As we stand at the threshold of Holy Week, Jesus, our humble and merciful King, goes before us. His way is our way to eternal life; his passion is a remedy for sin. He lay down his life for us that we might share in the glory of the divine life.

Matthew's passion story stretches from the plot of Judas to the stone placed before Jesus' tomb, offering a wealth of details in its portrait of Jesus during this crucial sacrificial act. In spite of his human fears, Jesus, the Suffering Servant, is unyielding in his obedience to the Father.

No other Sunday in the liturgical year reflects such dramatic contrast as Palm Sunday. What begins with songs of triumph quickly shifts into the remembrance of the Lord's passion. The celebration of the Paschal Triduum of Christ's Paschal Mystery is the culmination of the liturgical year. We invite you to undertake a journey of preparation with the knowledge that our being conformed to Christ is a priceless gift of God's mercy. #### The Peace Prayer of St. Francis





spiritual and cultural connection to salvation history. Your generosity can help keep alive those Holy Places and the Franciscan Missioners who serve the people there.


#### The Law of Fast & Abstinence

should not equal a full meal. Fasting is required for all those between the ages of 18 and 59. If health or ability to work is affected, the law of fasting does not apply.

# Catholic Charities of Santa Clara County

Dear St Francis of Assisi Parishioners,

Thank you for your constant support of Catholic Charities Cathedral Social Ministries. Since July 1, 2022 you have provided \$2,000.00 in funding to support two health fairs. Our health fairs take up the whole cul-d-sac; of where, we are located at John XXIII Multi Services Center. This past health fair sponsored by Senator Dave Cortese and Supervisor Cindy Chavez we were able to host over 30 providers ranging from housing, street outreach workers, healthcare, mental health, recovery, social security, public health, haircuts and hot meals supported by you. Our health resource fairs average from 200 to 300 homeless attendees.

You have provided gift cards to help our unhoused and reentry populations gain access to resources they ordinarily wouldn't apply for without a little incentive. Once a month you provide 400 sandwiches and cookies at The Window, including shaving razors. We serve 120-150 people a day Monday - Friday, 7:30AM to 5:00PM. At The Window, (our drop-in office) we provide a secure place to receive mail while homeless, service navigation, sandwiches and connection with our free primary healthcare clinic staffed by Gardner Health Services. We also provide reentry services to those released from our county jails and state prison.

Because of you we are able to provide an unbroken tradition of serving those in need. You are always there for us... for the people of God.

#### Supporting Our Mission Together SEVENTH WEEK FOLLOW-UP - 2023 Annual Diocesan Appeal

Our Parish Goal is \$240,000. Our Parish Participation Goal is 1,000 families.

We are thankful for the 407 pledges for \$212,000 (average gift \$523) turned in thus far. We have reached 88% percent of our parish goal.

119 pledges made were equal to their 2022 pledge. 161 families *increased* their 2022 pledge, while 44 pledges were less than 2022. 83 people pledged in 2023 who were unable to pledge in 2022. 210 families pledged \$100,000 in 2022 and have yet to make a pledge or gift in 2023. With everyone's participation, we can meet and surpass our ADA goal; however, this will only be possible if every parish household participates according to their means. Anything raised above our ADA goal will directly benefit our parish.


