in 2024. This guidance is presented in the document "Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship." The purpose of this document is to summarize the principles of Catholic social teaching that should be considered when voting. It does not tell Catholics how to vote, or advocate for a particular candidate or political party, but establishes a framework for voting with a conscience formed by Church teaching. While abortion is considered the preeminent issue that violates "the infinite worth and dignity of every human life" it is not the only concern. The bishops stated that human trafficking, euthanasia, physician assisted suicide, gun violence, and the death penalty are also serious violations of the dignity of life.

The bishops noted that "the threat of abortion remains our preeminent priority because it directly attacks life itself, it takes place within the sanctuary of the family, and because of the number of lives destroyed." The current state of abortion in the US reflects the Bishops' concern. In the one year after the overturning of Roe vs. Wade, the number of abortions has increased from the previous annual rate of 930,000 to over one million. A large part of this increase has been driven by the FDA allowing chemical abortions via telehealth sessions and the dispensing of abortion pills through the mail or at local pharmacies. For the 2024 election, there are nine states where abortion will potentially be on the ballot as an amendment to their constitution to guarantee access. Four of these states already allow abortion and want to codify access in their constitution: Colorado, Maryland, Nevada, and New York. The other five states currently restrict or ban abortion: Arizona, Florida, Missouri, Nebraska, and South Dakota.

The bishops' conclusion is that we need to make our position on abortion clear, pray for the conversion of those committing abortion, walk with moms in need both before and after birth, and remind those who have participated in an abortion of God's desire to extend His mercy and forgiveness. They have not committed an unpardonable sin and God lovingly awaits their repentance.






CHARITABLE WORKS MINISTRY NEWS

SUNDAY MASS READINGS EXPLAINED – NOW AVAILABLE BOTH MORNING & EVENING – Looking for a place to understand the Sunday readings based on the Church's teachings and the mindset of a first century Jew hearing the Word preached for the first time? 
