PRO-LIFE CORNER

One of the groups that are on the frontline of changing hearts to a culture of life are pregnancy resource centers (PRC). They not only help women with an unplanned pregnancy understand the options available besides abortion, but they also support the woman before and after birth with practical resources such as ultrasounds, counseling, diapers and parenting classes. Many people are unsure of how to help someone connect with a PRC. To simplify this, a website has been set up to streamline this process. The website is Option Line at https://www.optionline.org, which provides a search function, online instant messaging, information on options, and a 7x24 hotline: 800-712-HELP (4357). There are 20 PRC locations within a 50-mile radius of Columbus, all of which are qualified to assist a woman through a difficult pregnancy.

One of the charges frequently leveled by the pro-abortion industry is that PRCs are "fake clinics." This is, in fact, not true. There are over 2,700 PRCs (which outnumber abortion clinics by 3:1), of which 2,000 are medically certified. The other 700 are not medically certified because they do not provide medical services. There are no "fake" clinics. The vast majority follow a code of ethics known as Commitment of Care and Compassion. There have been several lawsuits and investigations into PRC's giving false information and not one instance has been validated. Contrary to pro-abortion industry claims that PRCs get government funding, 90% of their funding is from private donations.

PRCs are providing vital services for women in a crisis pregnancy and need our active support. As Patricia Heaton (one of the few Pro-Life advocates from Hollywood) replied to a disparaging Tweet stating that PRCs are notorious for misrepresenting a woman's options, she noted that "no one ever died from visiting a pregnancy clinic." Given the generosity of our parishioners, the Facilities Team is pleased to provide updates on St. Matthew campus projects, repairs, improvements, and ongoing initiatives to provide a safe, healthy, and prayerful environment for you and your children.

Last week we continued to fine-tune the sanctuary sound as work started on consolidating all the lights on our wireless system. At this time last year, we were replacing our main lights with LED fixtures. The plan was to convert and connect all existing ceiling track lights to the same wireless system, allowing programming of preset scenes with a single button. Before final connections could be made, the Sanctuary repairs took priority. With the Sanctuary completed and Christmas less than a month away, it was time to finish the lighting.

A total of \$8,000 will be utilized for a faith development program and support of our ongoing church security initiatives. At our request, the proposed electronic monument sign, Appeal Hearing, has been continued until January 18. We should have less going on, providing additional time to prepare and present our case in front of newly appointed members of the Zoning Appeal Board.




CHARITABLE WORKS MINISTRY NEWS

Know Your Gestures and Postures during Mass - a Quiz

As St. Paul writes, "As a body is one though it has many parts, and all the parts of the body, though many, are one body, so also Christ. For in one Spirit we were all baptized into one body" ¹ When it comes to our prayer lives and relationship with each other and within the Church, though, do we know when we should pray as the many parts and when we are to pray as one body? We are blessed as the People of God with many charisms, devotions, and private prayer opportunities to grow in relationship with God our Creator. However, when it comes to the Mass, we are not individuals but Christ's bride, the Church, praying universally (literally) as one body.

The Mass is the prayer par excellence instituted by Christ at the Last Supper. It is Christ's sacrifice offered to God the Father, even as we gather together to celebrate a meal. Given this context, do we as the Lay Faithful know what to do in our unity of worship during the Mass? How do we know? From our parents? As students in Catholic school? From those around us in the pews? Hopefully, our answer is 'yes' to some or all of these instances, but it is first and foremost from the Church Herself, who gives us the best way to express our oneness in the Mass. Let us, therefore, consider what we know from our social interactions and from the Church Herself.

Ponder the situations below and your experience with them. (Individual answers will not be tallied nor collected.) Note: <u>Posture</u> = a position with our whole body; <u>Gesture</u> = a temporary position or movement of some part of our body.

- 1. During the proclamation of the Holy Gospel, what is the posture of the Lay Faithful, i.e. the congregation?
 - a. Sit
- b. Stand
- c. Kneel
- 2. In those Masses when incense is used, the priest celebrant incenses the altar and gifts at the Offertory, then the assisting minister incenses the priest before coming forward to incense the congregation. What is the congregation's posture and gesture in response to incensing from the assisting minister?
 - a. Standing, then bow from head or waist
 - b. Standing, then make the sign of the cross
 - c. Both a. and b.
 - d. Standing, but do nothing (just remain standing)

- 3. During the Lord's Prayer, what should the gestures of the congregation be?
 - a. Hold hands with others
 - b. Imitate the priest celebrant with the Orans hand position (arms extended with palms turned upward and open)
 - c. Put hands together in prayer, palm-to-palm, in imitation of the deacon (when he is present at the altar)
- 4. When offering each other the Sign of the Peace, what gestures can the Faithful use?
 - a. Shake hands with immediate pew neighbors
 - b. Nod head and/or wave hand toward individuals while making eye contact
 - c. Blow kisses to immediate pew neighbors
 - d. Any of the above
- 5. When receiving Holy Communion, what is the posture of each communicant, in terms of our unity of worship?
 - a. Standing, with reverent bow from waist before receiving Jesus
 - b. Standing, but genuflecting on one knee before receiving Jesus
 - c. Kneeling while receiving Jesus

Under the leadership of our bishops, we are now in a multi-year season of Eucharistic Revival in the United States. As the new liturgical year begins this Advent, bringing in the calendar year 2024, we focus on the Year of Parish Revival as we receive, review, and reboot our hearts to grow in love with the Lord Jesus in His Real Presence in the Eucharist. And so, we begin with what we Catholics do at Mass, with more catechesis to come throughout the year. The answers to each scenario above that fully express our unity in worship will be provided in the coming weeks.


