# FROM FR. JOHN KIM

The baptism of Jesus reminds us of our own baptism. There are many offices that people can hold in the Church. But nothing can compare to the basic gift to all: **baptism**. When we stand before the throne of God, these other offices will be of no importance. Our dignity will depend on one thing only - the extent to which we have lived out our baptismal calling.

The ceremony of baptism is a beautiful one. In the *Rite of Baptism* we were formally given a name and welcomed into the family of God's people. Lovely prayers were said over us. Our body was signed with the sign of the cross, the mark of Christ's love for us. Water was poured over us. Water is a symbol of cleansing, and in baptism we are cleansed of original sin. But it is more especially a symbol of life. In baptism we are given a share in the undying life of God.

Not once but twice our bodies were anointed with holy oil. Just as the bodies of athletes were smeared with oil to give them strength to compete, so we were anointed with holy oil to give us strength for the inevitable struggle against evil. And just as kings, prophets and priests were anointed with oil and thus marked out as God's ministers to the community, so we are anointed with the Oil of Chrism that we may be envoys of Christ in the world.

Our body was covered with a white garment, the outward sign of our Christian dignity. We were given a candle lighted from the Easter candle to signify the precious light of faith. God called us out of darkness into the wonderful light of his Son.

Most of all, what happened at the baptism of Jesus happened at our baptism too. God called us by name. He said to each of us, 'You are my beloved son,' or 'You are my beloved daughter.' And the Spirit descended on us, in order to help us to live the life of a Christian and to participate in the mission of Jesus.

Today, on the feast of the Baptism of the Lord, let's remember our baptismal calling: You are a baptized Catholic. You are the beloved son of God, the beloved daughter of God. In you the Father is well pleased. When we listen to His voice, we enter more and more into a relationship that changes our lives because it changes our hearts; it brings us to see the face of God, made visible for us in Jesus.
