

FROM THE DESK OF MALENY QUIROZ-HERNANDEZ

After finishing the Marian consecration, and Our Lady of Guadalupe Mass and celebration, I've been reflecting on this: we don't need Mary. In fact, we don't need the saints or the angels either. After all, God is enough. God is so generous! We don't need a

spiritual mother, Jesus didn't need a mother, God could've poofed into Earth out of thin air, but He chose to have a mother, and not only that, He chose to give her to us. He chose to give us a family. He not only chose to place us into the earthly family that He gave us, but He also wants to make our cup overflow with the beautiful community of saints that keep inspiring us to grow closer in our relationship with Him.

Our families aren't perfect. Jesus's lineage wasn't perfect. The people who came before Jesus struggled with some horrible sins. But something that really inspired me during advent while going through the "Blessed is She Advent Journal All the Generations from Genesis to You," was how God can take all of the wounds in our families and transform them into something beautiful, or as Father John Parks put it:

"If you open your Bible to the beginning of Matthew's Gospel and begin to read the Genealogy of Jesus, you may feel...well, boredom. That is, unless you are familiar with the characters that are mentioned: murderers, liars, adulterers, a prostitute, and a lot of other broken people. Not the ideal family that you would imagine being the ancestors of Jesus, King of Kings and Savior of the World, the Son of God, God Himself. Even more than that, Jesus could have chosen to be a member of any family, and yet, He chose to be a member of this one! Why?

When you read the Old Testament, you realize that God loves to make use of failure. God loves to take the shattered pieces of our lives and make something beautiful from them. Every time it looked as if God's ancestors had gone too far off course, He would simply "recalculate" and draw them to His purposes and plan despite their constant veering from His. Jesus chose the broken family of Salvation History—the characters we encounter through the Scripture readings—to heal and redeem it."

Allow God to help you be receptive to the graces that he wants to shower you with through the earthly and spiritual family he has gifted you, and ask him to enter into your wounds and those of your family to transform them into something that will help you blossom.



First Sunday of the Month – Second Collection – Mortgage Debt Reduction



Next Sunday, there will be a second collection to reduce our \$2.3 million-dollar parish debt. At the conclusion of the prior fiscal year, due to the generous donors to the Shine the Light campaign, we made a

\$200,000 principal payment. We also made monthly principal & interest payments of \$225,000 (\$93,000 of those dollars were from the first of the month mortgage debt reduction collection) An additional payment of \$49,000 was made from our 2018 ADA re-


