I would like to remind all of you to come to a parent and child meeting Friday, September 27 at 6:30pm in the Gathering Hall to introduce you to this year's **Virtus Safe Environment Program** that we will be using. As you may know Bishop Cantú, in accord with the United States Bishops Charter and Essential Norms for the Protections of Children and Youth, has mandated that all parishes teach the Virtus Safe Environment lessons to all children

and you who are in any religious faith formation process.

For purposes of this program, "safe environment" refers to teach children how to keep themselves and others safe and free from harm at all times. The Virtus program focuses on the three major aspects: How and when to say NO! When and how to GO! Who and when to TELL!

Virtus is a program organized for specific age groups and offers age appropriate language and activities. All Children and youth who participate in the program will receive information on appropriate touching, boundaries, private body parts, secrets, rules, safe and unsafe adults and friends, peer pressure, risky situations, personal space, and other safety related topics.

At the meeting you will be given the opportunity to review and receive an explanation of the topics that will be covered on Friday, September 27th This gathering is for parents, guardians, and children in Kinder-6th grade. STEWARDSHIP OF TREASURE REPORT - AUGUST 2019



Thank you to everyone who supported the mission and ministries of our parish during the month of August. Our average weekly collection was \$20,703. You also generously donated to various important causes in

our August (2nd Collections) in the amount of \$28,284 (\$7,581 a week.) This brings our August total to \$28,284 a week. We budgeted our Sunday Offertory income for the first month of the new fiscal year (8 weeks) at \$160,000 and received \$164,000. Any additional income helps us to pay-down our \$2.3 million debt. As you know, we are totally dependent upon you all our parishioners for our livelihood. We are so grateful for the sacrifices you make so that the work of St. Francis of Assisi Parish may continue to impact the lives of so many.

is Most Holy Trinity pulled out of this collaboration because they were not able to obtain a replacement for their coordinator, John Estrada. Without their collaboration we were not able to do it all by ourselves because of significant facility schedule conflicts. We also explored joining the Rotating Church Shelter "Village House" but the only period that they had to offer us was over Christmas and New Year's. It proved impossible for us to confirm the necessary makeup of recruited volunteers for all the positions needed to make that happen. So, I'll be contacting some of the other shelters in the area to see how we can help them out with donations. I'll be in touch about that.

Thanks again for all you did to make SFOA's Winter Shelter Program a success and a meaningful experience for our guests during the past 4 years.
